

Sensory Inspiration Minus taste

Sight

Prepare a range of different coloured tokens (paint sample cards work well)

Provide each child with a different coloured token and challenge them to find a match in nature.

Evaluate which colours were the easiest / hardest to match and why.

Touch

Provide small groups of children with an egg box and challenge them to find six materials that all feel different to place in each compartment.

Invite groups to share their adjectives for the feelings.

Challenge them to organise their materials whilst blindfolded.

Hearing

Sit quietly outside with one hand open.

Each time they hear a sound they can close one finger over their palm, hence capturing the sound there.

Invite children to release a sound by lifting a finger and describing what they heard.

Smell

Provide small groups of children with a pot of water and a stick and challenge them to create a perfume.

They can give their perfume a name and create and advert to describe it's unique fragrance.
