



## Considering an Ultrasound for Your Pet?

*Your veterinarian has recommended an ultrasound to help diagnose or monitor your pet's health.*

*Here's what you need to know:*

### **What is an Ultrasound?**

Ultrasound is a safe, non-invasive imaging technique that uses sound waves to create real-time pictures of your pet's internal organs.

It helps your vet evaluate organs like the liver, kidneys, spleen, bladder, heart, and more—without surgery or radiation.

### **What to Expect**

Your pet's ultrasound will be performed at your regular veterinary clinic by a licensed veterinary technician from Franimal's Solutions.

A small area will be shaved for the scan, and gentle, low-stress handling techniques will be used to keep your pet comfortable.

Most pets receive calming medication or mild sedation to help them relax and ensure clear images.

The scan itself is quick, usually 30–45 minutes, but your pet may stay at the clinic longer depending on their needs and the clinic's schedule.

### **After the Ultrasound**

The technician captures detailed images and video clips, which are sent to a board-certified veterinary specialist for review and interpretation.

Your veterinarian will receive a detailed report with findings and recommendations—typically within 1–3 business days.

All communication, scheduling, and follow-up will be handled by your veterinary clinic. If you have questions, please contact your veterinarian directly.
