

## Covered Bridge Festival comes to downtown Jefferson on Oct. 8-9

JEFFERSON - The Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival will return to downtown Jefferson and throughout Ashtabula County on Oct. 8-9.

Activities will be held on East Jefferson Street for the two-day, free-admission festival on Oct. 8-9. Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. The festival includes official souvenirs, crafts, entertainment, demonstrations, contests, a parade and great food.

New activities this year include a Lego covered bridge contest, troll costume contest, baked goods contest and chili tasting contest.

"Our traditional Miniature Covered Bridge Building contest has a new twist - all entries must be made of Legos," said Covered Bridge Festival Committee President Michele

Part of the festival will be held in Giddings Park.

The festival's first Chili Cookoff will be held the Saturday of festival. Additionally, bakers are asked to bring their best baked goods to the festival on Saturday morning for the Baked Goods

New merchandise will be for the 2021 Ashtabula sale, including a new Christmas County Covered ornament and festival t-shirt Bridge Festival at featuring Creek Road Covered

Additionally, the covered

bridge throw has been newly designed and now features all 19 bridges, including Liberty Covered Bridge and Riverview

Both days are packed with musical entertainment, including Saturday's headliner, Jess Kellie Adams.

"She brings her band from Nashville, where she has been recording for years," Victor said.

At Giddings Park will be the food vendors, Ashtabula County Bi-Centennial Bell, the Mini Bridge, antique cars, antique engines, apple-butter making demonstrations, souvenirs and the Entertainment County Covered Bridge Stage. Inside Giddings Hall will Festival at Giddings Park in be crafters.

Across the street, the Jeffer-

son United Methodist Church will be the location for the pancake breakfast from 9 a.m. to noon both days.

People craving their annual bean soup by the Jefferson Rotary Club may find it at the Jefferson Fire Department.

The Henderson Memorial Public Library plans to have kids' activities.

The Jefferson Depot will be open for people to tour the 1890 village from 1-4 p.m. both days.

Visitors coming for the two-day festival should be sure to stop at downtown Jefferson for some of these events in between touring the bridges in the county.

## Covered Bridge Festival Parade to kick off the event Oct. 8

JEFFERSON – The Covered Bridge Festival will kick off with a parade on Saturday, Oct. 8, giving the community a fun and family-friendly event to mark the occasion.

Ginger Whitehead, executive director of the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival, said the lineup of this year's parade is still in the works, but in years past the parade has typically drawn a number of 4-H clubs, Scout troops, local businesses, baton-twirling groups, veterans' organizations and more.

Last year saw the return of the festival parade after a COVID-19 hiatus in 2020 and was fairly brief – and this year is looking about the same as far as participation goes, according to Whitehead.

The parade usually draws quite a crowd of onlookers along the route, though Whitehead joked she's never seen it.

"I'm down at the park, so I don't get to see the route, but

they line up to see it," she said.

The parade will run a bit earlier this year than last, according to Whitehead, with the parade lineup meeting at Jefferson High School at 9:30 a.m., kicking off at 10:30 a.m. and ending at Giddings Park at 10:45 a.m.

The parade route will run from the high school down Mulberry Street, turn east onto West Jefferson Street and then ending at Giddings Park, where the Troll Contest judging will take place at the Covered Bridge Pavilion.

Erie Heights Brass Ensemble will be kicking off the musical entertainment at the parade's end and the Chainsaw Chix will also be putting on a demonstration as well.

Anyone with small children who enjoys supporting your community, won't want to miss this year's Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival parade.

Caine Rd. Bridge is hosted by the Krieger family. They will have the Peterson's family doing kids' activities. There will be a bounce house. Girl Scout Troop 80014 will be doing a lemonade stand/bake sale. Donation only. The Baptist church is sending their diaper ministry. The Kreiger family will be doing hot dogs and chips by donation to raise money for cystic fibrosis. There will be a 50/50 raffle and raffle baskets.

**Creek Rd. Bridge** is the featured bridge this year. It will be on our shirts and is the new Christmas ornament. Creek Rd. Bridge will be hosted by Conneaut Rotary Club. 

## Newly-designed Covered Bridge Festival throw includes all 19 covered bridges

JEFFERSON – Just in time for the 2022 Ashtabula Covered Bridge Festival, enthusiasts have a chance to pick up the newly-designed throw that includes the two most recent covered bridges in the county added since the last throw was designed in 2008.

Ginger Whitehead, executive director of the Covered Bridge Festival, said it had been a goal to design and make a new throw since the Riverview bridge was first opened in 2016.

The 50-by-65-inch Afghan includes both the Riverview Covered Bridge and the Liberty Street Bridge.

The 100-percent cotton throw makes for a great accent to a chair or sofa and makes for a nice, warm cover for snuggling.

The new throw is available for sale at a price of \$60 at coveredbridgefestival.org under the "store" tab.



JEFFERSON - A Lego version of everything seems to be built these days, so why not covered bridges?

The Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival is getting in on the Lego craze by adding a Lego Covered Bridge Contest to this year's festival.

The festival had held a Mini Bridge Contest for years, so the Lego contest seemed like something different.

"We're hoping it will give it a different look," Ginger Whitehead, director of the festival, said. "We wanted to shake it up. And Legos is big these days."

A baking contest and chili contest were also added.

Whitehead said contestants can make anything they like in

the baking contest.

"We didn't really narrow it down for the first year," she said. According to the festival website, people can drop off entries for the baked goods contest at the tent marked "Contests" by the back wall of the school building in Giddings Park from 9 am. to 10:45 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 8.

The website notes that entries for the chili contest can be brought to that location from 10 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. on Saturday.

For the Lego contest, contestants can drop off their Lego Bridges for judging at the tent marked "Mini Bridge Contest" at that location from 3 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 7, according to the website. The judging takes place at 6:46 p.m.

Whitehead hopes the contests will be a hit.

"I think people usually like to enter things like that," she said. She said the contests will offer winners ribbons.

#### New chainsaw carver lined up for Covered Bridge Festival

JEFFERSON - A move opened up a new path in life for Ava Blaine.

"She moved from Osaka (Japan) to a more of a mountain environment in Japan and had small trees on that property, so she bought a chain saw," Jen Watson, founder of the Chainsaw Chix, said of the 47-year-old, who currently lives in New York. She came to America from Japan 14 years ago.

Now, Blaine, a chainsaw artist with the Chainsaw Chix, is bringing her talent to the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival.

Watson said Blaine, who was born and grew up in Osaka, has been carving probably close 15 to 16 years.

A niche she "carved out for herself" is gallery-quality human faces and dog portraits, according to Watson.

Watson said Blaine, who is an animal lover and does portraits of every breed, is a skilled artist who can sketch someone in about five minutes.

"She's very talented," Watson said.

At the Covered Bridge Festival, Blaine will be doing a variety of quick-carve pieces, such as owls and cats.

#### Her personality is a winning one.

Watson said she's high-energy and very positive.

"She's very fun to be around," she said. "I think they'll love her. In Osaka, they're known for stand-up comedians. Everyone is always in a good mood and super fun. She brings that here."

Watson said Blaine's culture will come through, as it would with anyone.

"Everybody's culture shines through, I think," she said. "Japanese culture is centered around kindness, so I'll think you'll see that."

The chain saw carver from Chainsaw Chix, Sara Wojtowecz, who usually shows up at the covered bridge festival was unable to make it this year because she has events that overlap and has to stay in New York, according to Watson.

Ginger Whitehead, director of the festival, said she is excited about having Blaine.

"[Wojtowecz] was great, but it's always nice to have someone different," she said.





#### Abe Lincoln will stroll the grounds at the Covered Bridge Festival

JEFFERSON - If you come to the Covered Bridge Festival, you may find yourself shaking hands with Abraham Lincoln. Or at least a gentleman that looks a whole lot like him.

John King of Ashtabula has been portraying President Abraham Lincoln since the 1980s when he first donned a borrowed hat and coat and entertained his third-grade students with a short lesson on the sixteenth president.

"I grew a beard for the first time in 1983 or '84, and a gentleman who would do parades as Lincoln said I looked like Lincoln and ought to do it also," King said.

The gentleman told King he could borrow his hat and coat, and so for Lincoln's birthday that year, that is what he did.

In 2009, King was doing a program at the Country Club retirement center and met a couple there portraying President Garfield and his wife, Lucretia R. Garfield. They invited King to join their group of historical re-enactors called We Made History. His first program with the group was at a "Dinner With the Presidents" in Mentor, OH. The group now has five presidents and three first ladies. King's wife Marian often joins him as Lincoln's wife, Mary Todd Lincoln.

King has spent hours researching Abraham Lincoln's life over the years and continues to do so. To develop the program that he shares, he uses information from a presentation he attended by Jim

Getty, a renowned Lincoln actor and historian from Gettysburg. He has also read numerous books on the subject and is always on the lookout for more books about Lincoln that he hasn't read yet. "I am constantly learning more about Lincoln,


his life, education, political skills, family in Springfield, Il., and the White House, his generals and the Civil War," King said. "I want to share what a brilliant man he was, his love for his family, his country, how he was able to save the Union." He also likes to share little known facts about Lincoln. For example, he is the only president to have a patent for an invention. It is also interesting to know that it was during Lincoln's administration that "In God We Trust" was first put on a two-cent coin.

Over the years, King has attended many events as the sixteenth president. He has appeared at Civil War reenactments, parades, school programs, quilt shows, historical groups, churches, club meetings, lodges and special dinners with the President at

#### Stop by the South Denmark Road Covered Bridge

DENMARK TOWNSHIP – While the road may pass by one of Ashtabula County's most scenic covered bridges, visitors to the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival Oct. 8 and 9 should make a point not to pass this little bridge by.

The South Denmark Road Bridge spans Mill Creek in Denmark Township. The bridge, one of 16 currently drivable bridges in the county, is a single span Town truss design. Bypassed in 1975, the bridge still remains open to light traffic.

The bridge spans Mill Creek a bit over three miles southeast of Jefferson. People living near the bridge used to call it Williams Corners Covered Bridge, after a byname for the unincorporated community there.

There isn't much recorded history of the lattice-type bridge. It was built in 1895. There was speculation it was built from one that originally stood in the same spot.

The bridge spans 76 feet and is 100 feet long, 13 feet, three inches wide and is 11 feet high.

Covered bridge construction became popular in America after the Revolutionary War, with those first constructed being very simple structures. The need for heavier, more substantial structures brought about the construction types now seen in Ashtabula County. Most have endured the test of time, lasting more than 100 years.

In 1975, the county engineer's office undertook an extensive

project, bypassing the bridge, a move that preserves it for future generations to enjoy. It remains open to light traffic.

The South Denmark Road Bridge is on the registry of the Ohio Historical Society. It is unpainted except the entrance portals, which are white. It has a shingled roof. The interior is not painted.

According to Ginger Whitehead, executive director of the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival, the Alleghany Chapter of the Gold Panners' Association will be coming on as host and sponsor for the South Denmark Road Bridge in 2022 and will be teaching visitors to pan for gold, as well as showing and selling gold-panning equipment.

#### East Plymouth Grange to host the Smolen Gulf Covered Bridge, the nation's longest

ASHTABULA AND PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIPS – Visitors to the Smolen-Gulf Bridge during the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival will have a chance to see the nation's longest covered bridge, take in the scenic view from the walkways along the bridge, on the Riverview Bridge running below it and to meet and greet members of the East Plymouth Grange, who will be hosting the bridge again this year.

Denise Hodges, a member of East Plymouth Grange, said visitors will have a chance to purchase hot dogs, chicken patty sandwiches and drinks.

"Weather permitting, we have Will Paedon coming to display arrowheads," she said. "Then on Sunday we'll have Mr. (John) Smolen help the Grange serve since he's one of our members, but he's also the designer of the bridge.

Some vendors will be present as well, including some local Scouts who will be selling deep-fried elephant ears.

"On Sunday, weather permitting, we'll also have some mini horses," Hodges said.

The horses are being brought in by Jan Sharp's Little Pony Express and Pinto Park – only a few miles from the bridge, according to Hodges.

The Smolen-Gulf Bridge was conceived by former Ashtabula County Engineer John Smolen in 1995 and construction was completed in 2008. The new, covered bridge replaced a smaller steel span built in 1949 at the bottom of the gorge, which itself had replaced the Crooked Gulf Covered Bridge, built in 1867.

Construction began mid-summer of 2006 with land clearing and earthen work. From August 2006 to July 2007, 171,000 cubic yards of earth were moved into place to provide the roadway to the new structure. The bridge piers and abutments comprised 3,500 tons of concrete and nearly 250 tons of steel were used for reinforcement. The timber structure used 51,000 cubic feet of lumber or 613,000 board feet. This was enough

to make sure those passing through understand there's a reason to stop and visit the township as they host the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival at the Graham Road covered bridge.

#### Harpersfield Covered Bridge down as part of project

HARPERSFIELD TOWNSHIP - Those attending the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival will have to take one bridge off their list.

As part of a massive rehabilitation project, the Harpersfield Covered Bridge has been disassembled.

"Obviously with renovation work underway with the Harpersfield Covered Bridge, residents and visitors alike will not be able to see the bridge in all its glory during the festival," county Commissioner Casey R. Kozlowski said. "However, we are excited to see that this restoration work is underway and once complete it will be back up and operation for all to visit and enjoy."

Workers have been busy on the project.

According to Charlie Severino, project superintendent with Union Industrial Contractors, most of the disassembly had to be done by hand because of the bridge's historic nature.

"These trusses were built in 1862," he said.

While the bridge will get all new piers and steel I beams as part of the project, the original trusses for the sidewalls will be used again.

"Now, there was a rehab done back in the '90s," Severino said. "Some of the wood is from the '90s, but for the most part,





## Jefferson Depot is open for tours

The Jefferson Depot, Inc., 147 E. Jefferson St., Jefferson, is open for tours.

Built in 1872, the Jefferson Depot contains railroad memorabilia and features the original ladies waiting room and restrooms complete with wall-hung flush tanks.

Outside, there is an 1888 House, Colonial Herb Garden, early General Store, 1872 Lake Shore and Michigan Southern Railroad Station and 1918 Caboose, the 1848 Church in the Wildwood and Church Barn, the 1838 One-room Schoolhouse, Hohn's General Store and early century pharmacy, and the 1885 Sheffield Post Office.

The Depot acquired one of its newest original buildings (a one-room schoolhouse from Austinburg Township) in 2009. Rehabilitation of the building is ongoing.

The museum is open 1-4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday during the festival.

Many people cook their first hot dogs over a fire at the festival.


"It's amazing the number of people who get to come out

## Former bridges in Ashtabula County

Ashtabula County is home to 19 covered bridges, but not all covered bridges have survived the years. Ashtabula County reportedly has had 62 covered bridges historically.

#### Listed below are some of these former bridges.

- Graham Road Bridge You can still visit this bridge, but it's no longer in service. Graham Road Bridge is a covered bridge which formerly spanned the west branch of the Ashtabula River in Pierpont Township, Ashtabula County, Ohio, United States. Built from remnants of a former covered bridge that was damaged in a flood in 1913, the bridge now sits in an Ashtabula County MetroPark along the south side of Graham Road, near its original site, and is a single span Town truss design. Relocated in 1972, it is no longer open to vehicle traffic.
- The South Ridge Road Covered Bridge spanned the Conneaut Creek in Kingsville.
- In Kellogsville, there were four covered bridges over the Ashtabula River within four miles of each other.
- The Pierpont Covered Bridge was north of Pierpont on State Route 7.
- The Callender Road Covered Bridge, lost in the flood of 1913, spanned the Grand River near Rock Creek.
  - The Muller Covered Bridge in Jefferson.

- A two-lane covered bridge was located on State Route 45 in Rock Creek; after a century it was replaced in 1948.
- The Old Route 7 Covered Bridge, over the Conneaut Creek in what is now Conneaut, was built in 1867 and replaced in 1925.
- The Twin Covered Bridges of Farnham spanned the Conneaut Creek in what is now Conneaut.
- The Kelloggsville Covered Bridge spanned the Ashtabula River south of Kelloggsville.
  - The Prim's Sawmill Covered Bridge.
- The Forman Road Covered Bridge in Eagleville (near Austinburg) is now part of Covered Bridge Pizza in North Kingsville and Andover. In 1974, the 123-foot Town lattice structure, which had been built in 1862 was sold for \$5, cut in half, dismantled, and reassembled in the two locations.
- The Fobes Road Covered Bridge or Shaunghum Covered Bridge was a 118-foot Town lattice structure that carried Fobes Road over the Grand River in Ashtabula County, Ohio. Built in 1911, the bridge was unique in that it was built without abutments, but rather sat on wooden pilings. In the 1960s a runaway truck struck the south portal of the bridge, causing severe damage that forced the bridge's permanent closure. In May 1971, the bridge was deliberately burned by Ashtabula County officials. WGCB No. 35-04-21.













- The Furnace Road Covered Bridge spanned Conneaut Creek in Conneaut.
- The Crooked Gulf Covered Bridge was the first one one to span the Ashtabula River.
- $\bullet$  The Wayne Township Covered Bridge was on U.S. Route 322.
- The South Windsor or Old Plank Road Covered Bridge carried South Windsor Road across the Grand River in Windsor Township, Ashtabula County Ohio. Built in 1870, the 90-foot Town lattice structure was destroyed by fire on the night of October 2, 1970. The fire was determined to be an act of arson, during which the perpetrator(s) piled tires within the bridge and set them afire.



# The Mechanicsville Covered Bridge is a piece of Ashtabula County history

AUSTINBURG TOWNSHIP – The covered bridges in Ashtabula County are a big draw for visitors and locals alike, with their folksy, rural charm as well as their history, and the Mechanicsville Covered Bridge has as much history as any other bridge in the county.

The bridge is thought to be the oldest in Ashtabula County, with the current span dating to 1867. It's 156 feet long and was built with the Howe truss design. The arch on the bridge is made of 15 layers of timber and is encased in heavy beams, making up the supports in the design.

The first settlers in the area used Native American game trails to navigate what was then a densely forested region. These trailblazers slashed trees along the path to mark the way for those who followed.

Later wagon trails were cut in with girdled trees marking the way, thus we have road names such as "Girdled Road."

These trails led to the best natural river crossings, usually fords in areas with shallow water and slow currents. One of the best fords over the Grand River was at what came to be known as Mechanicsville, near a well-known area where Native Americans would portage their canoes and goods.

Settlers who came to these fords would rest and, at some point, someone built a shelter in the area. There was an area upstream of where the bridge now stands where the water was deep enough and the current strong enough for a mill around 1800.

Later, a rope-guided was ferry put in to allow for an easier crossing as traffic increased. The mills in the area and the timber they shipped out required a better method of crossing, and the covered bridge was built in 1867.

The bridge was constructed on site and hauled into place. A sawmill was built close by to cut the planks from local timbers that went into the bridge's construction.

The bridge survived the Great Flood of 1913, but the road washed out at both ends of the bridge, making it unusable. Local farmers teamed up to fill in the area and make the bridge usable again. The bridge was raised six additional feet to make it better able to withstand any future flooding.

Over the years, and especially with the introduction of automobiles, the bridge began to take a beating. At some point the bridge was closed to traffic and Mechanicsville Road was rerouted from just west of the bridge to just east and north across a new bridge.

In 1996, piers were installed under the dilapidated bridge to shore it up until funds could be gotten to rehabilitate the bridge.







In 2003 and 2004, a renovation project to bring the Mechanicsville Covered Bridge back to its former glory was launched, funded by a \$400,000 federal Transportation Enhancement Fund grant. This project was part of an overall effort to restore the oldest covered bridges in the county. Mechanicsville was restored along with Wiswell Road Covered Bridge.

Work crews encountered some difficulties when debris

floating in the river struck the scaffolding workers were using, but the renovations were complete by May, 2004. Over 100 spectators turned up from all over the county to see the Mechanicsville Road Covered Bridge rededicated and reopened to traffic.

The Mechanicsville Road Covered Bridge is located at 1153 Mechanicsville Rd. in Austinburg Township.

### Benetka Road bridge offers beauty

SHEFFIELD TOWNSHIP – Few settings in the modern world have an ability to transport a person back in time. Sheffield Township, however, boasts one such place.

Located at 4500 Benetka Road, the Benetka Road covered bridge, built in 1900, has an idyllic setting.

"That's probably part of its charm," Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival Director Ginger Whitehead said. "It's probably the dirt road and the bend in the road at one end. I know some people definitely (think it's idyllic)."

"It's one of the favorite old ones," Whitehead continued. "The setting is a good one and there's a swimming hole there."

The Benetka Road bridge spans the Ashtabula River and is a single-span Town truss design, with laminated arches added during its renovation in 1985.

"It's actually my favorite bridge," Whitehead said. "It's just because of the setting."

Sheffield was first known as East Matherson, named after Samuel Mather, but was renamed by the first justice of the peace, John Greggs. In the mid-19th century, a water powered saw, grist and flour mill was located near the site of the bridge.

Visitors can spend a bit of time enjoying the bridge during a visit to the township.

"It has a parking area, so there's a place to pull off," White-

head said. "They can stay a while and really enjoy the bridge."

Many visitors often talk about brushes with wildlife, adding to the beauty of the bridge, while visiting the bridge, depending on the time of year.

"Most of the ones who come through say they thought it was pretty," Whitehead said. "Quite often, they'll say there was wildlife around."



### 3. Caine Road Covered Bridge

This bridge was built in 1986 in honor of Ashtabula County's 175th anniversary. It was the first Pratt Truss bridge built in Ohio and is one of only five in the state. It has a clearance of 15 feet.



### 4. Graham Road Covered Bridge

The Graham Road bridge was built in 1913 from remnants of a bridge washed downstream in a flood. It is currently by-passed, so travel by vehicle across it is not possible. It sits on property belonging to Ashtabula County Metroparks.









### 13. Doyle Road Covered Bridge






### 14. The Liberty Covered Bridge





who have never done it before," Coy said.

The department will also sell other items as a fundraiser. "We'll have a bake sale and a hoagie sale," Coy said.

Visitors from all over northeast Ohio and even Canada will visit the State Road bridge.

"A lot of people come from Cleveland and Columbus," Coy said. "We even had a couple of them from Canada last year. People travel from all over for the Covered Bridge Festival. It's pretty neat."

The fire department will also have one of its trucks at the site for phot opportunities or tours for children.

"Right now, we're in the process of trying to start a fire district with Sheffield Township," Coy said. "We're just starting out. There will be photo ops in front of the truck. We'll have one truck out there, that way if we have a call, we can go out."

Coy isn't sure on the number of visitors to expect, but he knows a number of them will make their way to the bridge.

"I don't have a number to throw out there," Coy said. "I think the first year we sold right around 50 hot dogs, but people also came in just to take pictures of the bridge and didn't even talk to us. We also had 200 hoagies the last couple of years and we sold out on those. People will come down just to buy hoagies. The hoagie sale is actually Oct. 7. It just falls that we make them all together so we have them to sell for donations."

The festival is a good way for the department to connect with the community.

"We enjoy meeting different people," Coy said. "It's just nice to reach out and see the different people come through. We get to show off the truck to the little kids if they want to sit inside it or have us turn on the lights for them."

### **About the State Road Covered Bridge**

When the State Road Covered Bridge was built in 1983, the county saw the return of one of many of the covered bridges that used to dot the landscape, since lost to time, flood fire and plain wear and tear.

The covered bridge spanning Conneaut Creek in Monroe Township is a single span, Town truss design. Constructed of 97,000 board-feet of southern pine and oak, it features a 4-foot-tall window which extends the length of the bridge.

State Road Bridge should not to be confused with a covered bridge on another State Road in the county, Smolen-Gulf Bridge in Plymouth Township.

The dedication of the bridge in 1983 was the forerunner of the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival. It is located about four miles east-southeast of North Kingsville.

State Road was the first wooden covered bridge constructed in the county since the turn of the 20th Century. It was the first covered bridge designed and built by then-County Engineer John Smolen, Jr.

The original covered bridge at the site was built in 1831 by Ira Benton and David Niles for a cost of \$100. The bridge stood until 1898. Whether it was lost to a flood or simply wore out, no one is certain and records don't specify the reason for its replacement with an iron bridge.

The effort during the early 1980s to replace the then-83-year-old iron bridge, itself built to replace the original covered bridge, was a "pet project" of County Commissioner Alfred Mackey. The bridge was built with CETA (Comprehensive Education Training Act) funds. A grant of \$200,000 went toward construction – about 20 percent more than a conventional concrete bridge.

Construction of the State Road Covered Bridge was billed at the time as an economic stimulus that would provide jobs for unemployed local workers. The nation was just beginning to emerge from a lengthy recession in 1983. The area had seen upwards of an 18.7 percent unemployment rate during the downturn.


Building the bridge was a labor-intensive project. Construction drew sightseers to the area throughout the summer and fall before it opened, with an estimated 300 people a week turning out to watch the bridge go up and take pictures.

The bridge was built on dry land at the site and then moved across the river on a temporary I-beam structure. Rollers and winches moved the bridge into place before the structure was moved onto its abutments in October, 1983.

Ceremonies marking the bridge's dedication were held on Nov. 9, 1983. A large crowd of about 2,500 people attended the opening of the bridge. The dedication marked the beginning of preparations to establish the Ashtabula County Covered Bridge Festival the following year.

The State Road Covered Bridge is located at 5899 State Rd., in Monroe Township.

The festival had not been hosted on Graham Road in the past for a very simple reason.

"It was just neighbors getting together," Culp said. "It's a positive thing in Pierpont. It's people getting together to do this."

Celebrating bridges like the Graham Road bridge is important.

"People don't realize the beauty in the old bridges," Culp said. "A lot of times, we don't think of how beautiful they are."

from the past will be available," Whitehead said. "For example, the Smolen-Gulf Bridge one will be available at Smolen-Gulf Bridge. The T-shirts will be available at the Giddings Park festival and at the Creek Road festival, or through the office and website."

The ornaments and T-shirts have become traditions, though the T-shirts have been done longer.

"We just started the ornaments six years ago," Whitehead said. "We've been doing the T-shirts for 38 years now."

The festival committee was looking for a new way to raise money while also promoting the bridges and festival. It seemed to be a good fit.

"We were looking for something new and different to do as a collector's item," Whitehead said. "Somebody had mentioned Christmas ornaments, so we decided to go with it. This company was a good fit. Eventually, people will have all 19 bridges."

The ornaments are a high-quality collector's item.

"They're made by Beacon Design," Whitehead said. "They make the Whitehouse ornaments. They're two-dimensional and they're cool."

The committee releases one new ornament every year.

"The main thing is they're a pretty expensive thing to buy, so we can only do one per year," Whitehead said.

Celebrating the festival through Christmas ornaments is unique. "It's pretty special," Whitehead said. "Selling souvenirs is what helps us keep the festival office open all year. We like that people look forward to getting the next year's ornament."

the festival. She will have merchandise for sale such as calendars, postcards and Christmas ornaments. The proceeds from these sales will go back to the Covered Bridge Committee to help pay for the event.

all the X braces, those are from 1862."

According to Ashtabula County Metroparks, the bridge was constructed in 1868, a steel span was added in 1913 and the bridge was renovated in 1991-92.

The information from Metroparks notes the double-span Howe truss bridge is one of currently 16 drivable covered bridges in the county. At 228 feet, it's the third longest covered bridge in Ohio.

Severino said it will be a while before the trusses are put back.

He said the steel portion of the bridge will also be taken down by another company.

"They're going to go through that piece by piece by piece, and that's going to get galvanized and put right back up," he said.

The Ashtabula County Commissioners accepted a bid of \$6,057,260.50 for the project back in March.

According to a previously published article in the Gazette, funding for the project is from Motor Vehicle Gas Tax funds, federal (80 percent) and an Ohio Public Works Commission grant and loan.

"It's a big project," said Tom Partridge, chief deputy engineer with the Ashtabula County Engineer's Office said previously. "It is not scheduled to be complete until Dec. 31, 2023...It'll be two construction seasons."

The bridge will be closed the entire time, he said.

Sue Ellen Foote, executive director of the Geneva Area Chamber of Commerce, said the Harpersfield Covered Bridge will be missed this year during the festival, especially for those wanting to tour all the bridges and take photos.

"They're just going to get a construction site this year," she said.

wood to cover an entire football field at a thickness of 13 inches.

The bridge cost just under \$7.8 million to build and features walkways along both sides. It's constructed of four, 15-foot sections of Douglas fir resting on concrete abutments and three concrete piers. It rises nearly 100 feet above the gorge formed by the Ashtabula River, carrying traffic across the boundary between Ashtabula and Plymouth townships.

Below the Smolen-Gulf Bridge is the Riverview Bridge, a 150-foot-long, 14-foot-wide pedestrian bridge completed in 2016. A visitor's pavilion was built on the south side of the bridge in 2010.

Proceeds from hosting the bridge will go to East Plymouth Grange for the restoration of the organization's meeting hall, a century building put up by founding members with help from some contractors.

The Grange Hall in Plymouth Township was funded by the sale of a quilt and put up by the group's founding members – including Hodges' grandparents – but is in need of some work.

"We are currently working on restoring the building," she said. "Typically, we used the money for community service but we really need the building fixed."

East Plymouth Grange was founded in 1901 by farmers in the township who banded together to help serve the community, socialize and to advocate for agriculture. The grange hall, located at 1199 Carson Road, was built in 1915. Membership is open to anyone in the community, simply ask a member.

can be more easily moved and displayed in Giddings Park for the Covered Bridge Festival.

Come and see the history of Ashtabula County. Much of the county has history in farming, and many of these engines we'll be showing off were used as old farming water pumps and the such. Many of them are from the 1920s and 1930s, before there was electricity available to power the pumps, the farmers and industry in general had to use steam engines such as the ones we'll have on display."

Seifert also talks about the antique tractors that the engine club will have on display for the Covered Bridge Festival.

"The kids love the old tractors," he said. "They love to sit on them and pretend to drive them. They're all really neat,

and some of them look brand new thanks to the care they've received from members of the engine club."

"The engines will be operating at the park during the Covered Bridge Festival," Seifert said. "People can see what we would have used in the 1920s and 1930s to complete farm tasks."

If history lessons are what you're after, the Antique Engine Club members will be present to answer questions and give a little bit of history on their engines present at the Covered Bridge Festival.

"We'll be available to answer any of your questions," said Seifert. "Or, if you just want to talk about the 100-year-old engines that's perfectly fine, too. There will be somebody from the engine club that'll be eager to talk about their engine."

"We at the Ashtabula County Antique Engine Club enjoy the Covered Bridge Festival," Seifert said. "It's a fun event, and it's a chance for us to display our engines to the public during this fun, family event. Come and see some of our history at the Covered Bridge Festival this October."

"I just share what I have read as though I am talking with a friend," he said.

Though he is now older than Lincoln was when the president was assassinated, King still manages to "make his hair look

younger" and pass for Lincoln, even when he is not in costume.

"When I am in everyday clothing someone will come up to me and say 'did anyone ever tell you you look like Lincoln?' I tell them, 'I have been accused and found guilty!" King said.

Be sure to watch for Abraham Lincoln strolling the grounds of the Covered Bridge Festival from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 8, and 12-4 p.m. Sunday, Oct.
