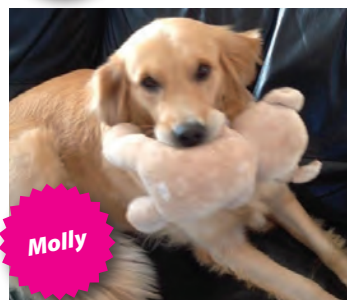
Looking forward to 2016 - well who knows where the journey will take us. Our promise will be to continue to work hard ensuring we can rescue as many dogs in need as finances allow.

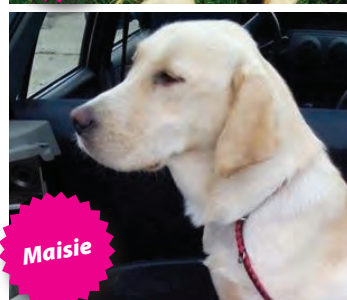

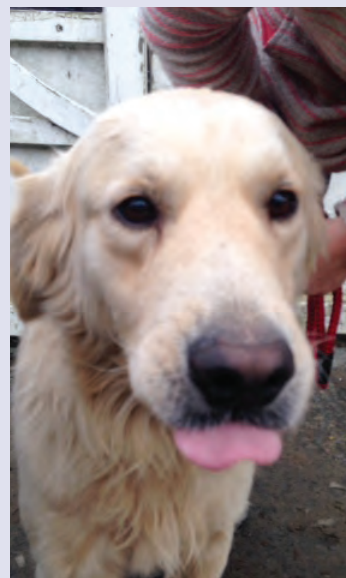
the back of the car as if to say - 'please get me out of here'.

Katie's mum is a teacher and wanted to get her students involved in raising some money for Happy Paws.

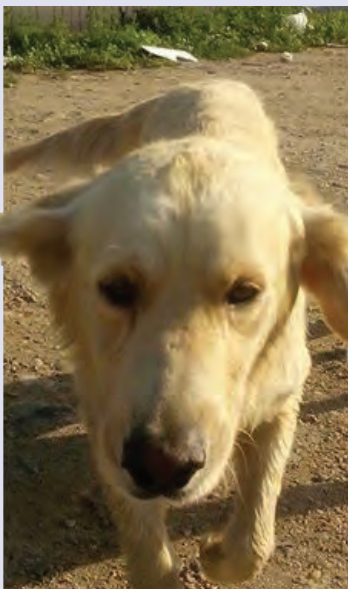
So a sponsored walk was arranged so Katie could take part. How wonderful is this.

None of our kids would be here today if it were not for the generosity of all the kind people. To see them embracing life and giving it a go is priceless.



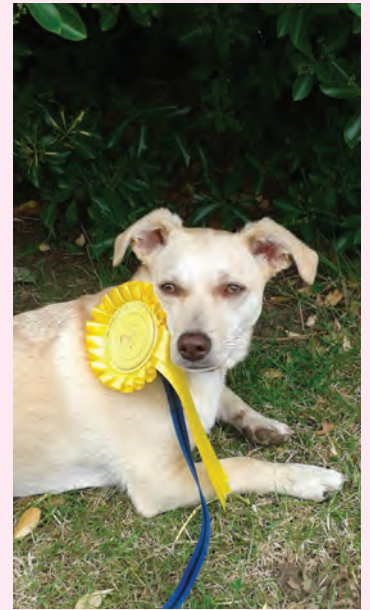

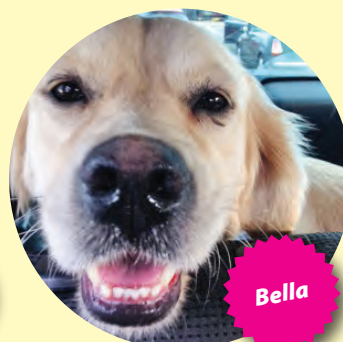

When we were asked to help a 'little retriever type dog' by one of our friends in rescue we were only too happy to help.

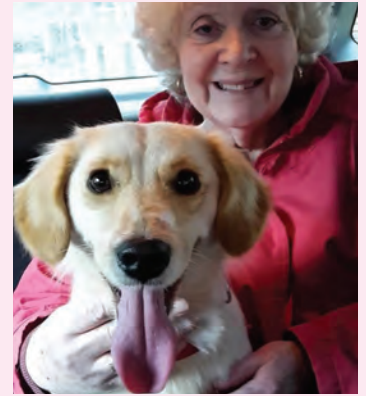
Well, little was the word, but what our boy Dylan lacked in height he made up for in character and temperament.
