DEPARTMENTAL HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED

COMMUNICATION

- To broaden parishioner range and to reach a wider audience, the focus on electronic communication in all departments was expanded: RS Media, Friday email, electronic newsletters, electronic bulletin, Flocknote, Facebook, Instagram, electronic sign on Co. Rd. 42.
- The process of developing a new, dynamic Risen Savior website was started in January 2022 and is nearing completion.

Safe Environment: Protecting God's Children (VIRTUS)

 The VIRTUS program has now completely switched from in-person to online credentialing of employees and volunteers, which is a huge improvement and expedites the credentialing process exponentially. The program is offered in English and in Spanish.

COMMUNITY LIFE

- Saturday, September 4, 2021: 5:00 p.m. Mass Charter member Mass & celebration with former pastors, recognition, special blessing, prayers, recognition by the Risen Savior Knights of Columbus. Wine & cheese reception for everyone after Mass. Approximately 332 people attended.
- Weekend, September 11/12, 2021: 50th Anniversary celebration Masses with Fr. Denny; 11:00 a.m. & 1:30 p.m. Masses with Fr. Denny and Bishop Cozzens. A total of 1459 parishioners & guests attended the weekend celebration Masses. Celebration reception and activities after Masses drew 800+ people.
- Risen Savior is part of and hosts the SALT (Seniors Learning Together, Inc.) program. SALT is an interfaith coalition of area churches providing enrichment learning to people over age 55. Sessions are held in spring and fall at Risen Savior. Attendance Fall 2021: 804, Spring 2022: 686.
- Fr. Denny's tragic death on October 25, 2021. The funeral on Saturday, 10/30/21 at 10:30 a.m.; presider Archbishop Hebda, homilist Fr. Kevin Clinton. 50+ additional priests and 1000+ parishioners attended the funeral in person.
- As would have been Father Denny's wish, we continued all scheduled parish activities as intended. A
 previously planned welcome event for Father Denny the weekend of October 30 & 31 shifted to an
 opportunity for parishioners to gather and remember the beloved pastor. Father Matthew Malek presided
 at the 5:00, 9:00 and 11:00 Masses and helped process this loss. Mass in Spanish was celebrated at
 1:00 p.m. with Bishop Joseph Williams presiding. A total of 1469 parishioners and guests attended these
 weekend Masses. Following all masses, refreshments were available as people gathered for fellowship
 and remembrance.
- The Women's Holiday Pause event was held at the Holiday Inn in Lakeville on November 5, 2021. 157
 women attended the beautiful event.
- Fr. Jim Gorman (Assoc. Pastor at Risen Savior 1995-2011, guest presider until his death in January 2017) Memorial Silent Art Auction on 4/30-5/1/2022. Fr. Jim was an avid art collector. His family donated over 106 pieces to Risen Savior. Proceeds of the silent auction went to the Risen Savior Emergency Fund, the Youth Mission Trip, and the new Risen Savior website. Total funds collected: \$5,325.

LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION

General/All Ages

 Our Advent Birthday Bags service project was a big success, providing 360 Communities with birthday gifts for children in need throughout 2022. We will continue to make improvements to this project.

Elementary Formation

VBS will be back in 2023.

- 23 children (mostly grade 2) celebrated First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our English program.
- 63 children (grades 2-10) celebrated First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our Spanish program.
 Vacation Bible School was cancelled this summer as the Elementary Coordinator left the end of May.

Secondary Formation (Middle & High School)

- This past year we were able to move back to in person Faith Formation for Confirmation. We have smaller numbers but hope they will grow to where they were once people are more comfortable meeting in person.
- 29 students from our Spanish program and 28 from our English program celebrated Confirmation at the Cathedral in St. Paul with Bishop Joseph Williams presiding.

Youth Ministry

Sanctuary, our high school youth group, resumed in person all year. We had fun celebrating Halloween with a pumpkin carving contest, a Christmas cookie decorating contest, and a pizza party to celebrate the memory of Nate Woodford (for whom our Youth Room is named) for what would have been his 27th birthday. We went on mission trip this past summer to Denver, Colorado. 13 youth and 5 adults traveled to serve the community there. We served by helping distribute food for several food shelves and spent time talking with people who were homeless, learning about their challenges. We helped paint several homes, tended to a community garden, and helped create art for residents in a nursing facility. The youth and adults grew in their faith and shared Christ with those they served. We ended the summer with a cookout and fun evening at Nalleli Renteria's home. *2 of our middle school youth and Rae Ann Konkol attended Catholic Youth Summer Camp sponsored by Damascus Ministries. They grew in their faith in the midst of a high adventure camp. We were able to attend daily Mass, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and experience Eucharistic Adoration in a beautiful setting in Trego, WI. We hope to increase the number of youth who attend this camp next summer.

Adult Formation

- July 2021-June 2022: In the Anglo community, the parents of 22 children participated in Baptism preparation classes and had their children baptized.
- Catholic Watchmen and the MOMS Group resumed meeting in-person.
- Fr. Denny and Grace Koleczek led 49 people on a "mini-pilgrimage" to the *Basilica of St. Mary* in Minneapolis to learn about and view the *Angels Unawares* sculpture.
- Carolyn Kolovitz, spiritual director at Loyola Spirituality Center in St. Paul, led the annual Advent Evening
 of Reflection on the theme Presence at the Nativity for 32 participants.
- 26 people registered for the Lenten Series Our Lenten Journey Towards Conversion of Heart with Dr. Cathy Cory.
- 5 adults participated in the English RCIA process, and 4 of them received initiation sacraments at the Easter Vigil. 1 additional adult did her formation process and made her Confirmation at a separate time.
- 3 children participated in the English CIC process. 2 of them made their First Communion at the Easter Vigil, and 1 was baptized at a family parish in Peru.
- 53 people attended Dr. Angela Senander's presentation Discipleship in a Divided Church.

- We welcomed Rev. Julie Neraas to facilitate the women's retreat Lift up your hearts! Living Inside of Hope in March. 50 women attended.
- Risen Savior participated in the Archdiocesan Synod in the following ways: 9 English (83 participants), 3 Spanish (35 participants) Synod Fall groups. Results were submitted to the Archdiocese and will be sent to parishes in Fall 2022. Fr. Tim Rudolphi met with a group of 10 parishioners in February 2022 for an all-day Parish Synod Leadership Team (PSLT) meeting, where they discussed and discerned how the archdiocesan synod prioritizes through the lens of our parish. The Risen Savior Synod subcommittee grew out of the PSLT and started meeting as needed in May 2022 to work on ways to implement findings from the synod thus far into our parish.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

- Feed My Sheep community meal was paused during the pandemic; our parish volunteer team, in consultation with staff, decided to discontinue involvement. All remaining funds were donated.
- After 3 years without partnering with Habitat for Humanity Faith Builds, Risen Savior stepped back up to serve! In July, Schafer and Anne Elliott-Thul presented There's no place like home! The Transformational Power of Homeownership. Over 3 days in August, 32 construction crew volunteers worked on 2 new multi-family homes in Chaska. 16 volunteers helped with meals, many more donated food and beverages. Parishioners and guests raised money to fulfill our \$4500 pledge to Habitat for Humanity.
- Our Bread for the World team participated in the Annual Offering of Letters. We received 14 letters each
 to send to Sens. Amy Klobuchar, Tina Smith, and Rep. Angie Craig, advocating for hunger relief.
- The Social Justice and Outreach commission held a winter gear drive in November. We donated items to the Dakota Woodlands, Matrix Housing, and unsheltered folks in encampments in Minneapolis.
- The Human Trafficking committee has continued educating our parish through bulletin articles about the
 myths and realities of trafficking. They have also organized gratitude baskets for local law enforcement
 and community outreach workers who serve victims and survivors of trafficking.
- Our parish's Environmental Concerns committee hosted a community movie night viewing of Just Eat It:
 A Food Waste Story to kick off their Lenten food waste challenge. They planted 2 native Minnesota trees
 on the south lawn using funds from the Victory Noll grant they were awarded. They also held a sapling
- give-away for Earth Day in April.

 From July 2021-June 2022, our parish donated 12762 pounds of food to 360 Communities Food Shelf via our Food on the First program.
- 12 Meals on Wheels volunteers bring meals to neighbors in the community every Tuesday afternoon.
- Volunteers continue to cook and serve free, curbside meals through *Loaves and Fishes*.
- 6 volunteers serve brunch once/month for residents at the Dakota Woodlands family shelter in Eagan.
- 15 people participated in a 3-week course using the *Joint Religious Legislative Coalition's* webinars Statewide Housing Issues and Solutions.
- The Human Trafficking committee hosted a donation drive in October for personal hygiene items. They
 held the December jewelry sale and raised \$2087 used for projects at Brittany's Place and Breaking
 Free. They also hosted 2 weekday afternoon Lenten Stations of the Cross to end human trafficking.
- Risen Savior Prison Ministry: 9 volunteers contribute to the Ignatian Meditation videos; we sponsored Christmas gifts for 25 children of incarcerated parents. The birthday card ministry has 12 volunteers who write to 25 people a month. 4 parishioners started pen pal relationships with incarcerated individuals through the Order of Malta pen pal program.
- The Respect Life Committee held their annual October Baby Bottle Campaign, Mother's Day flower sale, and Donuts for Dads events.
- The Sister Parish committee continues to be in communication with our Sister Parish, St. Rose of Lima (Gris Gris, Haiti); our parish as a whole has offered communal prayers during Mass for them. St. Rose prays weekly for our parish. Risen Savior raised over \$33000 this fiscal year in support of our Sister Parish. We used these donations towards the St. Rose school operating expenses and to replace the broken well with a solar pump to restore water to the community.
- A small group who attended 2021's Summer Read on A Good Time for the Truth: Race in Minnesota started the Social Justice Awareness book group to continue education around anti-racism efforts. They have grown to 12 members.

PASTORAL CARE

- 41 funerals were planned and celebrated from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022.
- Grief Ministry follow-up calls and mailings continued on a monthly basis.
- The Growing Through Loss coalition held its Fall series at St. Michael's in Farmington.
- Our BeFriender ministers hosted the annual All Souls Remembrance Service in November.
- 9 BeFriender ministers are visiting nine BeFriendees.
- Home Communion ministers visit 19 parishioners.
- BeFrienders meet monthly from September through May for supervision and formation.
- Residents at Ecumen, the Villa, Augustana Care facility and Havenwood have monthly Mass and Communion services offered weekly or biweekly.
 Prayer shawls and quilts made by our Peacemakers Quilt Group were supplied to Fairview Ridges and
- friends and family members of our parishioners. Prayer shaws continue to be provided through our Human Trafficking Committee members for the Breaking Free graduation ceremony.

 Ridges Hospital, which was closed to visitors because of the pandemic, has reopened to hospital
- Communion ministers.
- Funeral luncheons, which were not offered because of the pandemic, started up again in May 2022.
- Our email Prayer Line receives requests on a very regular basis.
- 33 gas and 33 grocery cards have been distributed to people who are in crisis. Risen Savior sends a monthly donation from our emergency fund to 360 Communities to be used for people in crisis.

LATINO MINISTRY

- We have 775 Latino families registered with Risen Savior.
- On average, approximately 700 people attend Sunday Masses.
- Sacraments: 16 weddings, 47 baptisms, 60 First Reconciliations & First Communions, 29 Confirmations.
- R.C.I.A.: At the Easter Vigil Mass 3 adults were baptized and received the Sacraments of initiation, 14
 adults received Communion and Confirmation, and 3 CIC children received baptism and Communion.
- 22 Quinceañera Masses were celebrated.
- Parochial Vicar, Fr. Mario Castagnola, installed the bi-lingual weekly *Holy Hour of Adoration* with approx. 60 people on average attending.
- The annual Health Fair (flu shots, mammograms) was held on October 17, 2021.
- There were 46 visitations of the statue of our *Lady of Guadalupe* to Spanish-speaking homes by the Guadalupe Committee. This is called *Pascua Guadalupana*. It is a way of evangelization.
- On December 12, 2021, the celebration Mass for our *Lady of Guadalupe* was again vibrant and successful. The church was full. Fun reception with great food after the Mass.
