2024 HIGHLIGHTS

RESCUE KITCHEN NETWORK CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAM

We joined the Rescue Kitchen Network, powered by La Soupe —a collaborative mentoring program providing capacity-building support to chef-driven food rescue organizations. This partnership brought significant funding to MVM which helped us purchase new equipment and make upgrades to our facility, as well as the opportunity to connect with like-minded organizations across the country.





FACILITY AND EQUIPMENT UPGRADES

We made major upgrades to our kitchen facility in 2024, including the addition of a new tilt skillet and blast chiller, which help cook and cool large batches of food quickly, an electric conveyor which moves food between our ground floor and basement pantry, and a new dishwasher. These upgrades increase efficiency in production while relieving physical strain on our team.

INCREASED VOLUNTEER SUPPORT

Our network of volunteers more than doubled in 2024! Volunteers help us prepare meals, assist with events, and keep our space organized and clean.






