

## **Recommended Exam and Immunization Schedule**

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Birth (Hospital)	Exam, Newborn Screen (bloodspot and hearing), <b>HepB</b>
2-5 days	Exam, <b>HepB</b> (if not at hospital), 2 <sup>nd</sup> Newborn bloodspot screen
2-4 weeks	Exam
2 months	Exam, DTaP/Hib/IPV, PCV13, RV, HepB
4 months	Exam, DTaP/Hib/IPV, PCV13, RV
6 months	Exam, DTaP/Hib/IPV, PCV13, RV, HepB, Flu (in season)
9 months	Exam
12 months	Exam, <b>MMR</b> , <b>Varicella</b> , <b>HepA</b> , Hemoglobin, Lead and TB screens (if needed)
15 months	Exam, DTaP/Hib/IPV, PCV13
18 months	Exam, Autism screen
2 years	Exam, Autism screen, <b>HepA</b> , Lead and TB screens (if needed)
3 years	Exam, TB (if needed)
4 years	Exam, DTaP, MMR, Varicella, IPV, TB (if needed)
5-10 years	Exam, TB (if needed)
11 years	Exam, Tdap, MCV4, HPV, Varicella (if needed), TB (if needed)
12-15 years	Exam, <b>HPV</b> , Dyslipidemia screening (if needed), TB (if needed)
16 years	Exam, MCV4, MenB, Dyslipidemia screening (if needed), TB (if needed)
17-18 years	Exam, <b>MenB</b> , Dyslipidemia screening (if needed), TB (if needed)

Yearly well child visits and flu vaccines are recommended from 2-18 years.

Vaccines in bold above, by abbreviation:

DTaP - Diphtheria, Tetatus, acelluar Pertussis

HepA - Hepatitis A

HepB – Hepatitis B

Hib - Hemophilus influenza type B

HPV - Human Papilloma virus

IPV - Inactivated Polio

MenB – Meningococcal type-B

MCV4 – Meningococcal conjugate MMR – Measles, Mumps, Rubella

PCV13 – Prevnar, pneumococcal conjugate

RV – Rotavirus

Tdap - Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis

Varicella – Chicken pox

Flu – Influenza quadrivalent vaccine
