

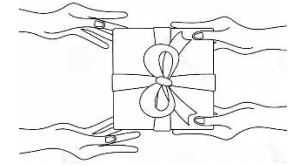

This is Garth Anderson's 14th season in the Wheaton Municipal Band, and 11th season as the personnel manager for the band. Garth also performs as principal trumpet in the DuPage Symphony Orchestra and with the brass quintet entitled *Genuine Brass*. Previously, he performed as second trumpet and personnel manager with the Fox Valley Orchestra, trumpeter in the Chicago Metropolitan Brass Ensemble, principal



trumpet with the Chicago Bach Ensemble, and has performed on several solo and duet recitals. He received his Master's degree and Performer's Certificate in Trumpet Performance from Northern Illinois University and his Bachelor's of Music Education degree from DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana. His principal teachers included Dr. Mark Ponzo and Prof. Lennie Foy. He currently teaches beginning band and general music in Prospect Heights School District #23, a position he previously held in Sycamore School District #427.
