


Kristen Ronning

Kristen Ronning is a horn player currently based in Chicago. She received her B.M. in Horn Performance from Bowling Green State University and her M.M. in Orchestral Studies from Roosevelt University where she studied with Dr. Andrew Pelletier and Jon Boen respectively.

This is Kristen's third season as a member of the Wheaton Municipal Band horn section. She has also performed with various ensembles across the Midwest, including the Adrian Symphony

Orchestra, Civic Orchestra of Chicago, Beloit Janesville Symphony Orchestra, North Shore Chamber Orchestra, Rochester Symphony Orchestra, and Perrysburg Symphony Orchestra. This fall Kristen will begin her Doctor of Musical Arts at the University of Iowa with Dr. Katy Ambrose.





The basic tubing of the modern French horn is 12-13 feet long, though there is extra tubing for the valves. The horn player blows into the mouthpiece while buzzing the lips together to sound a note. Different pitches can be produced by altering the pressure of the lips and by pressing down the valves.
