

Memorial Day weekend is expected to be a busy one in the harbor. As always, your invited guests will need to be provided with a parking pass in advance of their arrival. If you are not familiar with the process to reserve a guest pass, please reach out to the marina office for the instructions. We can send you the step-by-step instructions and walk you all the way through the process if you would like. It is very easy to do. Guest parking passes can be reserved for up to 72 hours and will allow your guest in and out privileges to the lot. Once you send them the pass, your guest will simply scan the QR code at the gate kiosk for entry/exit. Passes that are sent via screenshot will not work. The system requires that passes be transferred via email. Reminder...guest passes work the same way as your RFID tag on a one in/one out system. If the pass is not used for entry, it will not work for exit. It is important that your guest has the pass in hand for initial entry into the lot to avoid issues at exit.

The marina office will be open on Memorial Day and throughout the holiday weekend. We will have our maintenance team onsite and available should anything come up needing attention. On the Docks



We have a lot of movement happening in May. Boats from the next phase of the marina revitalization project will be coming into vacant slips throughout the harbor. Don't be shy, say hello and give your new neighbors a warm welcome. As I said from day 1...it is a big change for many who have been on the same dock with the same neighbors and friendships for a very long time. As we are now nearly two years into the project, it seems many have settled in nicely, made new friends and some have liked their relocation so much that they changed their mind about where they want to

end up in the big picture. No matter where in the harbor, we have the BEST and friendliest boaters around!

The Marina at Dana Point is proud to be a certified Clean Marina! Maintaining Clean Marina status comes with the requirement and commitment to ongoing best management practices by us, our boaters and contractors. We are obligated to exercise environmental best management practices by keeping

trash and other substances out of the harbor and ocean water. Leaving bicycles on the docks is a violation of the Clean Marina program due to the residue that can get into the water from the bicycle tires. It is also a violation of Clean Marina policy to have potted plants on the docks. Please help us maintain our Clean Marina certification by removing any stored items from the dock fingers or main walkways. If you are having minor work done on your boat, please be sure to use catch bags to trap any debris before it gets into the water. Any major vessel work (more than 25% of the vessel) must be done at a shipyard or elsewhere. Dana Point Harbor is one of the cleanest thanks to all of our collaborative efforts...thank you!

Our maintenance team is onsite and available to address maintenance issues on the docks, restrooms and common areas. Please give us a call or send an <u>EMAIL</u> to report any issues you see out there or if there is anything we can do to help you. We always appreciate your feedback!

Marina Revitalization

Bellingham Marine continues to impress with their quality work and timely productivity on the waterside project. The marina is moving along at an impressive pace with Phase 5 on the verge of completion. We anticipate Phase 5 slip locations will be ready to occupy in early to mid-June 2024. Completion of this phase will complete the west basin cove in its entirety. Wow! That was fast! Seems like yesterday that we were celebrating



pulling the first pile. Less than two years later, we are nearly finished with five phases of this massive 15 phase project. Hooray!

Phase 5 will light up as follows:

Gate 16: Dock of the Crystal Lantern

Gate 17: Dock of the Sunrise Lantern

Gate 18: Dock of the Emerald Lantern

Gate 19: Dock of the Sapphire Lantern

The project will move to the island starting June 1st with Phase 6 demo. Phase 6 includes D-Dock West Basin Island. Each tenant assigned to a slip on D-Dock West Basin Island has been issued a letter outlining a temporary relocation assignment. Our goal is to have the dock 100% clear and ready for demolition beginning June 1st. Phase 6 is expected to take 3-4 months and once complete will consist of the following slip mix:

21' = 6

25' = 106

26' = 2

30' = 23

33' ET = 1

63' ET = 1

We have a lot of boaters waiting for a new slip on the island side. This will be the first of many opportunities to select one. Slip selection for Phase 6 will begin shortly after demo of the area starts. The slip selection process will be ongoing until all the slips have been selected.

We have had an opportunity to contact 100% of the current marina tenants on the 28′, 30, 40′, 45′, 55′ and 60′ slip selection seniority list. With that process, we are able to determine where almost everyone on these lists would like to end up and in which phase they plan to make their selection. Of course, some are still unsure about where they want to be and continue to think it through. Although we have not made it 100% through the 26′ and under slip selection seniority list, we are very close and anticipate that we will get there within the next two weeks. When we reach the names at the bottom of this list, these become slip assignments rather than selections since we will be using every slip in the 26′ and under size category to accommodate our current tenants.

We realize the slip selection process is important and understand that preferred location is high priority as long-time marina tenants. Now that we have been through a few phases and corresponding slip selection process, we are finding that people are able to end up where they want to be. If for some reason, you are unable to get exactly what you want, we do maintain a transfer list. As slips become available, we will refer to the transfer list and relocate existing tenants before offering slips to the waitlist.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation and enthusiasm as we continue to move through the marina revitalization project. Things are looking great and feedback from our tenants on the new docks has been positive. On we go...heading into Phase 6!

BOATING CLEAN & GREEN

Oil and Gas

are toxic to aquatic life. Oil can coat the feathers and fur of wildlife, destroying their natural insulation from cold. Even a thin film of oil can kill aquatic organisms that live near the water's surface. A single gallon of fuel can contaminate over a million gallons of water. Once ingested, oil moves up the food chain from tiny plankton to fish, birds and even humans, and can cause reproductive problems, weakness, and death. The cumulative effect of small spills has a serious impact on coastal and inland waters. Using soap to remove fuel or oil sheen in the water is also bad for the environment and is illegal.

GOAL: Prevent pollution from oil and gas spills to help maintain a healthy and aesthetically pleasing recreational environment for boaters and others.

Actions you can take to prevent oil and gas spills:

- Use caution when filling your fuel tank and don't top off. Know the capacity of your tank and leave it at least 10% empty.
- Catch fuel drips with an absorbent pad. Properly dispose of soiled absorbents.
- Do not hose down gas spills or apply detergents or soaps to an oil sheen.
- Install fuel tank vent whistles or fuel/air separators to avoid spills.
- Inspect fuel lines and hoses periodically. Replace as needed.
- Use funnels for pouring oil and keep a supply of absorbent pads onboard for cleaning up spills.
- Dispose of used oil and drained oil filters at a waste oil recycling center.
