The 48th Annual Prince Lot Hula Festival Returns Celebrating Hula & Hawaiian Culture

Mākaukau! In the Hawaiian language, the word 'mākaukau' means 'ready.' And this month, Hawai'i is ready to celebrate and pay tribute to Prince Lot Kapuāiwa.

Known as the last great traditional chief, Prince Lot

was a staunch supporter of hula and ruled the Hawaiian Islands as Kamehameha V from 1863 to 1872, and the Moanalua Gardens Foundation is ready to celebrate all things hula and Hawaiian culture during the 48th Annual Prince Lot Hula Festival. This two-day festival will take place July 19-20 from 9 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Frank F. Fasi Civic Grounds in downtown Honolulu.

This year's theme, Mākaukau, invites us to embrace aloha, kuleana, and mālama as we passionately carry on the important work of preserving our beautiful island heritage and nurturing a vibrant Hawai'i. The Prince Lot Hula Festival is one of the ways preserving our heritage continues. Founded in 1978, the Prince Lot Hula Festival celebrates the remarkable legacy of Prince Lot Kapuāiwa—who ruled as Kamehameha V—for his inspiring efforts

"Our mission at MGF Hawai'i is to mālama 'āina and mo'omeheu - caring for the land and perpetuating Hawaiian culture," said lan Keali'i Custino, Executive Director of the Moanalua Gardens Foundation. "The Prince Lot Hula Festival is more than a celebration. It's a cultural movement. Are you Mākaukau?"

This year's festival will present an outstanding lineup of 15 award-winning kumu hula and hālau, including Robert Cazimero's Hālau Nā Kamalei O Līlīlehua, Vicky Takemine's Pua Ali'i 'ilima, and Michael Pili Pang's Hālau Hula Ka No'eau to name a few.

Joining forces, KHON's Kamaka Pili will emcee alongside Executive Director of the Moanalua Gardens Foundation, Ian

Custino. The festivities kick off Saturday morning at 9 a.m. with the opening ceremony, featuring the procession of the Royal Order of Kamehameha I. Established by Royal Decree in 1865, the Order aims to foster loyalty and honor to the Kingdom and its institutions, while recognizing individuals who've made significant contributions. Today, the Order continues to promote goodwill and benevolence,







Chef's Corner

Hau Tree Restaurant Pastry Chef Joli Asano

Joli Asano is the Pastry Chef at the Hau Tree in the Kaimana Beach Hotel. Born, raised, and trained on O'ahu, she embodies the success of a KCC Culinary graduate. Recently assigned to create the menu for Mu'u & Mimosa, the Kaimana Hotel's new monthly Tea Party, she has been enjoying the creative process and looks forward to crafting holiday menus that everyone will love, along with developing new desserts for the restaurant. When she's not working, she humorously claims she's sleeping, but beyond that, she enjoys watching movies, playing with her dogs, Kirby and Kinako, and playing Animal Crossing.

What is your first childhood food memory?

Growing up, I spent a lot of time with my maternal grandparents. When my grandma needed to go shopping at Long's in Mililani, my grandpa and I would go to TCBY, and he would order a strawberry yogurt in a waffle cone. We would sit on the bench and share it, waiting for my grandma to finish.

When did you know you wanted to be a chef? Probably around my freshman year of high school. I took Food Service classes & joined the FCCLA Club. I had the opportunity to meet many students with the same culinary interests. I also got to compete; I didn't do so well, but it ignited a passion to become better.

Where did you train?

I graduated from Kapiolani Community College and did my externship at Honolulu Coffee Co. I explored various pastry opportunities and schedules to determine which ones I liked best, including Roy's, Cake Works, Dean & Deluca Hawaii, and Four Seasons, just to name a few.

What drew you to pastry arts versus savory?

Although working in pastry can be repetitive, I love the creative aspect of flavors and visuals. I love art and I love baking, and when I saw that I could blend the two together, it was the ideal choice for me. Besides, breaking down chicken, meats, and fish just wasn't fun for me.

Who would you consider your mentor?

There are a few people I would consider mentors, but the most recent is Chef John Taube IV. He was the former Culinary Director at Hau Tree. He gave me the push to take the chance of being the Pastry Chef at Hau Tree. For the longest time, I didn't believe I was at a Chef level, but he believed in me. He taught me how to use modern cuisine ingredients that I had never used before, and he was very supportive because he understood the hardships of the pastry world.

What are your favorite flavor combinations?

I love chocolate and orange, as well as chocolate and peppermint!

Most exciting culinary memory?

In high school, we had a field trip to Roy's in Hawaii Kai where we got to take a look behind the scenes in the kitchen. The Head Pastry Chef let me brûlée the sugar on a Crème Brûlée, and the parchment paper caught on fire. It was scary but fun, and I knew this was something I would want to pursue.

What are your favorite desserts to create?

French Macarons. I love the vibrant colors & getting creative with flavors. Although there are challenges with the humidity and mixing, it's all worth it when you get that perfect batch by overcoming those challenges.

Do you have a memorable win or fail?

I recall trying to create a type of pudding-like dish that would be both vegan and gluten-free for Easter one year. I tested so many recipes that weren't working out, and I was about to give up until I realized I was overthinking everything I knew. What I was looking for was haupia. It was a fail, until it became a win.

How excited were you to be tasked with creating the high tea menu?

I was so excited. There's a lot of fun getting to test new items, listening to critiques from colleagues, and then trying to find a middle ground between what I like and what other

Where did you find inspiration for the menu?

I drew inspiration from local flavors that I grew up with, but I also wanted to create pastries that are familiar enough to everyone to make them curious and want to try the menu.

What's your favorite restaurant to go to?

Hmmm, hard question because I have a lot, but I would say Bo's Kitchen.

Any other information you'd like to share?

My recipe was originally written in grams, but I converted it to make it easier for bakers who don't own a scale. But I do recommend investing in one; it makes a difference.

Banana Bread



Incredients:

3-4 Bananas, overripe & mashed, works out to around 2 cups (450g)

1¹/₃ cup Canola Oil (306g)

5 Eggs

⅓ cup Milk (75g)

2 cups All Purpose Flour (240g) 1 % cup Granulated Sugar (341g) ½ cup Light Brown Sugar (102g) 2 teaspoons Baking Soda (10g) 1 teaspoon Kosher Salt (4g)

Instructions: Preheat oven to 350° degrees. Combine flour, granulated sugar, brown sugar, baking soda, and kosher salt in a bowl. In another bowl, using a whisk, combine smashed bananas, canola oil, eggs and milk. Add the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients. Mix until combine. Bake in a loaf pan for 50-60 minutes. Let cool on a baking rack. Cut into slices & enjoy! * I like to let the batter rest overnight. It allows the dry to absorb more moisture.




