SURFS UP

Most people picture snow, sleet, and rain when they hear the word 'winter.' However, in Hawaii, winter tells a different story altogether. It's when the surf's up, and top surfers from around the world flock to the islands to ride the massive winter swells that hit our shores every year. In November, the best professional surfers get ready to fly to O'ahu and head to our world-famous breaks to showcase their skills, compete for prizes, and earn bragging rights. So, pack your beach gear and be ready to head to the North Shore at a moment's notice and prepared for another season of big-wave surfing.

Every winter, the surf contests on Oahu's North Shore are among Hawaii's most exciting and eagerly anticipated events. The North Shore features some of the world's heaviest waves along its seven-mile stretch, and watching these competitions is thrilling, drawing crowds

of thousands of locals and visitors year after year. The beaches will be packed, boards will be waxed, and we hope the swells will be huge during the months of fierce competition. There's nothing more exciting than watching the world's best surfers compete for the win amidst the world's most formidable waves at spots like Pipeline, Sunset Beach, and Waimea Bay.

The World Surf League will continue its qualifying series on the North Shore this year, but there are some big changes on the horizon for next year. The 2026 Championship Tour will last nine months, visiting nine countries with twelve events, although only the final will take place on Oahu. This season will finish at Pipeline in December, featuring the full men's and women's rosters from the beginning. The Pipe Masters, the final event, will offer 15,000 points—50% more than a regular event—adding significance. The top eight surfers in each division before Pipeline will get advanced seeding, leading to a tense finish to crown the World Champions.

However, that's next year. Until then, a few exciting events are still upcoming right here on O'ahu. The Hawai'i Tourism Authority renewed its sponsorship for the 2025/2026 season and helps provide significant opportunities for the

Being Responsible

Congratulations to the Hawaii Tourism Authority for hosting a successful Tourism Conference, where industry professionals discussed the future of travel in Hawai'i. Attendees participated in valuable conversations on cultural stewardship, innovation, collaboration, and regenerative tourism. The term 'regenerative tourism' was notably the conference's key buzzword. It refers to tourism activities that help restore and improve local ecosystems, follow sustainable methods, honor and maintain local culture, and benefit the community. The word I walked away with was "responsibility." As in, the responsibility falls on all of us to promote sustainable tourism.

There is also the responsibility of sharing valuable safety tips. During this time of year, big surf hits the North Shore, and you are often one of the last voices they hear before heading north. Sharing a few tips with your guests can help ensure they return from their adventure safe and sound. We all have a crucial role in educating our visitors about everything from cultural awareness to safety precautions. Remember to ask the visitor about their experience in open ocean and shore break, and suggest they take a few minutes to assess the conditions before charging in. Encourage your guests to watch where locals enter and exit the water, and tell them to ask questions of City lifeguards, who know best. If they get in trouble, they should stay calm and avoid panicking. They need to swim away from breaking waves, reefs, or rocks and wave for help. You are often the last line of defense, and sharing your knowledge beforehand could help save a life.

Event-wise, there isn't much happening this month compared to most months. Guests will need to enjoy the abundance of natural exhibits O'ahu offers daily. Make the most of the downtime now, as the holidays approach and festivities start to pick up, things will certainly get busier. We'll also be preparing for our final concierge events of the year so you can focus on your own responsibilities as the holidays get closer. See you guys around town. Aloha!

(savory pancake) Eating Contest. Plus, there's a special Napa Cabbage Toss Contest planned as well! Interested in making your own kimchi?

The event is free, but a paid kimchi-making class is available for those who want a hands-on experience. The festival offers non-stop entertainment, including plenty of local performances such as engaging Korean talent contests such as Senior Talent, K-POP Dance, and Song competitions as well as special Taekwondo demonstrations. Kids can enjoy the activity section, and a shaded dining tent offers a relaxing spot to take in the atmosphere.

islands' contenders to earn valuable points toward Challenger Series qualification.

While no longer hosting championship series, three renowned reef breaks will be part of the Hawai'i/Tahiti Nui Qualifying Series (QS) schedule. From November 19 to 26, the HTA Sunset Pro QS 2,000 will mark the final three-stop series of the 2026 Challenger Series qualification. Its rich surfing history includes legendary performances by Sunny Garcia, the 1960s Duke Kahanamoku Invitational, and many other iconic moments, enrich its storied legacy.

The HTA Sunset Pro 2025 is scheduled from November 19 to 26. Keep in mind, this doesn't mean there's a contest every single day. Surf events on the North Shore follow a special format that depends on swell conditions during each event's window. Usually, the competition lasts about 2 to 3 days, but the organizers will choose the exact dates based on the best swell conditions. Since the event can start any day within the holding period, check the World Surf League website (worldsurfleague.com) for updates. The organizers typically make their decision early in the morning and post live updates on whether the contest is happening.

From November 29 to December 6, the HTA HIC Hale'iwa Pro QS 2,000 and Longboard Pro LQS 1,000 will feature the region's top longboarders along with QS contenders at one of North Shore's most iconic surf spots. Ali'i Beach's waves break close to shore, making the competition especially thrilling. This year marked a milestone for longboarders, with two Hawaii surfers, Kai Sallas and Sive Jarrard, earning impressive victories at Hale'iwa's first-ever WSL longboard event. When the swell reaches Hale'iwa's primarily right reef break, it becomes a prime platform for high-performance surfing. Building on notable performances by local surfers Joshua Moniz and Zoe McDougall in 2024, more historic moments are expected in 2025. Looking ahead to next month, The Florence Pipe Pro Presented by HTA QS 2,000 makes its return from December 10 to 20, reintroducing the iconic surfing event to the QS calendar since 2021. Past winners include local surf legends Joshua Moniz, Moana Jones Wong, and two-time World Champion John John Florence, now a two-time Pipe Pro CT

winner. Currently, male and female surfers are competing for their chance to surf at one of the world's most famous waves.

Remember, the holding period for the Eddie begins on December 1, and since only one contest can run each day, it takes priority if called on. When the Eddie occurs, the North Shore comes to a complete halt, so plan accordingly if it happens. Of course, it has only been held 11 times since 1984. When it does come around, it's a major event—don't miss it—whether in person or online. Visitors

are encouraged to make a day of it; the drive to the North Shore is breathtaking. Kids love the maze at Dole Plantation, and who doesn't enjoy Dole Whip? Stop by a shrimp truck, grab a beverage at Turtle Bay, and make sure they keep their eyes open for roadside stands along the way. The fresh fruits and vegetables available are wonderful.

Be sure they drive through Haleiwa while they're heading out. Haleiwa is a laid back beach town filled with historic

charm and offers a variety of quaint stores, food trucks, and restaurant options for visitors to explore.

Compared to Waikiki, the beaches on the North Shore are much quieter, unless there's a surf competition taking place of course. When a competition is in progress, expect the vibe on the beach to be electric. Visitors should be careful when packing their beach bag. Sunscreen is a must! Bring plenty of water. Wear sunglasses. Bring binoculars and a camera, and don't forget a beach towel. Pack or pick up snacks along the way. There are many food trucks to choose from, but lines can be long. Don't worry, porta-potties are plentiful. Remind visitors to take their trash with them when they leave and to be respectful.

Let's talk parking. It's tough to find and very limited. Check road signs, warnings, and driveways to avoid tickets and towing, and don't leave valuables in the car. Unfortunately, there are people out there who try to take advantage of the fact that all eyes are on the ocean. Remind your guests to be smart about what's in their car before they hit the road.

Finally, remind your guests to stay alert. Sitting too close to the water's edge could cause their belongings to get wet, and that's the least of their concerns. The ocean can be dangerous, able to pull a small child or adult into the surf instantly if a big wave hits. Never underestimate its power or turn your back to the ocean. Just last month, three people were seriously injured after a big wave knocked them off the ledge at Sharks Cove and threw them onto sharp rocks. Always follow lifeguard warnings and remember that there is no lifeguard at Shark's Cove. As long as your guests stay smart while they're out there, they should have a outstanding day on the island.

The World's First Lei Vending Machine

Sukit Kanaprach, CEO and VP of The Orchid Lei Company, is not only one of the nicest guys out there, but he might also be one of the brightest! Imagine the joy of picking up a beautiful lei anytime you like. It's an innovative idea that fits Hawaii perfectly. Why hasn't anyone thought of this before?

Lei can be difficult to find in Waikiki. Rents are high, making it financially challenging to run a lei stand in the area. There is a lei store at the Outrigger Reef, but it closes by 3 p.m., and there's a refrigerated case in the lobby of the Romer House, but very few people know about either. The folks at The Orchid Lei Company were trying to find an affordable way to make leis accessible throughout Waikiki 24 hours a day. Sukit says the idea finally came to him in a dream, calling it his Box of Aloha.



It took five years from the time he first conceived the idea to create a working machine. The first Orchid Lei Machines are now operational at the Hyatt Regency Waikiki and Waikiki Beach Marriott Hotel. The machines are restocked with fresh flower leis every two days, ensuring fresh, cold leis each time. Any unsold leis are donated to churches and temples when appropriate.

Currently, five hotels are on the waiting list for their own machines, but since each machine takes 4-5 months to build, it will be awhile before more are available. The concept relies on revenue sharing from lei sales. The hotels provide the space and electricity, while The Orchid Lei Company handles the rest. Open from 4 to 11 p.m., they recently added brunch and now open at 10 a.m. on weekends. 739-9050. • Lastly, you’ve all heard that **The Pig & the Lady** is opening across the street in the Civil Beat building in Kaimuki. By the time this issue comes out, they should be open, and we’ll have more on that later. In the meantime, their former location in Chinatown is now home to **Mama Guava**, a six-month pop-up featuring Filipino-influenced Hawaiian Regional Cuisine. **Chef Monique Cadanova** worked here 10 years ago before moving to New York, and is open for lunch Tuesday through Saturday from 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Check out her continually changing menu at mamaguavahnl.com.



Chef's Corner

855-ALOHA Executive Chef Brad Dodson

Chef Brad Dodson discovered the nurturing connection of food from his late grandmother. Many years later, he began his culinary journey at restaurants such as Le Pigeon and the Michelin-starred Village Pub, before relocating to Hawaii where he joined the kitchens of Brickfire Tavern and Mud Hen Water, discovering the most valuable ingredient of all: Aloha. With guidance from chefs like Ed Kenney, he refined his skills in elevated Hawaiian cuisine, deepening his understanding of local ingredients, foodways, micro-seasonality, and the cultural traditions of the islands, all experienced through the comforts of local cuisine.

What is your first childhood food memory?

My Dad and I would fish for Chinook Salmon in Oregon's Columbia River before sunrise until sundown every fall. We'd fillet the fish together, brine it, and smoke it with Alderwood. The aroma of smoke & fish still brings back fond memories.

When did you know you wanted to be a chef?

I came across a copy of The Culinary Institute of America textbook & Anthony Bourdain's Kitchen Confidential sitting right next to each other at Goodwill. I spent my last \$20 on them and made a butternut squash curry soup. I couldn't put them down; a whole world of possibilities opened up.

How did you go about making that a reality?

I walked into the fanciest restaurant in Walla Walla, Washington, and told the Chef I wanted to learn how to cook.

Who would you consider your mentor?

Mexican immigrant cooks who took a liking to me. They showed me that there was more than one way to get the same result out of a recipe, that things didn't have to be linear. That cooking was about the balance of flavors and heart, and if you worked hard enough, people would call you "Papi" or "Patron."

What was your first job in the industry?

My first job was at Saffron Mediterranean Kitchen /Pho Sho Vietnamese restaurant in Walla Walla run by a husband and wife team that had recently been nominated for a James Beard Award. I had no experience, but for some reason, they took a chance on me. They started me in the dish pit after learning that I had no natural talent to speak of and watched me nearly lop off a couple fingers. I learned slowly by tasting dishes that were misfired by the kitchen and observing.

Describe your style of cooking?

I try to cook as simply as possible, and let the ingredients speak for themselves. When I'm doing my best cooking, I'm channeling my Portuguese-Azorean Great-Grandmother.

What inspired you to design the 855 menu as a homage to classic local favorites?

Most of the local dishes I've seen are simple &

have an incredible flavor-to-ingredient ratio. They come from a desire to share and an openness to learning about other cultures and perspectives.

What are you looking to accomplish there?

855-ALOHA is a nostalgia dine. Come with family and friends, slow down, stay late, taste familiar flavors and remember. I want people to feel like they are dining in their favorite neighborhood restaurant, run by their Auntie who secretly loves them but only shows it through her food.

When did you move to Hawaii, and why?

I moved here about 3 years ago with my family because...well jeeze, look around. It's a magical Island, with kind people.

What do you like most about living here?

The sense of community, the Spirit of Aloha, the food, the calm, and the beauty of the Islands

What do you miss most about the mainland?

This is the first year I've craved a snow-covered cabin in the woods with a roaring fireplace.

Where do you like to go eat?

I'm a fan of the food in the McCully area. 8 Fat Fat 8, Anyplace Lounge, Chong Qing Cuisine, Kyung's Seafood, Fujiyama Texas, I-naba to name a few.

What do you like to do most on your days off?

A perfect day would start by sleeping in, then stopping at Tamura's for POG mimosas and a poke bowl. Afterwards, I'd go to the beach, visit Aloha Got Soul for records, then stop by 8 Fat Fat 8 for Gau Gee and ginger noodles. Later, I'd grill with the family while listening to my new records, and if I was lucky, have a DJ gig at Bevy.

Where do you plan to go from here?!

I have dreams of owning a small beachside cocktail bar serving pupu's someday, but I'll go where the wind takes me.

Is there anything else you'd like to share?

While food is a passion, so is connection, family, music ... and finding news ways to combine them. For example, when not in the kitchen you can find me @dj.richlather and yes, I see Chef/DJ Dinners in the future at 855-ALOHA, where everything we do is about connection.



Piri Piri Oil

Ingredients:

7 red Thai bird's eye chili's
1 Meyer lemon
- cut in wedges

4 cloves garlic
4 bay leaf
1.5 oz. whiskey
1 TBS Salt

1 TBS paprika
6 black peppercorn
2 cups extra virgin olive oil (preferably Portuguese)

Directions: Slowly bring all of the ingredients except for the whiskey to a simmer in the oil over medium-low heat for 15 minutes, taking care not to brown the garlic. Once the garlic begins to soften, very carefully add whiskey to the oil and stand back because it will boil and sputter as the whiskey catches fire. Once the alcohol has burned off, turn off the heat and let it cool. After the mixture has cooled, you can store it in the fridge or, in a European style, at room temperature for weeks. (The longer the ingredients marinate, the more complex the flavor becomes.) Strain and pour into bottles. Use as a condiment for eggs, chicken, fish, tomato dishes, potatoes, or mix into mayonnaise.

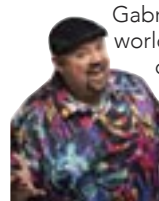
