The Hawaii International Film Festival was founded in 1981 as a platform to showcase films from the Asia-Pacific region, which were largely under represented in the global film industry at the time. The unique spirit of this festival stems from Hawaii's mid-Pacific locale, making it the ideal place for the East and West to meet and mingle with their creative pursuits. As one of the first film festivals focusing on the Asia-Pacific region, HIFF showcased films from countries like Japan, China, South Korea, and the Philippines, as well as from Pacific Islands like New Zealand and Hawaii. Throughout the 1980s, HIFF continued to gain recognition for its unique focus on Asian and Pacific Islander cinema, and today, it is one of the most prestigious and longestrunning film festivals in the United States that focuses on showcasing films from the Asia-Pacific region. It has also become a key venue for world premieres and the debut of films that went on to gain international recognition. This month, the 44th anniversary of the Honolulu International Film Festival returns with an outstanding line-up of films to choose from and expands its reach to showcase films on each of the six main Hawaiian islands.

HIFF has grown over the years into an important event in both the local and international film calendar, attracting filmmakers, industry professionals, and film enthusiasts from around the world. It's stretched from a single theater to an event that spans O'ahu and the neighboring islands, launched year-round film screenings, and grown to over 300 films annually. HIFF has come a long way since film reels arrived at the airport in boxes of hay, but it still connects strangers worldwide through the shared love of cinema and focuses on putting Hawaii films into the spotlight. An

incredible amount of care and dedication is put into the selection of films every year. It presents locals with a tremendous opportunity to see World, US, and Hawaii Premiere movies and mingle with some of the best filmmakers in the world.

"This year, we have the largest selection of Hawai'i films in competition in the festival's history, are presenting multiple films that explore Indigenous perspectives, narrative sovereignty, and the nurturing of cultural identity, and additionally, we are launching a new spotlight showcasing the best in television," said Beckie Stochetti, HIFF executive director.

HIFF lands on the island of O'ahu from October 3 – 13, featuring 114 shorts, 92 features, 40 world premieres, and 31 USA premieres. Given its location in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, HIFF is committed to seeking out globally produced films, especially films created by Hawai'i filmmakers that present the islands in a culturally accurate manner to international viewers. The festival then moves to West Oahu October 15-17 before heading to the neighbor islands.

The opening night film features the world premiere of Tina out of New Zealand. This inspiring and heartwarming drama is about a gifted vocal coach who finds herself at a crossroads as she is still struggling death of her daughter three years ago but needs to get out and find work. She reluctantly takes on the role of substitute teacher position at an elite, allwhite private school and is surprised to find children in desperate need of guidance, inspiration and love. Samoan actress Anapela Polata'ivao gives a brilliant performance in the role of the vocal coach. Don't miss this special night Pacific Showcase opening screening on October 3 at 7 p.m. at Kahala Consolidated Theatres.

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Holy Cow, I'm not sure how numbers like that are even possible, but it's true. In 1999, I had been asked by the Activities & Attractions Association in Maui to represent this new publication they had just started on Oahu. The timeshare market was exploding over there, and activities were finding their \$100 tickets were being bought in bulk by companies like Activity World, who used them to encourage people on the street to hear their timeshare speil. Who knew what a foreshadowing moment that was, LOL! It was a love-hate relationship for the activities. They wanted the visitors to buy their \$100 tickets for \$100, but the timeshare companies were buying so many of them. They decided to band together and reach out directly to the concierge to sell those \$100 tickets to the visitor before they ever ran into the timeshare guys.

The Maui magazine was doing so well that they decided to expand to Oahu, and in late 1998, The Oahu Concierge was born. They brought me on at the beginning of the year, and I was really starting to enjoy working on a smaller publication than I was used to and having so much contact with the reader. I came from Aloha Magazine, a glossy 100+ page publication that catered to repeat island visitors Our subscriber base was on the mainland or beyond, which had just shut down after 20 years, so I had some time on my hands. My deadline each month was at noon on the 15th. On October 15, 1999, my phone rang at 10 a.m., and I told my boss I wasn't quite ready yet but would be by noon. She told me they had just gotten out of a meeting. Instead of reaching the visitor in the hotel before they walked out onto the street, they were going to start focusing on reaching the visitor before they ever got onto the plane. They were going to shut down the magazine immediately. Without thinking, I asked her what she wanted for it, and I bought it that day. My first issue came out two weeks later, on November 1, 1999.

It's hard to believe that 25 years ago this month, such an impulsive decision would change my life and give me so much in return. What a ride it's been! Thank you all for being a part of it. Mahalo!

Concierge Events 101: A Reminder Course

How a Concierge Event Works

I hear some of you laughing now, 'Oh boy, here she goes again.' But you know, there continue to be new faces out there who don't know what concierge events are and others who don't take advantage of those invites. Maybe they think there's a catch. So, let's talk about the events.

Let's start with the basics for those of you that don't know. Concierge Events are FAMs, or familiarization tours. If it's a restaurant, they want you to taste their food and experience their service. If it's an activity, they want you to do it yourself. If it's a mall, they want you to know what they have on-site and bring you up to speed on what promotions they have going on. But let's be clear, they are not doing this solely out of the generosity of their hearts. There's a method to the madness. You can't sell what you don't know. If you're invited to a FAM, it's because they are looking to see more business from your property. They are hoping that if you like what you see, that you will then share the word and direct your guests their way when appropriate. The restaurants know your first obligation is to support the restaurants on your property. But most guests won't dine inhouse every day, so they are hoping when those guests reach out and ask your advice about where to go, that you are now knowledgeable enough about them to recommend them. Your role in this is crucial. Your recommendations can significantly impact their business.

There is no catch. I am inviting you to wine and dine for free. It may be for a full dinner or a lighter-tasting menu. It may or may not include drinks. You will only get a tab if you order something above and beyond what they offer. I will always share as much information as possible about what is, and is not included in my reminder email. No matter what, though, if I invite you to a restaurant, you must leave a tip for that server.

You're not required to recommend the place after an event, but if places don't see an increase in business after hosting you, we may not continue to see as many events. However, if you do like the place, please support them! Your support can lead to increased business for the companies, which in turn can lead to more such events in the future. Your positive experience can have a ripple effect, benefiting both them and you!



The selection of the Centerpiece film is always a key decision for HIFF organizers, as it reflects the festival's commitment to quality, diversity, and the celebration of cinema as an art form. This year, the committee chose Moloka'i Bound as its Centerpiece Presentation. The film, filmed in Hawaii by Director Alika Tengan and adapted from Tengan's own short film of the same name, follows the story of a wayward Hawaiian man paroled after years of incarceration. The man is committed to reconnecting with his family and rebuilding a relationship with his son but discovers acclimating to Hawai'i life is more difficult than he expected, and he tends to do all the wrong things for the right reasons. In trying to prove himself worthy of his family and native heritage, his is a story of reconciliation and redemption. See this film at the Hawaii Theatre on October 9 at 7:30 p.m.

The festival's newest section that spotlights the best in TV is gearing up to become a fan favorite. "The distinction between cinema and television has become increasingly blurred over the past two decades, particularly with the rise of streaming platforms," says Anderson Le, HIFF's artistic director. HIFF44 presents three programs that mark significant milestones in the television landscape as part of their newest showcase, Prestige TV Series Panorama. First up, the Hawaii Premiere of **Getting Lost**, a documentary about the hit TV show LOST that was filmed here on Oahu. Featuring interviews with most of the key cast members, it delves into how a quickly greenlit pilot turned into a groundbreaking TV series that became a part of our pop-culture and created a rabid fan community around the world. Those fans remain fully invested nearly 20 years later, as the documentary was fully financed through crowdfunding. A discussion will follow the screening "Losties" will love. Kahala Consolidated Theatre on October 11 at 8 p.m.

HIFF will also present an advance screening of the pilot episode of Hulu's **Interior Chinatown** by Academy Awardwinning New Zealand filmmaker Taika Waititi. Based on the National Book Award-winning novel of the same name, the show is a satire of Hollywood and the TV industry that spotlights themes of invisibility, assimilation, and immigration in the Asian American experience. The book's author, Charles Yu, and series

lead, Jimmy O. Yang, both receiving the HIFF Halekulani Maverick Award this year, will attend to discuss the adaptation from novel to series in a Q&A after the screening. Kahala Consolidated Theatre on October 13 at 8 p.m.

FX's Japanese set epic **Shōgun** rounds out this showcase with a special presentation of the first episode of this critically acclaimed series, which racked an unprecedented 25 Emmy Award nominations, and made history with a record 18 Emmy wins

including Outstanding Drama Series. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with co-creators and Maui residents Justin Marks and Rachel Kondo, who will also receive the HIFF Halekulani Maverick Award this year. Kahala Consolidated Theatre on October 10 at 8 p.m.

This year's closing night film features the world premiere of **Hakkenden: Fiction and Reality**. The part biopic, part fantastical tale (think The Princess Bride meets Lord of the Rings) of good versus evil is about legendary pulp writer Kyokutei Bakin, who spent a whopping 28 years writing one of Japan's greatest works, Nanso Hatomi Hakkenden. The film divides its story between the master writer's life and his novel about a group of warriors who, each carrying a magical prayer orb, embark on a harsh journey to

fight the curse laid upon the Satomi samurai clan during the late Edo period. Kahala Consolidated Theatre on October 10 at 7:30 p.m.

These are just a fraction of the films showcased this year, so be sure to head to their website for a detailed line-up of each film. Those on the West Side can choose from dedicated screenings at Consolidated Theatres Kapolei from October 15 to 17.

Tickets for all films are on sale now. Purchase them online, in person at the HIFF office on Waialae Avenue, or by phone at 447-0577. Prices are \$15 for the general public, \$13 for seniors, military, students, and children, and \$12 for HIFF members. 



Chef's Corner

HWFW Chef Brady Ishiwata Williams

Chef Brady Ishiwata Williams' grandmother Tomoko played a major role in his upbringing, so much so he named his first restaurant after her. Tomo Seattle has been such a success, the avant-garde Japanese bistro accumulated a waitlist 15,000 names long, before it even open. Brady, a self-taught chef, was named Executive Chef of Seattle's Canlis (yes, that Canlis) when he was only 28 years old and quickly earned one of the few four-star reviews ever awarded by The Seattle Times, was named Food & Wine Best New Chef 2018 and received a James Beard Award for Best Chef - Northwest

What is your first childhood food memory? My first childhood food memory was helping my grandmother, Tomoko, prepare Osechi Ryori, the traditional Japanese New Years Feast. My job was to fan the rice as it cooled and I never did it fast enough!

When did you decide to be a chef?

I decided to become to chef in my early twenties, after pursuing a professional ice hockey career. My grandparents owned a restaurant, and while I never thought I would follow suit, I caught the bug and started working my way through kitchens. My first restaurant job was working as a busboy there.

Who would you consider your mentor?

Carlo Mirarchi, of Roberta's and Blanca. He's a self-taught chef with incredible sensibility, intuition, and has the best palate I know. He also demonstrated taking the right things seriously, but not yourself.

Tell us about your training.

I don't have any formal training. I have the privilege to have worked for some incredible chefs in Los Angeles, Dallas, and NYC.

Describe your cooking style?

Simple and intuitive. It's not very structured or classical.

Where were you working before Canlis?

I was the Executive Sous Chef of Roberta's and two-Michelin-starred Blanca in Brooklyn.

Was the James Beard award life changing?

You try to not put too much stock in awards, but it was quite the surprise. I never expected to win, especially the first year of being nominated. I was in shock.

Most people wait a lifetime to open a restaurant to such acclaim and win amazing awards. Where do you go from here?

I just want to maintain a simple & sustainable life for myself and my family. Cooking for people gives me joy.

Tell us about the tattoos?

Some good decisions, some bad decisions. Every one is a story!

Your website is fun! Who did that?

My partner, Jessica, is behind so much of the creative direction of the restaurant. She and our designer wanted to get away from the traditional restaurant website, I think they did a great job. Check it out at tomoseattle.com.

Do you do many of these food festivals?

I'm fairly selective but my criteria begin with either: cooking with someone I want to cook with, or cook somewhere I really would love to go. More often than not, it's both.

What's on your must-do list while here?

I'm looking forward to being back on the island with my partner and our two-year-old daughter. We're going to spend a ton of time with my family that lives here (aunts, uncles, and cousins). I'm looking forward to eating at Side Street Inn, Ethels, Helena's and Eight Fat Fat Eight, and have a cocktail at Bar Maze.

Any chance of you showcasing aspects of those beloved Canlis recipes while here? Not this time. I did cook a dinner in 2018 at Senia that was a nod to Canlis Honolulu.

Is there anything else you'd like to share?

It's always such an honor to cook in Hawaii. I have the utmost respect for its culinary history and traditions, and can't wait to come back.



Tomoko's Chawanmushi

My grandmother, and the namesake of the restaurant, passed away recently at the age of 97. Since the restaurant's opening, and even long before it, I've served versions of her chawanmushi - or Japanese egg custard - as a course on our menu. It's the first dish she ever taught me to make and I grew up eating it for breakfast or as a part of osechi ryori, the traditional Japanese New Year's spread. The custard itself is quite traditional and you can add other traditional items, such as gingko nuts or shiitake mushrooms to the bowl before pouring the custard and steaming. We've made it very non-traditional over the years, adding everything from vinegared radishes to geoduck and uni. Whichever way it's served, I find

this dish subtly delicious and blatantly comforting, especially as the weather cools over the coming weeks. I hope you do too.

Ingredients 2 then boying flakes 1.14 tan say say say say

1 (5-inch) piece kombu

2 tbsp. bonito flakes 1 ½ tsp. mirin

1½ tsp. soy sauce 3 large eggs

Directions: Heat the oven to 325°. In a small saucepan, bring the kombu and 1½ cups water to a boil. Remove from the heat, remove and discard the kombu, stir in the bonito flakes, and let stand for 5 minutes. Pour the dashi through a fine sieve into a bowl and let cool. In another bowl, whisk the mirin and soy sauce with the eggs, then whisk in the cooled dashi. Divide the custard among four 6-oz. ramekins set inside a 9-by-13-inch baking dish, and set the baking dish in the oven. Pour enough boiling water into the baking dish to come halfway up the sides of the ramekins and bake the custards until set but still slightly loose in the center, about 30 minutes. Remove the baking dish from the oven, lift the ramekins from the water bath, and transfer to a rack. Let the custards cool slightly before serving.

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
