### April is Voluntourism Month in Hawaii

In 2018, Kanu Hawaii launched Volunteer Week Hawai'i as a local take on National Volunteer Week, which has been celebrated nationally since 1974. Since then, their initiative has become the most



extensive volunteer-focused campaign in Hawaii, and in 2022, Governor Ige signed a bill to recognize April as "Volunteer Month" or "Voluntourism Month" in Hawai'i beginning in 2023. The campaign, organized by Kanu Hawai'i, aims to promote and facilitate volunteer opportunities, encouraging residents and visitors to participate in community service and give back to work together to serve the communities.

Voluntourism is a combination of volunteering and tourism, where travelers participate in volunteer work as part of their vacation or travel experience. The goal of voluntourism is to contribute to a cause or community while exploring a new place. It offers an opportunity for travelers to give back, make a positive impact, and engage in cultural exchange, all while gaining personal fulfillment from the experience. Go Hawaii and Kanu Hawai'i have partnered to offer visitor-friendly volunteer opportunities, inviting guests and residents to give back during April.

The Hawaii Tourism Authority supports experiences developed by the community, for the community, and are things the community wants to share with visitors with its Mālama Hawai'i Program. "Mālama Hawai'i allows our guests to have a more meaningful experience with O'ahu and the local community," said Noelani Schilling-Wheeler, executive director of the O'ahu Visitors Bureau. "We hope that when our guests return home and reflect on their legacy, they

can with good conscience point to the activities they did on O'ahu, leave enriched by those activities, and take back the importance to mālama their communities."

The Mālama Hawai'i program will help us protect and preserve Hawai'i for the future and give travelers a more meaningful and enriching travel experience, inspiring them to participate in more purposeful activities during their trips and future stays in Hawai'i.

Several organizations offer opportunities for visitors to pay it forward, like beach clean-ups, native tree planting, and more. By participating, guests could qualify for a special discount or even a free night from their hotel when participating in its dedicated volunteer activity.

So, what does Volunteerism look like in Hawai'i? It can take on many shapes and sizes. But some of them tie in perfectly to your guest's vacation. For example, many visitors want to head out to Pearl Harbor while they are in town. Why not turn that activity into a volunteer experience as well? Guests are welcome to volunteer onboard the **Battleship Missouri Memorial**. In exchange for free admission, guests are asked to clean, sand, sweep, or paint the Mighty Mo. and the biggest National Volunteer Week celebration in the U.S.

## YOUR GUESTS NEED A FISHING LICENSE BEFORE THEY FISH

The waters of Hawai'i host more than 650 species of fish, so some of your guests may want to go fishing. Be sure to let them know about the fishing license requirement. Nonresidents age 15 and older who are fishing in ocean waters surrounding Hawai'i must first purchase a Nonresident Recreational Marine Fishing License. Active-duty U.S. military and their families are exempt. The cost is \$20 for one day, \$40 for seven days, and \$70 for an annual license. [fishing.hawaii.gov](http://fishing.hawaii.gov).



one's being. It's the most powerful vehicle ever to carry and preserve a culture through time, and most of all, it's fun for everyone, even those who aren't joining in the singing and dancing.

This month is the 18th Annual Waimānalo Kanikapila, the annual gathering of Hawai'i's best musicians, dancers, and entertainers held in memory of Cyril Lani Pahinui and his renowned father, Gabby Pahinui at Waimānalo Beach Park. The event honors their contributions to Hawaiian music and recognizes the musical heritage of the Waimānalo community.

Most of you should be aware of this legendary event, but here is a brief history lesson as there are new faces in the industry lately. In 2007, Cyril Pahinui put on the first Waimānalo Kanikapila, often called The Gabby, to pay homage to his late father, Gabby Pahinui. He designed it after gatherings he remembered from his childhood, when his dad's friends, many of whom were legendary musicians in their own right, would come over to the family's home on Bell Street in Waimānalo on the weekends for what would become a continuous kanikapila, often going on for days. If you are unfamiliar with the festival, take a moment to visit our website and look at the April 2024 issue. Last year, Cyril's wife Chelle was incredibly generous with her time, and Cyril's photo album, sharing the details of those early kanikapila days that people like you and I would never have heard of otherwise. It is one of my favorite articles ever run in the magazine of all time, and

it's worth the read if you haven't done so.

As in those days, the event attracts dozens of musicians and allows thousands of fans to witness genuinely unforgettable moments, outstanding performances, and all-star jams by some of Hawai'i's greatest musicians who get together to play music in the park. If your guests are interested in Hawaiian music, trust me when I say this is one of those not-to-miss events, and they will thank you forever for recommending it. There's no other place in the world where you can enjoy the best Hawaiian musicians and dancers doing what they do best in the beautiful beachside location under the shadow of the Ko'olau's. It is Hawaii personified and guaranteed to give you chicken skin.

About 80 musicians, dancers, and chanters have already committed to performing at the historic pavilion this year. As this is a kanikapila, you never know who might make a surprise appearance. Henry Kaponu, Kawika Kahiapo, Jerry Santos, George Kuo, Kata Maduli, Kawaikapuokalani Hewett, Mike Ka'awa, Pomaika'i Lyman, and Walt Keale are just a handful of names that have already committed to appear. Guests are encouraged to bring a blanket and grab some grass in front of the stage for an enjoyable day on Waimānalo Beach. Feel free to bring a suit, as the white sandy beach and ocean are just steps away, making it easy to jump in the water between sets or catch a tan with incredible music playing in the background.

Chelle says, "This year, we have been working with the City & County of Honolulu to complete the cultural Environmental and cultural impact studies, and the reconstruction of the Park Pavillion has been approved." The pavilion was dedicated to Gabby in 1960 by Mayor Frank Fasi, and it's been used to present this festival since its launch.

"Once the structure is rebuilt," she continues, "it will be rededicated to Gabby 'Pops' Pahinui, and we will again use it for future festivals. It's been a big effort, but we are finally getting there." Cyril was committed to the festival continuing and was instrumental in selecting the Nā'ālehu Theatre, non-profit to carry this event forward with support from their partnering organizations, Waimānalo Canoe Club, Friends of Waimānalo and Windward Community College, Henry Kaponu Foundation, Outrigger Resorts, Honolulu city and county Parks Department, Hawai'i Tourism Authority, Office of Hawaiian Affairs and others, and was

instrumental in selecting future T-shirt designs. Cyril also wrote a letter to the Parks Department that expresses his support for the improvements and his concern that the dedication plaque be included in the improvements as part of the recognition of the dedication to his father, Gabby "Pops" Pahinui, before he passed away. One could only hope that they include his name as well.

It is their intention that the Waimānalo Kanikapila festival will continue to be presented annually in April on the closest Saturday to Gabby's birthday on April 22 in perpetuity, to recognize not only Gabby and Cyril's contributions but to support everything that is Hawaiian music and kanikapila. The reconstruction of this pavilion is essential to the continuation of this event and the community as a gathering place for many other activities and events ranging from athletics to canoe paddling, craft workshops, Summer Fun programs, and other festivities. The comfort stations are particularly critical for these activities and general beachgoers and are publicly accessible to visitors to the community.

Although this event is best experienced live, fans may not always be able to attend. One of the only good things that came out of Covid is that they began to livestream the event. For those interested in following the all-day event tune into the live-stream on Facebook ([facebook.com/cyril.pahinui](https://facebook.com/cyril.pahinui)) or YouTube at [youtube.com/user/cyrilpahinui](https://youtube.com/user/cyrilpahinui).

Your attendance at the event and contributions by purchasing the annual T-shirt help them complete the musical heritage of Waimānalo alive. For example, when you head out to **North Shore Stables** to take part in their new oceanfront ATV Adventure, your experience includes learning about the native shoreline plants of Hawaii and the vital role they play in shoreline ecology to prevent erosion and naturally rebuild sand dunes while protecting against potential changes in sea level. Guests are invited to choose and plant a native plant on the shoreline to leave a positive impact on our fragile shoreline ecosystem during part of their tour. Getting guests to plant shoreline plants is part of their tour throughout the year

as part of their commitment to using Native Hawaiian plants to fight ocean erosion, not only during April. Pu'uiki Point Coastal Restoration & Native Plant Propagation is an ongoing volunteer opportunity that takes place multiple times throughout the month, where Volunteers will weed and clear areas of invasive species while replanting Native Hawaiian shoreline plants that build sand dunes, prevent erosion, and protect against sea level rise the way Mother Nature intended. Volunteer duties include plant and farm work that restores one mile of beachfront coastline with Native Hawaiian shoreline plants. No tools are needed. Garden or working gloves are provided. No transportation is provided, but guests can stop by on the way to or from the North Shore. Volunteering with the Mālama Hawai'i program at North Shore Stables is free. Volunteers do not receive any monetary pay for their volunteer work, but the location is beautiful, and the people there are completely committed to restoring the shoreline. RSVPs required. **Loko I'a Pā'aiau** is a 400-year old royal Hawaiian fishpond, located in the Kalauao ahupua'a in the 'Ewa moku on the mokupuni of O'ahu, is a beautiful reminder of the peace, healing, and lōkahi Hawai'i once had. This 6.34 acre loko kuapā, located in the Pa'aiau 'ili of the Kalauao ahupua'a, is listed on the National Historic Register. The sacred site welcome visitors for educational, healing, or volunteer work. Visits typically last 3 hours and consist of cultural protocol and a historical overview of the site. These are just a few of the countless opportunities that allow our visitors to see a slice of Hawai'i that they never would have been able to see otherwise and give back in the process. Lane closures begin at 12:30 p.m. for setup. The event will close Kalakaua Avenue, all traffic lanes/sidewalk areas, from Seaside Ave. to Liliuokalani Ave. from 1:30 p.m. so make sure you and your guests plan your travel time appropriately.

For those SPAM® lovers who just can't get enough, there will also be a dine-in promotion from April 20 to May 5. Twenty Waikiki restaurants will serve unique SPAM dishes on their menu. Many of the dishes are only available for the two-week event. Participating restaurants will also be announced on the website.



Waikiki SPAM JAM® is a fundraiser for the Hawai'i Foodbank and there will be two tents set up for canned goods and donations. The festival also donates to the Waikiki Community Center and the Visitor Aloha Society of Hawai'i. Last year, the festival raised more than \$49,000 for these organizations. ## Chef's Corner

### G. Lion's Executive Chef at the Ritz Mel Fogata

*Chef Mel Fogata is responsible for overseeing G. Lion's F&B program at The Ritz Carlton Waikiki including Quiora, Catering Events and opening its newest restaurant Solera. Solera is the new concept that has taken the place of the former La Vie Restaurant. Solera is where tradition meets innovation. Inspired by the solera blending method, a way of aging and blending liquids where older and younger batches are continuously mixed, the modern menu celebrates the fusion of global flavors and seasonal, farm-to-table ingredients, creating a dining experience with a true sense of place.*

#### What is your first childhood food memory?

Eating Love's white bread that was spread with butter and sugar and then toasted for breakfast with my brothers and cousins at my grandparent's house.

#### What made you decide to pursue culinary?

I was visiting Hawaii on summer break after finishing my first year of college, where I didn't do so well and had zero clue what I wanted to do for a career. My aunt suggested that I try the cooking field because I always had an interest in making desserts with her and my mom when I was younger. I attended an open house for a local restaurant school in Philadelphia and was hooked on thinking I could make a great salary as soon as I graduated lol.

#### What was your first job in the industry?

I was very fortunate to get an externship at the Four Seasons Philadelphia, under Chef Jean Marie Lacroix.

#### Favorite job and why?

In the kitchen, it would be butchering meats and fish. To me, it's a form of art that takes years to master and surprisingly a skill that not every chef is able to do well or even at all.

#### Who would you consider your mentor and why?

Chef Lou Boquila, chef owner of Perla Restaurant in Philadelphia. He's always been there for me through the highest of highs and lowest of lows. He doesn't sugarcoat things and has always been the voice of reason.

#### How important is local produce to you?

Extremely. Hawai'i grows amazing fruits and vegetables that are bursting with unreal flavor compared to what is being brought in from the mainland. We need to find a way to reduce our carbon footprint by supporting our local farmers, ranchers and fishermen.

#### When did you join G. Lion? What brought you there?

I joined in October 2024. I was drawn to their mission statement of creating memories through bespoke services and heartfelt aloha.

#### Can you name a meal you remember most and why?

My most memorable dinner to date has to be dining at Benu. The food, wine and especially the service went beyond expectations. They made us feel as if we were their only reservation for the night.

#### How to come up with your menus?

The inspiration usually starts from a dish that I recently ate or a particular ingredient that I saw or wanted to try or the shape/color of a plate or something seen in nature, etc. From there, the brainstorming and R&D'ing starts. We go through many tastings and iterations before the dish makes the menu or is put aside for another project.

#### What's your goal at Solera?

To be a restaurant that everyone comes to regardless of the day or occasion.

#### What's your favorite thing on the menu?

I have two favorites, the ahi kinilaw and the crispy pork belly from Mountain View Farms.

#### Describe your food philosophy and where you find your inspiration?

My food philosophy is to keep things simple, impactful and full of flavor. I draw inspiration from the people and cultures that I have been surrounded by.

#### What do you like to do most on your days off?

I spend most of my time with my parent's dogs Bella, Miki and Milo.

#### What our favorite place to go to when not working?

I like driving around and exploring the neighborhoods to find new places to eat. I love Yum Yum Pho in Aiea for their crispy spring rolls and build your own pho.

#### Is there anything else you'd like to share?

We'd love to see everyone at all three of our G.Lion restaurants Solera, Quiora and Hy's Steak House. And don't forget to visit our G.Lion Bakeshop online for custom made cakes and home baked goods.



### Johnny Cake Recipe

#### Ingredients:

7 g salt	6 oz sugar
1 cup whole milk	4 large eggs
6 oz cornmeal	10 oz All Purpose flour
6 oz unsalted butter, softened	21 g baking powder

**Directions:** Soak salt, milk and cornmeal for at least 30 minutes. While cornmeal is soaking, cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time and mix until incorporated. Sift together flour and baking powder then add to the creamed sugar and egg mixture. Mix until just combined. Add soaked cornmeal and mix until just combined. Heat a skillet over medium heat, add your cooking fat of choice. Add a 3 tablespoons of mix into pan. Cook over heat until golden brown on both sides. Transfer to a plate and finish with your favorite topping.
