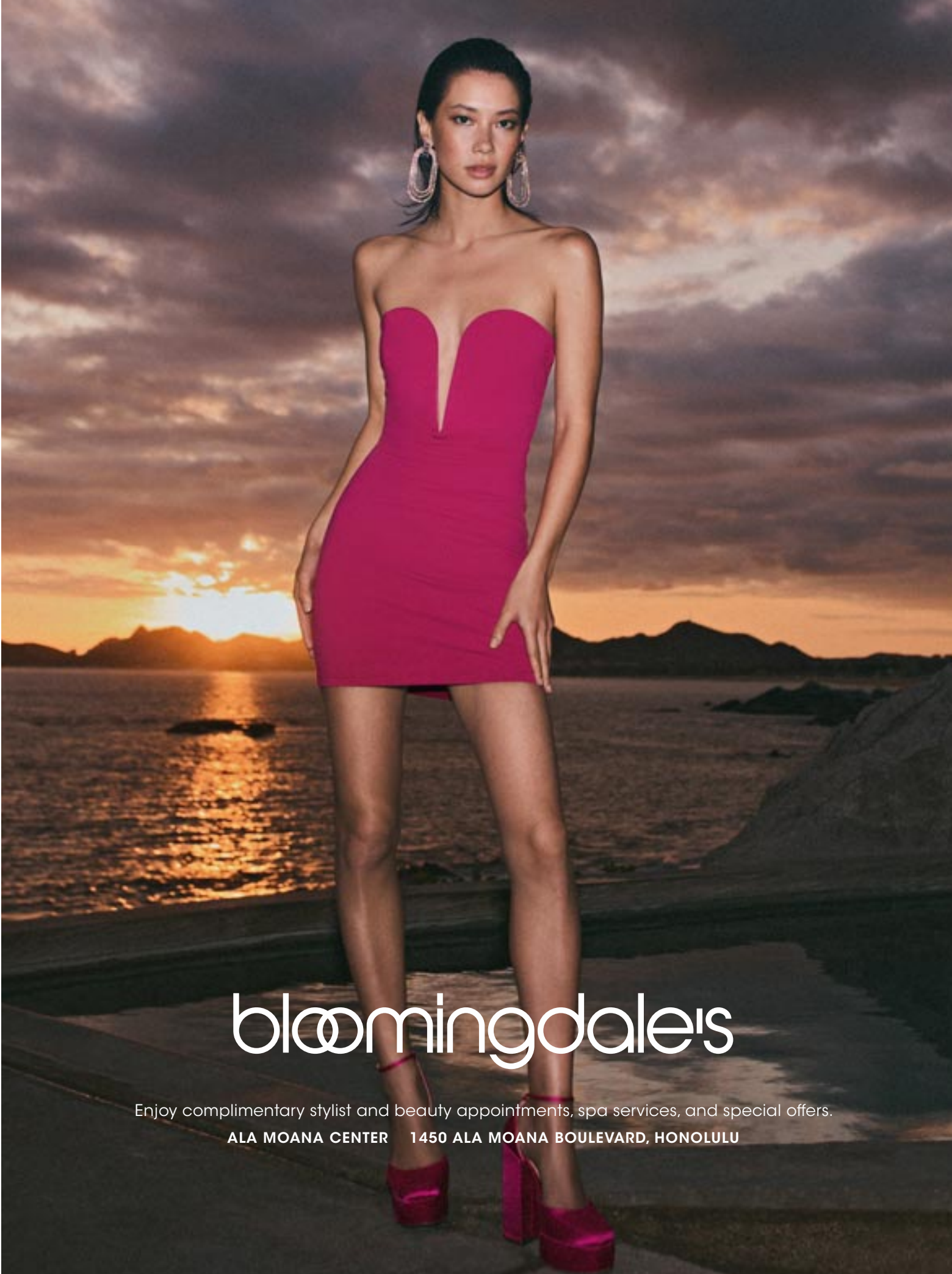

The beaches of Waikiki will be bustling with activity from August 19 – 27, as this community and cultural event brings back some of the more exciting events visitors can watch unfold. Still, a few changes are being made this year, starting with the name — introducing the Duke Kahanamoku Ocean Festival. Why did the name change after over two decades? The organizers decided it was time to rename and rebrand the event to expand and provide enhanced resources to Hawaii's youth and introduce Duke Kahanamoku and Hawaii to an even larger audience by increasing their reach even further. Additionally, the vision of the Duke Kahanamoku Ocean Festival is to focus on celebrating the life and legacy of Duke Kahanamoku and providing financial resources to Hawaii's youth with an opportunity to advance their education and sports careers with the support of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (ODKF)

The Duke Kahanamoku Ocean Festival Board of Directors said the following about the name change: "Recognizing the evolution and expansion of the watersports and lifestyle disciplines that continue to blossom locally and throughout the world as a result of Duke Kahanamoku's influence and Hawaii's powerful messaging to the mainland and internationally, the Board of Directors, a division of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, recognized the opportunity to expand the reach of the Waikiki based event and explore collaborations that go beyond sport and into the "Festival" genre ranging from

music, art, and food, all indigenous to Duke's and the Hawai'i lifestyle. This expansion will majorly impact the resources available for the scholarships and grants allocated each year through the ODKF."



So, although the name may be new and different, expect the same great week of fun in the sun for all to enjoy that you have all come to expect from this community and cultural event, including annual favorites such as

the Red Bull Party Wave. The Festival is a tribute to Duke's legacy with cultural events and competitions in surfing, swimming, canoe paddling, tandem surfing, water polo, surfing, hula, and Hawaiian music, and his influence on the core disciplines has inspired a new generation of athletes and activities ranging from paddleboarding, foiling, dog sur-fur's, Jr. Lifeguards, beach volleyball, and the infamous Party Wave. If you can only see one event, be sure to put this one at the top of the list. Entrants are challenged to build their own surf vessel, don costumes, and put on a skit on the beach before collectively paddling out and seeing which team rides the best wave on their homemade craft. Expect some crazy vehicles and even better wipe-outs. Another event on the must-see list is the Raising Cane's Going to the Dogs SurFur competition. The event started with four dogs and a

pig (remember Kama The Surfing Pig?) in 2015 and has grown to over 20 surfing animals in recent years, including cats and ducks. Both of these events always entertain.

The action continues beyond there. From non-stop beach volleyball action to tandem surfing to surfboard water polo and a wounded warrior canoe regatta, there will be 20 different events over nine days to keep locals and visitors alike with some of The Big Kahuna's favorite water activities, many with a new modern take.

New this year is the "Duke's Waikiki Waterman Challenge." This event features five teams of four members of Hawaii's elite water safety professionals. Each will compete in a relay format challenging each participant to showcase their skills and competitive spirit.

Before all of this, however, be sure to send your guests down to the Duke statue for the opening ceremony. Sponsored by Hawaiian Airlines, the event features live Hawaiian music, traditional hula, and the picture-friendly decorating of the Duke Kahanamoku statue with flower lei. This is one photo op visitors will want to take advantage of.

Most competitions and events occur at Queen's Surf on Kuhio Beach in Waikiki, a favorite surfing spot of Duke and home to the magnificent statue honoring his lifetime of achievements and furthering the Aloha Spirit. The events are all spectator friendly. There will be nearly 20 ocean and beach events, offering plenty of action to catch along Waikiki shores, and Duke's statue, covered in lei, makes it easy for visitors to figure out where to go. I went to a friends and family preview there right before it opened, and they nailed it! Don't forget, friends and family night is supposed to have all a restaurant's sympathetic pals around so they don't get mad at you

when you make a mistake because, let's face it, you don't know what's going to go wrong until you get going, but this place ran like a well-oiled machine – a beautifully renovated and delicious one at that. Chef's Corner

Celebrity Chef Martin "Yan Can Cook" Yan

Martin Yan was raised in a food/restaurant environment. In 1978 he was approached to do a cooking show and asked what he could do to encourage television audiences to watch the show. He said he needed to present dishes they could easily duplicate at home, saying, "If I can do it, anyone can do it," and thus the slogan, "Yan Can Cook, So Can You" was born. Hawaii is one of his favorite vacation spots, so he comes annually, and is thrilled to be a part of HFWF. Expect two classic dim sum items made with local ingredients.

Tell us about your first childhood food memory?

My father operated a popular neighborhood restaurant, and my mother managed a grocery store. So, I had a head start in the food business, surrounded by Chinese food and ingredients.

How did you learn how to cook?

When I was young, I recall helping my mom – accompanying her to the wet market to pick up fresh vegetables, helping to clean and prepare ingredients for her to cook. I got "private" cooking lessons in mom's tiny kitchen.

What made you decide to pursue culinary?

I grew up during the most turbulent times in modern China. Food was scarce and rationed. Most kids went to bed hungry. I told myself that I always needed to be around food so I would never be hungry.

What was your first job in the industry?

I was a kitchen helper in my uncle's Hong Kong restaurant. As a young boy without any skills, I was assigned to do the prep work. That's how I developed my knife skills at an early age.

Who's would you consider your mentor?

My parents taught me to come up with delicious meals using limited ingredients on hand. For TV, Julia Child was definitely my inspiration and mentor. I would always watch her cooking shows.

What was your 1st TV show and how long did it last?

The Yan Can Cook Show began in 1978, has never stopped producing – making it one of the longest continuous-running food and travel show in the television platform. Perhaps this is one of the reasons why I recently received the James Beard Lifetime Achievement Award in 2022.

You've hosted more than 3,500 cooking and travel shows?

For the past 40 years, we have traveled the world to bring Chinese / Asian cuisine and culture to the public television audience. The shows feature Asian cuisines and Chinatowns around the world.

Which one would you say was your favorite?

One of my favorite episodes was filmed in the middle of the Malaysian jungle in a tree house, cooking together with the owner. I would say that might be a "once in a lifetime" experience!

You were cooking on TV long before the Food Network, what are your thoughts on TV cooking shows?

Like any business and profession, things never stop evolving and growing. There are more networks putting out lots of funds to produce cooking-related programs. It's good for business. Shows, concepts and productions will continue to be better because of competition. In the end, it is great for the industry.

How many of these types of festivals do you do each year?

I love to cook – to share with people. Besides, these types of events bring together the top chefs who all share the same love and passion of food. I probably do more of these appearances than most chefs. I think I participate in an average of 20 to 24 such events each year worldwide.

What's on your must-do list while here in the Islands?

Hopefully share a dim sum lunch with some fellow chefs – like Roy, Alan, and Sam – enjoy Hawaii's local food and if there's extra time, get in the water and enjoy some snorkeling.

I hear you just opened a new restaurant in Las Vegas.

Yes! We recently opened my first Las Vegas restaurant. M.Y. Asia opened its doors this past March, located in the Horseshoe Casino, next to Paris Casino.

Is there any other information you'd like to share?

I have spent the last half century sharing my love and passion with millions around the world - through television, cookbooks, restaurants, as well as through personal appearances (both in person and virtual). Retirement has not crossed my mind. When you enjoy what you're doing, you never have to work a day in your life.



Rainbow Chicken Salad with Seasonal Fruits

This is a more contemporary version of the popular Chinese restaurant favorite, Chinese Chicken Salad.

Dressing Ingredients:

- ¼ cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sesame oil
- 2 tablespoons wild honey
- 1 teaspoon wasabi paste
- ¼ cup homemade mayonnaise

Salad Mix

- 6 ounces roasted chicken, shredded

Directions:

In a small bowl, combine dressing ingredients, whisk to emulsify. Set aside. In a large bowl, combine salad mix ingredients. Pour dressing over salad; toss to evenly coat. Adjust amount of dressing to your taste. Garnish with crispy wontons.

- 3 - 4 cups shredded iceberg lettuce
- ¼ cup julienned cantaloupe
- ¼ cup julienned honeydew
- ½ cup julienned red bell pepper
- ½ cup julienned cucumber
- ½ cup bean sprouts
- ¼ cup pistacho nuts
- ½ cup mixed fresh berries of your choice
- Deep-fried wonton pieces, for garnish

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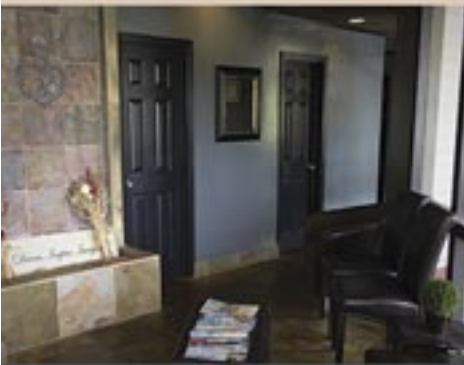


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HAWAIIAN SLACK KEY GUITAR FESTIVAL

Hawaiian musical traditions are alive and well in Waikiki, and our summer visitors are lucky to have so many festivals to take advantage of. Last month highlighted the ukulele and the steel guitar, and this month, we are fortunate enough to celebrate the 41st anniversary of the Hawaiian Slack Key Guitar Festival on August 12th at the Waikiki Aquarium.



Slack key guitar (known as ki-ho'alu) is a 191-year-old art form here in Hawaii, the fortuitous by-product of the cattle boom. You see Captain George Vancouver had gifted King Kamehameha I cattle in the late 1790s and encouraged him to place a 10-year ban on hunting them so the herd could grow. In the decades that followed the cattle flourished so strongly they turned into a dangerous nuisance. He lifted the ban in 1830, but it wasn't enough, so he hired cattle hunters from overseas to assist in the effort and teach native Hawaiians how to handle the overpopulation of cattle. Legend has it that Mexican and Spanish cowboys brought their guitars with them and entertained their new Hawaiian friends at night with this new instrument, but never took the time to teach the locals how to play, so Hawaiian's had to figure it out for themselves, and got it gloriously wrong. Trying to develop a way to get the most

sound out of the instrument, they came up with a way where the bass and rhythm chords are picked on the three or four lowest-pitched strings with the thumb, and the melody was played on the two or three highest-pitched strings.

They incorporated what they learned from the overseas guitarists into their own traditional songs and rhythms, devising their own tunings, which were a good deal looser than their mainland counterparts. Ki-ho'alu, which literally means "loosen the key," is the Hawaiian language name for this unique finger-picking style which is where the term slack key comes from. The strings (or keys) are "slacked" to produce many beautiful tunings, almost always based on a major tonality, and offers a full major chord, or chord with a major 7th or 6th note. Each tuning produces a characteristic resonance behind the melody.

The Hawaiian Slack Key Guitar Festival showcases some of Hawaii's foremost slack key guitar artists. This year Kawika Kahiapo, Ledward Kaapana, George Kuo, Brother Noland, and Darrell Aquino will be a few of the performers taking part in the 41st annual Festival held at the Waikiki Aquarium on August 12th from 5 – 9 p.m. Admission is \$20. International Market Place Launches New Audio Tour

The International Market Place has launched Waikiki's first GPS-enabled audio tour to share the area's rich history and promote cultural understanding through stories, sound and music.

The TravelStories app is available for download in English, Japanese and Hawaiian languages at no charge. Once downloaded, geotags will initiate sound bites at 20 of the location's architectural features while the visitor walks through the mall. These soundbites cover significant people, places or practices that have shaped the area's history.

The new audio tour replaces the center's inaugural cultural journey, which was a series of 25 plaques with historical facts located at landmarks throughout the center. Topics include the crucial role

of local streams, legendary International Market Place performer Don Ho and the history of the 60-foot banyan tree that once housed a radio station years ago. Listeners also will enjoy a peek into the life of Queen Emma - wife of King Kamehameha IV and queen of Hawai'i from 1855 to 1863 - who bequeathed much of her land in trust, including the IMP site, to support The Queen's Hospital that she and the King co-founded. Traditional Hawaiian melodies marked by steel guitar and 'ukulele, orchestral and ethereal ambient music enhance the journey. At some locations, sound effects include bubbling water that mimics the Waikiki springs, and seabirds.
