Held annually at the elite, membersonly Waialae Country Club, PGA's annual kickoff event - the Sony Open - gives golf fans the rare chance to sit on the sidelines and watch the world's best in action at this exclusive spot. For those who fancy themselves better than your average Sunday duffer, the Open also offers amateurs an opportunity to get in on the action and play a few holes as locals and celebrities haul out their clubs and flock to the greens to pit their swings against each other for prizes and bragging rights. The 2023 event marks the 25th anniversary of Sony's title sponsorship of the tournament and 2022 champion Hideki Matsuyama will return to defend his title January 9 – 15, 2023.

This is 57th year, the PGA Tour has competed at Waialae Country Club, making it the 3rd longest-running host course, and it is also the largest charity golf event in Hawaii. Sony is now tied foe the 3rd longest Title Sponsor on tour. Each year, 144 of the world's greatest golf professionals flock to the islands for this coveted trophy. This makes Waialae Country Club one of only 40 country club courses throughout the nation chosen to host a sanctioned PGA Tour event. One of the most international events on the PGA Tour schedule, the Sony Open

showcases the natural beauty of Hawaii to the world as over 560 million homes in some 216 countries turn on the Open to see the incredible line-up of golf professionals tackle the famous course.

Known as some of the state's most exclusive greens, the beautiful Waialae Golf Course was originally designed by the Territorial Hotel Co. with the idea to promote luxury travel in Hawaii. World renowned golf architect Seth Raynor teamed up with Charles Banks in the design and building of the course with several holes patterned after such famous courses as Biarritz in France and North Berwick in Scotland. The course opened on February 1, 1927, and its original mission has been maintained through numerous changes and improvements over the decades. Upgrades and additions including a club house, tennis courts, swimming pool, are a few of the many improvements that have been made through the years have culminated in the Waialae Country Club we know today. Waialae is unique because it challenges the low handicap player while not penalizing the high handicap player, and the rewards are high, with this year's total purse topping out at \$7.9 million!

On May 12, 2009, Lin-Manuel Miranda was invited to take part in White House Poetry Jam. According to the White House blog, the evening was to celebrate poetry, music, and the spoken word. "This event is designed around the theme of dialogue, showing how dialogue is important in every aspect of who we are as Americans and as human and demonstrating communication is a constant throughout the ages. A smash hit from day one, it quickly became a cultural phenomenon, and has been mesmerizing audiences around the world ever since. Now it's Honolulu's turn and the show is fabulous. His impact on the cocktail culture cannot be overstated, yet his success behind the bar was matched with humility and a display of the aloha spirit to all he encountered, and still quite visible at his 100th birthday party held at the hotels few years back. Cheers to you Mr. Yee! • Sadly, there is another passing to share, and that is of Angel Pablo, a longtime agent with Pleasant Holidays. Angel began his career in the hospitality industry as a singer with the Don Ho Show back in the 60s and was a regular presence at our events over the years.

HAWAII THEATRE DOCENT TOURS RETURN

After a long hiatus docent tours are back at the Hawaii Theatre Center, which is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. The hour-long docent prepared tour of the history, art, architecture, and restoration of the historic theatre built in 1922 is available every first Tuesday of the month at 11 a.m. Admission is \$10 and tickets are only available on the day of the tour. Special group tours can be accommodated, schedule permitting.

The content of the tour has been expanded to include an in depth look at the planning and building of the historic theatre by Consolidated Amusement, the island's largest theater chain. As your guests stand in the Will Call Lobby, they will learn that the construction of the building was delayed due to the Spanish Flu worldwide pandemic. The inspiration for the theater was the Shubert Theatre in New York City and designed by Walter Emory and Marshall Webb, who used elements of Neoclassical and Beaux-Art architecture.

At the Inside Lobby, visitors will be instructed to find the recurring pattern in the carpet and drapes: the pineapple, which is a symbol of hospitality that was re-introduced when the building underwent restoration. Guests will visit the Weyand Room on the second floor which is across from the two bar stations where they will learn of its history and the

stories of the paintings along its walls. The docent journey continues to the Loge where your guests will learn that tickets in 1922 for this section cost \$1.50.

The docent tour then takes visitors to a room that most regular theater goers to do not have access to, The Producer's Lounge, which is a private area for special guests. The remainder of the tour takes place in the Orchestra section, where your guests will get to peek inside the Governor's Box and the Magoon Box situated on either side of the stage and learn the vast history of the theatre from its early days showing silent films and vaudeville acts through World War II until the building's fall into disrepair and resurrection by a group of community activists and volunteers, who ultimately became the Hawaii Theatre Center, the non-profit which runs the theatre today.

For those of you familiar with the docent tours of the past, the theatre organ is currently being renovated and scheduled to be back in service in mid-2023, so the tours currently do not end with an organ performance, but with a full schedule of musical, dance and cinematic performances this year and next, you should have no trouble finding them something to see to enjoy the theatre when all the magic happens on stage. THE YEAR OF THE RABBIT BEGINS JANUARY 23, 2023



With all that money up for grabs, the golfers are not the only beneficiaries at the Sony Open which is the largest charity event held in Hawaii. \$23 million has been Hawaii non-profits to date, benefiting over 350 local charitable organizations since 1999. Sponsored by the Friends of Hawaii Charities, Inc. and partnered with The Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, each swing at the Sony Open generates funds for qualifying not-for-profit endeavors in Hawaii benefiting its women, children, the elderly, and needy, primarily in the areas of intervention, health and education.

Tournament week tees off Monday, January 9 with a Hawaiian blessing and pro-am events. Free admission on Monday and Tuesday, January 9-10. The Official Pro-Am will tee it up at Waialae on Wednesday, January 11. Official PGA TOUR competition rounds are scheduled Thursday through Sunday, January 12-15.

Daily admission tickets are \$30 and are available online now at www.sonyopeninhawaii.com and will be available at the gate during tournament week. Season badges are \$90 (good for weeklong admission) and a few Sweet 16 Chalet Hospitality Passes starting at \$250-\$275 (depending on day) are still available.

Parking is always a challenge, so your guests best bet is to hop on the Waikiki Trolley Blue Line to get back and forth from Waikiki. The Blue Line ticket is \$30 per adult, but if your guests purchase their Sony Open ticket from the Waikiki Trolley for \$30 their Blue Line round trip ride is free. Tickets can be purchased at our Ticket Booth at the Waikiki Shopping Plaza daily from 9 a.m.- 5 p.m. The trolley begins its run at the Ilikai Hotel at 8:20 in the morning. Pick up locations are listed on their website at waikikitrolley.com. If your guest does insist on driving they will need to park in one of two designated public parking areas at Hunakai Park on Monday - Sunday and a secondary lot at Kahala Community Park from Thursday through Sunday to handle the overflow. A complimentary shuttle will take people to and from the parking lots to the tournament.

Remember the Sony is extremely strict about what can and cannot be brought into the tournament, read the rules online before heading out. For more information about the rules, the players involved or to purchase tickets, head to sonyopeninhawaii.com.

Chef's Corner

planted by La Tour Chef Christopher Gee

Christopher Gee is the Corporate Chef /Partner for La Tour Café. A local boy who has worked for the company for the past nine years, he and his partners have been watching how customers knowledge have changed about food. Customers are more educated about what they eat & are looking for healthier options, so he has been working for the past year to create a completely plant-based menu they just launched at their Aina Haina location. His favorite items? The Planted Teri Burger and Mushroom Dip.

What is your first childhood food memory?

As a toddler, when sick, I used to have a small bowl of steamed rice with Spam and a small bowl of saimin. So simple, but oh so comforting!

What made you decide to pursue culinary?

What made you decide to pursue culinary? I'm a 3rd generation Culinarian. At first, I didn't plan on it, but it's funny how the "family business" draws you back in.

When did you decide you wanted to be a chef?

When I was in my early 20s, I was working in restaurants while going to college and never left. In fact, after college I headed straight for cooking school.

What was your first job in the industry?

My first paying job was working the garde manger at Auntie Pastos Kapahulu back in 2000.

Where were you before this?

I worked all over the mainland but most notably Chez Panisse in Berkeley, CA. Most recently prior to La Tour Cafe the co-founder of a popup restaurant called "Miso & Ale."

Who would you consider your mentor and why?

My Dad...He taught me what good food should taste like through his cooking, lots of eating excursions all around Asia & the US.

If you could have anyone dine at your restaurant, who would it be?

My Grandfathers. My Grandpa Gee was the chef/owner of a Chinese restaurant outside of LA back in the 50's and 60's and my Grandpa Young was a military chef in WWII and a saucier at the Ilikai Hotel in the 60's & 70's. They both passed on before they could see me "make my bones" in the Culinary industry. I always wanted to make them proud.

How would you describe your style of cooking?

Hmmm... My cooking style, I would have to say, is varied. I was trained in classical French and California cuisine and techniques, but love my Asian ingredients.

What made you decide to make this location completely plant-based?

Our Aina Haina Cafe is our smallest of the bunch and in an area where trying out new concepts is easier to introduce rather than our larger cafes.

What's behind the concept of planted?

We wanted to do what we do in our other cafes but on a plant-based level.

What makes your menu unique?

Ironically, I think the menu comes off very familiar. Though we are plant-based, the flavors, textures, and even aromas are familiar to its meat-based counterparts.

How did you create the menu?

We wanted to make our menu approachable and familiar locally to our customers.

How long did it take?

It took over a year of testing and development.

What can you tell us about how you came up with the menu? I heard there were no nuts, etc?

Yes, there are no nuts or nut-based products on our menu. We use non-GMO pea and soy protein in our menu items. I myself have a nut allergy so developing everything off of that premise was key, because of the commonality of nut allergy in our community.

Will you be making the other La Tours plant-based?

No, the current La Tour Cafes are not going to be plant based; however, we will be increasing our plant-based footprint in each cafe by adding a little more variety. Also, we are planning a new planted by La Tour Café in Kaka'ako in late 2023.

What do you have in planned for the menu?

We actually have two more phases coming. The 2nd phase is to launch plant-based quarterly specials, and 3rd phase is plant-based pizzas.

What do you like best about farmer's markets?

What is amazing is that you can find out the history of where your food came from and what was used to grow or make the item you're eating. You can't do that in a supermarket.

Plant Based Vietnamese Heirloom Tomato Salad



Ingredients:

1/4 cup sugar ¼ cup plant-based fish sauce

1/4 cup lime juice

1 small red onion, julienned

1.5 lbs Heirloom Tomato, sliced 6 each cilantro sprigs

1/4 cup sunflower seeds

1/4 cup fried shallots 4 oz. Japanese Cucumber, sliced black pepper to taste garnish with microgreens


Directions: Place sugar, fish sauce, lime juice, and 1 Tbsp. water in a jar. Cover and shake dressing vigorously until combined and sugar is

A brand-new food destination and full-service grocery store in the heart of Waikiki will open to the public on Wednesday, January 11. Waikiki Market, is located on the second floor of the Līlia Waikīkī on Kuhio

Waikiki Market is owned and operated by the Food Pantry. It's first store opened in 1960 in the exact location it is re-opening in now. Food Pantry opened to serve the growing number of visitors and residents in Waikiki. It was an integral part of the community and operated for nearly 60 years before it closed in 2019 to allow for the construction of Līlia Waikīkī to begin.

Now that the new mixed-use development is about to open, Food Pantry, Ltd. should return to its former home. The Waikiki Market will feature a full-service grocery store, offering a variety of grocery items, including meat, seafood, bakery, deli, and produce items. The store also offers a great selection of locally-grown and made products, wine, beer, spirits, specialty food items, gifts, flowers, and lei.
