

Beyond Van Gogh: An Immersive Experience opens July 2nd at the Hawaii Convention Center

Have you looked at a masterpiece and envisioned yourself inside of it? For some people, simply taking in a piece of art through their eyes isn't enough. They feel that art must be interacted with, experienced. Now, thanks to the brilliant minds at Montreal's Normal Studio, you can. Their extremely successful exhibit, "Beyond Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience," has been taking the country by storm, and Honolulu is their next stop.

Normal Studios is world-renowned for using cutting-edge technology to reimagine what's possible to transform urban spaces into immersive, multi-sensory, and interactive installations. their French-Canadian Creative Director Mathieu St-Arnaud, says when they talked about making this experience, they wanted to "go beyond Van Gogh and meet Vincent, the man behind the vision." To accomplish this, they decided to create an experience where the audience is invited to step beyond the frame and enter Vincent's world and his vision, seeing things through his mind, and walk around inside the actual paintings, seeing them from a new perspective. After people went through their first exhibit, he says they were coming up to him saying they had never seen Van Gogh's works this way. People were saying that they had rediscovered his work, and this exhibit became a very personal and emotional experience for them.

"Beyond Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience" features more than 300 of the iconic painter's masterpieces presented through a three-dimensional lens in ways never experienced before. His art comes to

life by appearing and disappearing, flowing across multiple surfaces, and heightening the senses with their immense detail.

The exhibit is pure cinematic art. The artist's own words are set to music as his dreams, thoughts, and words provide the narrative for guests as they move along projection-covered walls wrapped in light. Swirls of sound and explosions of color surround you, moving up and down, refocusing into flowers, cafes, and landscapes, giving the viewer a new appreciation of this tortured artist and effectively placing them inside the art.

The exhibition allows one to step into Van Gogh's works of art and learn more about his life, personality, and inspiration. The exhibit takes one through his history first before stepping into his artwork. Next, the art is projected from the walls to the floor, coming alive as cherry blossoms flutter through the air via projection, clouds float across the room, and eyes blink on the self-portraits. In the end, there's a gift shop loaded with a variety of Van Gogh merchandise, from bags to puzzles to face masks and more.

The immersive Van Gogh craze is currently sweeping across America. According to Artnet News, there has never been a phenomenon like this before that they can remember, and there are nearly 50 "Immersive Van Gogh" exhibits running or planned in the U.S. They say, "Maybe it's the enduring popularity of the Dutch artist. Maybe it's the hunger for in-the-world experiences after a year of quarantine. Maybe it's that one scene in Emily in Paris... but

wraps up their spring showcase

HIFF wraps up its spring showcase with the fourth and last mini-festival from July 8 - 18th. Featuring the newest short and documentary films presented by a diverse delegation of filmmakers and artists, Vive Le Cinema will focus on French cinema. From the latest French comedies to mini-sidebars on French auteurs, this showcase will celebrate the rich history of French cinema and its impact on the world.

A few of the films showcased will include "Mandibles" by internationally acclaimed director Quentin Dupieux ("Deerskin," "Rubber"). "Mandibles" is a wild and surreal road movie that follows simple-minded friends Jean-Gab and Manu. When they find a giant fly trapped in the boot of a car, they decide to train it in the hope of making a ton of cash. The film is an utterly unique comedy about friendship, big dreams, and more significant disasters.

The festival will also premiere "Josep." This movie is about a dying gendarme who recalls his encounter with the Catalan artist Josep Bartolí in a French concentration camp after the Spanish Civil War. An evocative portrayal of art and war, "Josep" won Best Animated Film at the recent César Awards.

The 2020 French comedy, "My Love, my Donkey, and I," follows Antoinette, a school teacher who has been looking forward to her long-planned summer holidays with her secret lover Vladimir, one of her pupils' father. However, when she learns that Vladimir cannot come because his wife organized a surprise trekking in the Cévennes National Park with their daughter and a donkey to carry their load, Antoinette decides to follow their track by herself on a very stubborn donkey.

ROCK-A-HULA'S WAIKIKI LUAU CLOSED FOR MONTH OF JULY

HAWAII NAUTICAL DROPS SCUBA DIVING FROM TOURS



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Chef's Corner

Celebrity Chef Michael Mina

Michael Mina's culinary journey began in 1987 at the Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park. During those 18 months of formal schooling, he spent his weekends sharpening his talents in Charlie Palmer's kitchen at upscale Aureole in NYC. Chef Mina's culinary and business vision led to the founding of The MINA Group, with partner Andre Agassi in 2002 and has over 30 different restaurant concepts today.

Congrats on reopening, any changes to expect? We will return with our signature items but will introduce new Japanese-inspired dishes to our menu. We will also be evolving our cocktail and wine programs to the next level.

Can we expect you on island for the reopening? Absolutely! I have a house here & truly consider this my second home. I can't wait to spend time in one of my favorite places for this reopening!

How did your restaurants handle the pandemic? It's been a very tough year for all of us across the industry. We were devastated to close the restaurant due to the pandemic but at the same time, were so proud to be able to offer meals to our furloughed employees via our MINA Family Meal program. It feels amazing to be able to reopen to the community and we've been very fortunate to welcome back a large majority of our team to the restaurant.

Are you confident in the industry's resurgence? Absolutely. It's apparent that the restaurant industry has experienced adversity but as a collective, we are the most resilient group of people and are accustomed to continuously evolving and adapting. If there's one industry that can overcome a setback, it's hospitality.

You're a guest judge on MasterChef this season. What do you think about TV chef craze?

I was so excited to be on MasterChef and to see the amazing up-and-coming talent of these aspiring chefs! Many people don't know that I'm actually quite shy – so the appearances aren't the most natural for me - but I do think that this has been an amazing era overall for shining a light on the talent in our industry.

What was your first job in the industry?

I was a prep cook at a family friend's restaurant.

Who would you consider your mentor and why Chef Charlie Palmer. Working for him shaped me and he's a close friend & mentor to this day.

Is tennis star Andre Agassi still your partner?

It's been a blessing to have Andre as a partner and our company wouldn't exist without him. He's still involved with MINA Group to this day.

Tell us about your early food memories.

I grew up in a Middle-Eastern household in the US with my parents hailing from Egypt. There were always a lot of people at meal periods and food and eating was such an important part of our social experience. The table was laid out all day with some of my favorite foods. We would spend hours there, talking, laughing, arguing and most important of all, connecting. Middle-Eastern food is very bold in flavor with rich spices and a wide variety of vegetables and fruits forming the backbone of the cuisine. The mixture of spices, acidity & sweetness ensured my palate was trained at a very young age.

Describe your food / leadership philosophy.

My team at MINA Group are what inspire me daily. It's all about community for me and I take this approach to my cooking and the way I operate the company.

There's a lot of restaurants struggling out there these days after COVID. Any words of advice?

The comeback is greater than the setback! The hardest periods in my life are where I've grown the strongest

What's next for you?

Reopening our restaurants and bringing our team back together is my main priority, but we have some very exciting openings coming up in Seattle and Marin County - with more to come!

Truffled Mac and Cheese



Truffled Cheese Sauce:

4 tbs unsalted butter 2 tbs black truffle peelings, such as La Truffière from jar, drained &

6 tbs all-purpose flour 3 cups chicken stock

 $2 \text{ tbs} + \frac{1}{4} \text{ tsp Kosher salt, to taste}$ 1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper 1/4 teaspoon of Kosher salt

Ingredients for Mac and Cheese:

1 cup Parmesan cheese finely grated, divided

1 cup sharp white cheddar cheese, roughly grated, divided 1 cup Asiago cheese, roughly

grated, divided 3 ½ cups elbow pasta

Sauce Directions: In a medium saucepan, melt butter over medium-low. Add diced truffle peelings; stir. Whisk in flour one tablespoon at a time, letting mixture become smooth before the next addition, creating a thick, smooth paste. Add chicken stock and bring to a simmer. Whisk until mixture is thick enough to coat a spoon. Add 2 tablespoons salt and the black pepper. Remove from heat and pass through a fine mesh strainer into a bowl to eliminate lumps. Reserve. Mac & Cheese Directions: Cook elbow macaroni in well-salted water until al dente according to package directions. Rinse lightly, drain and reserve. Preheat oven to broil. In a large pot, heat the Truffled Cheese Sauce over low heat, simmering until hot (do not boil). Add cooked pasta and raise heat to medium-low. Add 7/8 of the measurement of each of the grated cheeses and stir to incorporate well. Transfer mixture to a shallow, oven-proof serving dish. Sprinkle remaining grated cheeses on top. Place in broiler and brown the top layer of the Mac and Cheese until bubbling and golden-brown. Serve immediately. NOTE: Truffled Mac and Cheese can be prepared through step 6 up to 5 days in advance and kept, refrigerated. To reheat, warm in a pre-heated 375° oven for 25-30 minutes until warmed through.

With more than 40 years of experience leading the kitchens of awardwinning restaurants, Chef Epié is known for his modern French cooking with bold American and international accents, and is the youngest chef to receive a Michelin Star at only 22 years old. turtlebayresort.com.

whatever it is, the hunger to venture into a giant animated projection of a Van Gogh painting is real, and it's everywhere." No fewer than five different exhibits are currently dueling it out across the map for supremacy in the Van Gogh space.

Walking through the exhibit lends itself perfectly to social distancing, so patrons have space to feel the art and absorb the experience. Off-Peak tickets are being sold for Mondays thru Thursdays at \$34.99 for adults and \$18.99 for kids. Fridays thru Sundays and holidays will be considered peak times, and tickets cost \$44.99 per adult and \$22.99 for kids.

Tickets are sold for specific entry times in 15-minute intervals, and patrons are allowed one hour inside the exhibit. For visitors who wish to spend 2 hours inside the exhibition premium tickets are available for \$61.99, and VIP Packages that give patrons 2 hours plus a merchandise bundle and available for \$89.99. Keep in mind tickets went on sale in late May, and the first two weeks sold out almost instantly, so if you or your guests are interested in seeing this exhibit, book your time slot soon. 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
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
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












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
