

## Celebrating the Art of Hula



The Prince Lot Hula Festival returns July 20 to the Frank Fasi Municipal Grounds.

Hula is a vital part of Hawaiian culture. It is more than just a dance; it's a storytelling art form that conveys the Hawaiian people's history, mythology, and traditions through graceful movements and gestures. The 'oli, or chant, tells stories about myths, births, deaths, love, prayers, battles, or rituals, which the Hawaiian people celebrate as often as possible.

The festival is the largest non-competitive hula event in Hawai'i. It honors Prince Lot Kapuaiwa for his strength and vision in reprising the once-forbidden hula in Moanalua. Prince Lot later reigned as King Kamehameha V.

The festival was founded in 1978 by the Moanalua Gardens Foundation and attracts more than 15,000 visitors and residents yearly. Noted historian, musician, composer, dancer, and lecturer Nalani Olds and her cousin, esteemed Hawaiian historian Wendell Silva envisioned Moanalua Gardens as the ideal venue for celebrating Hawaiian culture through hula because of the rich history held within the ahupua'a. On July 22, 1978, the first festival took place on its grounds, using a wooden stage constructed for the performances. In 1981, a pa hula (hula mound) was created using soil excavated from an area within the gardens in the 1970s to construct the Moanalua Freeway.

Visitors love the event, where casual

seating on beach towels or mats is welcome, and there is plenty of shade. The festival has since moved locations twice from Moanalua Gardens, but it was never about the location – as vital as it was to launch there. It has always been about the love of the art for the dance, and the thousands of people who flock to the festival each year can attest to that. But it's not only the attendees, kumu hula Michael Pili Pang says, "The annual Prince Lot Hula Festival brings together our hālau once a year to celebrate all that hula has to offer; its an opportunity to share our hula and come together as a hālau ohana."

Well, get ready to share in the beauty. On July 20, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., head to the Grounds of the Frank Fasi Municipal Building as twelve of Hawaii's award-winning hula hālau gather to present hula in honor of Prince Lot and for the love of the dance.

The event also honors the legacy of oli. Chant has been passed down through generations. The audience should get ready to witness truly great hula and music. The hula is both kahiko, ancient, and 'auana, modern. Each hālau may present their hula with only a few dancers or as many as fifty dancers. Like the Merrie Monarch Hula Festival, many of Hawaii's finest musicians are there to play for a favorite kumu. The list of kumu hula

## Twice the Ukulele Fun

The ukulele is a delightful instrument that has gained a considerable following in Hawaii and worldwide. It's compact, easy to carry, and has a cheerful, bright sound. It's also relatively simple to learn, making it a popular choice for beginners and experienced musicians. Many musical icons have adopted this beloved mini guitar over the years, such as the Beatles, Elvis Presley, Taylor Swift, Cyndi Lauper, and Billie Eilish even sells her own branded version through Fender. But long before all those superstars picked up the instrument, the ukulele has been revered in the Hawaiian Islands. Portuguese laborers introduced a guitar-like, four-string instrument to the islands in the late 1800s, later evolving into the ukulele we know today. Hawaiian Ali'i featured the ukulele at royal events and integrated it into the culture, inspiring Hawaiians to pick up the instrument themselves, and the rest, as they say, is history.

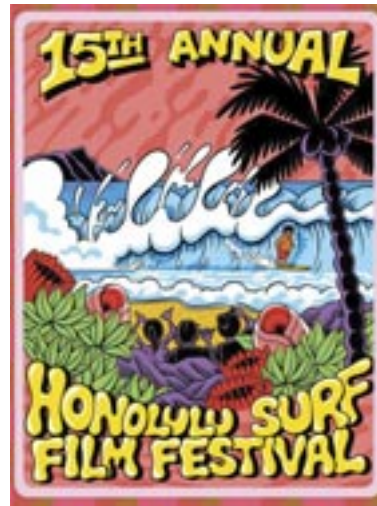
## The Honolulu Surf Film Festival Rolls In

Surf's up on the South Shore, and the Honolulu Surf Film Festival is dropping in. The festival will showcase the best in global surf cinema at the Doris Duke Theatre from July 11 to August 4 as the Honolulu Museum of Art celebrates surf culture and filmmaking at the annual Honolulu Surf Film Festival.

The 15th annual film festival kicks off with an opening reception and screening of **The Shape of Things: The Dick Brewer Story** on Thursday, July 11 at 6 p.m. The film chronicles surfing's "da Vinci of design" and dives into Brewer's somewhat mysterious and rollercoaster life at the forefront of a burgeoning surf culture in the 1960s and 70s. The reception in Luce Pavilion starts at 6 p.m. and includes live music by Men in Grey Suits, a buffet dinner at the HoMA Café, and a cash bar.

**The Shape of Things** screens at 7:30 p.m., followed by a post-screening talk story. Doors open for film-only ticket holders at 7:15 p.m. Tickets are \$45.

Mark your calendars for the month-long festival featuring films that explore



the history and future of surfing. Some films include **The Road to Patagonia**, a stunning and intimate documentary of a surf journey from Alaska to the tip of Patagonia on July 13 and 18. **Wave Warriors**, a newly restored 1980s classic, captures the era's greats on the waves at Sunset and Pipeline on July 27 and August 2. **Surf Like a Girl 2024**, an empowering program of films

showcasing global women in surf on July 26, and **Maya and the Wave**, which follows Brazilian surfer Maya Gabeira, who makes history in the male-dominated world of big wave surfing after a brush with death on July 12.

The Festival wraps up on August 4 with a special afternoon screening of Bud Browne's **Locked In!** followed by a talk story panel featuring surfing luminaries from different generations.

## KAPOLEI COMMONS EXPANDS RETAIL & DINING OPTIONS



July brings you not one but two Ukulele Festivals, offering even more opportunities to appreciate this beloved instrument and enjoy some of the islands and world's best on stage performing their magic.



First, the 2nd annual Hawai'i Ukulele Festival, a celebration of all things ukulele, returns on Sunday, July 14, at the Kapiolani Park Bandstand. When Roy Sakuma Ukulele Festival Hawaii called it quits in 2022 after 52 extraordinary years of celebrating this beloved instrument each summer, Amy Hammond of Special Events Hawai'i, a leading event planner who has put on such signature events as the Made in Hawaii Festival for years, and is the co-chair of the King Kamehameha Celebrations. Amy is a former student of Roy Sakuma, recognized the need to continue a summertime ukulele festival. She partnered with Kala Foundation, a non-profit dedicated to Hawaiian culture, language, hula, music, and spiritual preservation, and together, they created a new inclusive festival, focusing on local performers, the instrument itself, and cultural activities, giving the infusing the Festival with education, history, and Hawaiian culture. Last year's inaugural Festival was a success, and it returns this year with even more to share.

Ukulele enthusiasts will love this free event as some of Hawai'i's top 'ukulele entertainers, including Kris Fuchigami, Kalei Gomiao, Corey Fujimoto, Micah Kane, Ku'ipo Kumakahi, and more to the stage throughout the day. There will also be a Hawai'i Artisans and Crafters Village, a multi-ethnic food court, and various ukulele merchants.

Attendees can browse through community information booths and 'ukulele-inspired merchandise ranging from gifts, books, apparel, jewelry, and art, a Hawaiian cultural activities zone, and more. Discover the cultural significance the 'ukulele plays as Hawai'i's ambassador of Aloha and take advantage of this opportunity to meet and engage Hawai'i's local 'ukulele community from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Go to [hawaiiukulelefestival.com](http://hawaiiukulelefestival.com) for details.

Two weeks later, head back to Kapiolani Park as the Ukulele Picnic of Hawaii celebrates its 15th anniversary by renaming its annual signature event and moving it to a new location and time. The event began in 2009 when Kazuyuki Sekiguchi, a renowned Japanese musician from the Southern All Stars band, launched the "'Ukulele Picnic in Hawai'i" to unite people through 'ukulele. Even though he is the bassist for one of Japan's most successful rock groups in history, he is known for his love of Hawaiian music when he performs as a solo artist. He was the pioneer behind the 'ukulele music scene in Japan for years before founding the annual picnic, which he created to bring professional ukulele musicians from around the world together with thousands of ukulele lovers across the globe.

"In commemoration of our milestone 15th anniversary," said Sekiguchi, "we have decided to rename our event to the "International Ukulele Festival of Hawai'i to further our mission of fostering stronger ties to the local community and spreading a message of Aloha from Hawai'i to the world." The Festival moved from a springtime to a summer event and is now happening in Kapiolani Park.

The year's event will feature an international slate of performers, including Raiatea Helm, Jake Shimabukuro, Kala'e Camarillo, Mika Kane, Jody Kamisato, Crossing Rain, Craig & Sarah, Cynthia Lin, Ukulele All Stars and Tomoki Suzuki, Nine Ukulele Jazz Orchestra, as well as keiki performances. Ukuleles will be displayed at booths by famous 'ukulele makers from Hawai'i and a unique collection of vintage ukuleles from the State Archives. The event is on July 27 from 9:30 a.m. – sunset. # SUNSET ON THE BEACH

is back

The best way to watch a movie in Waikiki returned in June, as Sunset on the Beach returns to Queen's Beach for a limited series of monthly screenings.

For those unaware of the history, Sunset on the Beach began in 2001 after former Honolulu Mayor, Jeremy Harris, sought to increase community activities and the Waikiki economy. Constructing a 30-foot screen on Queen's Beach in Waikiki, the city began to offer free movie screenings on the beach at sunset, with plenty of family-friendly events, live music, games, and food trucks to choose from for years. The funding faltered at times, but the event thrived for years and became a hotspot for premieres during the *LOST*, *Hawaii Five-0*, and *Magnum P.I.* eras, bringing in musical superstars such as Cyndi Lauper, The Jonas Brothers, and more to present free concerts on Waikiki beach. Funding came and went throughout the years, but aside from a premiere here and there, it hasn't been a thing since pre-COVID.

Thanks to a collaboration between Southwest Airlines, the Waikiki Improvement Association, and the City and County of Honolulu, Sunset on the Beach is back with a series of monthly screenings. Limited seating will be available, but you can bring your beach towel or low-back chairs for comfort. Food and non-alcoholic beverages will be on sale, but remember, alcohol is not allowed on Hawaii beaches. The event timing varies monthly based on the sunset time. # Chef's Corner

## Izakaya 855-ALOHA Executive Chef Daniel No

*Growing up in Argentina with Korean parents, Daniel No was exposed to a rich variety of foods from a very young age. This exposure to numerous cultures enabled him to explore and develop his own tastes and preferences fueling his passion for the culinary world. Chef No moved to America and graduated from the Culinary Institute of America before continuing to pursue his love of food by working in Michelin-starred restaurants such as Eleven Madison Park, learning from the best and studying both old and modern cuisines of different styles.*

### Tell us about your first childhood food memory.

I was born in Argentina to Korean parents, so I was exposed to diverse cuisine at an early age. One of my first food memories is eating asado (Argentina BBQ) with banchan (Korean small side plates) such as kimchi and soy bean soup.

### Favorite memory growing up in Argentina?

Doing Asado with my friends and playing soccer while the meat was cooking. It would take 2 to 3 hours, lots of time to play and work up an appetite.

### What made you decide to pursue culinary?

Primarily because of my childhood. I used to invite my friends over and cook for them, which always resulted in a lively, fun time around the table. Also, since I was a baby I had a big appetite and liked to try all different kinds of food and flavors, so my main playground was mainly in the kitchen, not in the park or in the living room.

### How long did you live and work in New York?

I moved to New York in 2009 and started working right away which became a very inspiring and fulfilling 14 years in the city.

### How many Michelin restaurants did you work in and what did you take from the experience?

I worked in 3 Michelin starred restaurants but I was an at Daniel, where I properly learned how use my knife and became fond of French cuisine. I worked at Eleven Madison Park where I really honed my skills in the kitchen and learned diverse cuisines and techniques, and I worked at Kosaka, a sushi omakase restaurant where I fell in love with Japanese cuisine and learned about their culture and their refined techniques.

### How would you describe your cooking style?

My style is to create a balance of flavor and textures using local and seasonal ingredients.

### When did you move to Hawaii?

I first moved to Maui in late 2022.

### What's the best part about living here so far?

The best part of living in Hawaii is the culture and people, and truly embracing aloha and ohana.

### Tell us the concept behind Izakaya 855-ALOHA?

855-ALOHA serves Japanese Tapas. It presents itself as place to stop in for any number of reasons or no reason at all. Sharing time together – brief or long – for little bites and big sips. When one has a spare moment, or an evening to relax with friends, this is the best place for casual social interactions.

### Describe the philosophy behind the menu?

Our cooking philosophy consists of three "S" – "Seasonal, Simple and Surprise." The menu was created based on this philosophy.

### Where did the ideas for the menu come from?

Our original menu was conceptualized by Chef/ Partner "Sho" Kamio from Sendai, Japan. We are both big fans of Izakaya. Together, we have created a new Izakaya taste and community in Waikiki based on Chef Sho's Japanese expertise and Izakaya dining experience.

### What are your favorite items so far?

The Sendai Motsu Ni. A meat stew with konjac, ginger and garlic cooked in a miso base broth.

### What do you like to do most on your days off?

I like to do outside activities such as hiking, going to the beach, going to the gym, fishing and also trying different restaurants and bars.

### What is a Fuji Sando?

Fuji is a mountain in Japan. Japanese call it Fujisan. Fujisan is the most beautiful volcano in the world, and the highest mountain in Japan. We created top grade of beef meat which A5 Grade beef ribeye from Miyazakai prefecture, Japan. We cooked A5 wagyu steak and make a super-rich sandwich! It incorporates miso-gravy, housemade teriyaki, shiso and fresh wasabi.

### What's next for you?

To make our restaurant one of the best in Waikiki where everyone can come in not only to have a great meal but to have fun and an amazing experience. Where after a hard day of work they can release and forget about any stress and just have a good time with friends and family.
