Duke's Ocean Fest started as a simple event to celebrate Duke Kahanamoku's birthday (August 24, 1890), aligning with the release of his commemorative stamp in 2002. Over the years, it has grown into an exciting nine-day annual festival featuring

thrilling sports close to Duke's heart, including surfing, longboarding, paddleboard racing, swimming, tandem surfing, surf polo, beach volleyball, and stand-up paddling. This exciting series of events honors Duke Kahanamoku's remarkable life, athletic achievements, and inspiring spirit, which continue to motivate us today. The festival kicks off in Waikiki on August 15th and wraps up on what would have been his 135th birthday, August 24th. Visitors to Waikiki during this period are encouraged to enjoy the many festivities happening right on their front doorstep.

One of the greatest athletes to emerge from Hawaii, Duke was a legend in his own time. Known as the "Father of Surfing," he collected six Olympic medals between 1912 and 1932, including three golds in swimming. Today, Duke is remembered fondly as the ultimate waterman and as the first person inducted into both the International Swimming Hall of Fame and the International Surfing Hall of Fame.

Locals and tourists alike will flock to the beach to watch the various competitions. The majestic bronze statue of Duke Kahanamoku stands in his honor, arms outstretched in a welcoming gesture to all, greeting

everyone passing by, whether they are headed to the waves or enjoying the many delights of the place he loved most. It's no surprise that most events and exhibitions will take place in front of Queen Surf's statue unless otherwise noted.

Let's dive into some of the exciting events happening at the ocean playground Duke once called home. The festivities start on Friday, August 15, with a special Duke's Opening Ceremony, complete with traditional Hawaiian protocol at the statue. As the air fills with the sound of Hawaiian music, graceful hula dancers take the stage, showcasing the islands' rich cultural heritage and setting the tone for the thrilling Oceanfest to come. This ceremony captures the spirit of Hawaiian culture and brings people together in a sense of camaraderie. On Saturday and Sunday, the Outrigger Resorts & Hotels Adult Volleyball Challenge takes center stage at Queen's Sand Volleyball Courts. Keep

All sporting events are friendly for spectators. Over 20 ocean and beach events will be available, offering plenty of action along Waikiki shores daily from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. An expo and merchandise tents will be set up throughout the week at Queen's Beach. Marine Corps Base Hawaii is excited to invite the O'ahu community and visitors to the 2025 Kaneohe Bay Air Show and Open House, taking flight on Saturday and Sunday, August 9-10. This year's event highlights the precision and power of military aviation, featuring the U.S. Navy's elite Blue Angels, returning to the islands for the first time in three years, along with the U.S. Air Force's F-22 Raptor Demo team, USAF KC-135 Demo Team, and The Para-Commandos, the US Special Operations Command's premier aerial parachute demo team, and more, for an electrifying show in the skies.



High-flying feats are just part of the fun at the Kaneohe Bay Airshow. Leading the pack are the spectacular U.S. Navy Blue Angels with their death-defying precision that will thrill the crowd. The Blue Angels began their flight demonstrations after WWII. In 1946, Admiral Chester Nimitz, the leader of the Navy, conceived the idea of creating a flight demonstration team to boost public interest in naval aviation and enhance Navy morale, which ultimately led to the formation of the Blue Angels. In 2021, the team marked its 75th anniversary and switched to Boeing F/A-18 Super Hornet, the aircraft they will be flying on O'ahu this month.

The team is made up of 140 active-duty Sailors and Marines, considered top-tier, who bring extensive experience from their service in the fleet. They proudly represent over 800,000 active-duty, reserve, and civilian personnel currently serving across the globe in the Navy and Marine Corps.

By their very nature, the U.S. Navy operates globally, and its forces are often out of sight for the American public. The Blue Angels have a special ability to

highlight the importance of naval aviation while paying tribute to its rich history. They proudly represent the heritage, agility, flexibility, and significance of naval aviation in modern warfare.

At the festival, the entertainment in the sky won't be the only showstopper. Visitors can also explore the grounds and view displays of a diverse range of commercial aircraft and military vehicles. Food vendors will serve a variety of dishes, and a STEM Zone is set up to inspire and empower kids to explore science, technology, engineering, and math, providing hands-on learning experiences that teach real-world skills.

To ensure a fun, stress-free day, there are a few things to keep in mind. Since the entire weekend takes place on a military base, please drive carefully, bring valid identification, and wear your seatbelt. Be patient. Last time the Blue Angels were here, traffic moved at a snail's pace because everyone on the entire island showed up to watch them. Don't get bored and pull out your cell phone, as talking while driving is strictly prohibited, and you will be pulled over. All bags will be inspected at entry, and a few things to leave home include large bags and backpacks, coolers, pets, outside food and drinks, and (shocking, we know) any explosives or weapons.

The Kaneohe Bay Air Show and Open House, known as "Blues on the Bay," is a free and open-to-the-public event. Don't miss your chance to witness incredible aerial performances, static displays, and more. Gates open at 8 a.m., show grounds open at 9 a.m. General admission to this event is free. Guests who want to enjoy the entertainment from a comfortable seat can purchase a premium ticket package from their website. If not, remember that it can get very hot out there, so please remind your guests to wear a hat, bring an umbrella, and apply plenty of sunscreen. arts, and more, all of which highlight the islands' vibrant and creative spirit. Festival favorites Lex Breezy and Simply Sisters are back, Fighting Eel has taken on a larger space, and Kakou Collective is using the occasion to launch a brand-new apparel clothing line. New to the Festival this year is Made by Lexee, featuring their preserved flower jewelry; Bella Logan Inc., showcasing handmade glass cups with local plants; Hawaiian feather crafts from Na Hulu Arts; and Pailolo Designs, offering wooden olelo Hawai'i games. New food vendors include matcha from Daily Whisk, premium vegan chocolate fudge from Maui's Farm to Fudge, and freshly made-to-order salads and grilled meats from Primal Bowls to name a few.



While you're there, savor a taste of Hawai'i's diverse cuisine courtesy of local celebrity chefs who will be giving live cooking demonstrations, including chef Jason Peel of Nami Kaze. The party atmosphere will then elevate as award-winning musicians take the stage to perform a blend of traditional and modern island music. We're talking about Na Hoku winners Bobby Moderow, Jerry Santos, Kawika Kahiapo, Melveen Leed, and Kupaoa. Interesting fact, Kupaoa was the very first winner of the Kani Ka Pila Grille Talent Search back in 2009 and has won seven Nā Hōkū Hānohano awards since.

Keeping up that tradition, Outrigger Resorts & Hotels proudly continues its support for Hawai'i's musical talent with its 18th annual Kani Ka Pila Grille Talent Search. The four finalists will be announced at the end of July. They will have the opportunity to perform live at the Made in Hawai'i Festival on Saturday, August 16, before a panel of respected Hawaiian music industry experts, which includes Bobby Moderow and Kawika Kahiapo. Last year's winner, Rickey Kamai, will start the event at 3 p.m. with a short set, followed by performances from the four finalists beginning at 3:30 p.m. After

You might recognize a few of the winner's names... Kamakakekahu Fernandez (2012), Waimanalo Sunset Band (2015), Ei Nei (2017), Anthony Pfluke (2022) just to name a few. Don't miss the chance to witness the next big star in Hawaiian music as they make their breakthrough.

As the Festival continues to grow, they have introduced several new highlights this year. Chef's Corner

HFWF Celebrity Chef Reem Assil

Reem Assil is a Palestinian-Syrian chef and activist, based in Oakland, CA, working at the intersection of food, community, and social justice. The founder of nationally-acclaimed Reem's California, an Arab bakery and restaurant that builds community across cultures and experiences through the warmth of Arab bread and hospitality, Reem has garnered an array of top accolades in the culinary world. Before dedicating herself to a culinary career, Reem spent over a decade as a community and labor organizer building the leadership and amplifying the voices of marginalized communities in their jobs and their neighborhoods.

What is your first childhood food memory?

My mother toasting bread topped with za'atar and olive oil. The aroma always woke us up on weekend mornings.

What inspired your interest in culinary?

Food had always played a role in my life as a healing force especially when times were tough. For many years I hosted friends and prepared lavish meals as a way to build community. I loved the alchemy of it.

When did you decide to become a chef?

I In 2010, I took the leap. After burnout in a nonprofit job, I decided to go to Syria and Lebanon with my father. It was there I fell in love with the culinary arts. The bakeries were magical. I wanted to be an alchemist like the bakers I saw. I immediately came home, quit my job, and enrolled in culinary school.

What was your first job in the industry?

Foh, a server at a local Thai restaurant where I grew up. During culinary school, I worked as a morning baker at the renowned bakery called Arizmendi.

Who would you consider your mentor?

The many people at La Cocina, an incubator program for women of color to scale up their businesses. They taught me how to persevere in this tough industry. They believed in me when I didn't believe in myself.

How would you describe your cuisine?

Arab food made with California love. Fun, colorful, seasonal, rooted in heritage.

Why the desire to connect to childhood flavors?

I wanted to be connected to my roots and foods from my childhood always remind me of where I came from. They give me a sense of home at a time where the world is in turmoil.

Why did you decide to open a restaurant?

I wanted to create a similar refuge for my community, just like I saw in the bakeries of Beirut. After years of organizing, I realized my community needed a more transformative space

where they could come as they are, feel connected to others, and stand in their dignity. What better way to do that than through a food space?

How do you use food to build your community?

In my culture food and hospitality go hand in hand. Our food alone is delicious, healthy and wholesome, but it's the context in which we serve it that keep people connected. From the design of our restaurant to the stories we tell, people feel the warmth. Their senses become enlivened and their defenses may even come down. Reem's is a place where you always run into people you know or meet new people you should know. We are involved in the happenings of the neighborhood around us and gives often to causes, so we have built a strong ecosystem of care and support.

Is the war in Israel affecting your business?

As a Palestinian from Gaza, it's been devastating to continue cooking as my people have been forcibly starved. But the overwhelming support from my community reminds me that I'm a cultural carrier and preserving our foodways is an important act of resistance. It is a way to tell our stories and keep inspiring Americans to make change.

What do you have planned for HFWF?

I am cooking at the chai brunch and speaking on a panel about the power of the Celebrity Chef.

What's on your must-do list while in Hawai'i?

Eat a lot of poke and Malasadas, catch a sunset, enjoy the more slow paced nature of island life.

You're a speaker on The Power and Influence of Celebrity Chefs panel on Oct. 31, thoughts?

I think chefs hold an incredible platform, and I never take mine for granted. I'd love to see us using our platforms to also uplift all the people that put us in the positions we are and find ways to support them in having the courage to have their own platforms, particularly those most marginalized in our industry and don't feel like they have a voice.

Reem's Arabic Bread

Ingredients:

5½ cups/770g bread flour

2½ cups/590ml warm water (about 100°F)

1½ teaspoons/6g sugar

1 tablespoon/9g active dry yeast

1 cup/140g all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon/9g kosher salt

¼ cup/60ml extra-virgin olive oil, plus

more for greasing the bowl

Semolina flour for dusting

Instructions: In the bowl of a stand mixer or a large bowl, add the bread flour. Stir in 2¼ cups of the water. With the paddle on low speed or using a sturdy spoon, mix until it resembles a sticky dough. Set aside for 20 minutes. While the mixture rests, stir together the remaining ¼ cup water, sugar, and yeast in a small bowl. Set aside until foamy, about 10 minutes. At this point, the yeast mix should give off a sweet fragrance and show a bubbly bloom. Form the dough into a ball. Then coat a large bowl with oil and transfer the dough into the bowl. Cover bowl with plastic wrap or a damp dish towel and let it rise in a warm place for 1½ hours or until it's doubled. If you are not planning to use the dough right away, refrigerate for up to 12 hours until doubled in size. Divide the prepared risen dough into 10 pieces. Shape the pieces into rounds, cover with a dry dish towel (or brush the dough with a bit of oil and cover gently with plastic wrap), and let rest for 20 minutes. Preheat the oven to 500°F. Using a rolling pin, roll out each round and place in oven for 2 to 3 minutes.

How many of you know what's been happening inside the Waikiki Shopping Plaza lately? We all know about **Stix Asia**, right? The former Waikiki Yokochō gained a big following as the go-to place for ramen when it first opened, and the Asian Food Hall is even more popular now since STIX took over. Sure, I know about **BUHO Cocina y Cantina**; it's been there for years, but I didn't realize they added a sushi bar inside. **Sushi Fukurou Waikiki** was my first surprise. Only open Tuesday to Friday, there are two seatings for this 12-course Omakase. The first seating is from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m., and the second from 8 to 10 p.m. \$90 per person. According to building management, the sushi bar is always packed, and reservations are a must. If the rest of the items are as good as the wagyu sushi they serve, I can understand. sushifukurou.com.



From there, the tour became so much more exciting! I was convinced we were heading to STIX to check out a few more restaurants when they mentioned going to the lower level, but surprise! We exited STIX and headed towards Royal Hawaiian Avenue. Right in front of me was a hidden alley filled with restaurants I had never even heard of! I knew **Royal Lobster** was there. If you remember, right after COVID, I was searching for content since there weren't any events to cover, so I did a lobster roll wrap-up. Honestly, what's the point of having your own magazine if you can't enjoy some perks now and then? Tasting my way through Hawaii's lobster rolls to share a story with you turned out to be one of my best ideas ever! That spot has some of the best lobster rolls on the island. Located at the bottom of the stairs off Royal



Hawaiian Avenue, I never opened the door next to the restaurant. To be honest, if I had opened it back then, the area might've been empty, but on a recent visit, I was overjoyed to find a hidden alley full of incredible eateries. The first one I discovered might just be my favorite—**Allegrini Mozzarella**. It's a cozy shop filled with products imported directly from Italy, along with a restaurant serving delicious and reasonably priced



dishes. Their pizza, sandwiches, and freshly made cannoli are simply mouthwatering. Did you notice all the discounts they have? 25% off all menu items from 2 to 5 p.m.! 10% for kama'aina? That was definitely my find of the year. I was in cured meats and Italian cheese heaven!

Although I was unfamiliar with this hidden lower level, news about **Maguro**



Brothers has clearly spread. Open from 5 to 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday, a line forms outside before the store opens each day. This alley, known as the lower level, houses **Waffle & Berry**, **Sam's Kitchen**, **Aloha Hot Dog & Banh Mi**, and **Haleiwa Town Shave Ice**. Upstairs, there's **O'Oi Waikiki**, a Korean BBQ. Recently, **bb.q Chicken** opened nearby, and chef Jon Matsubara is opening Hawaiian Style Seafood Company, located next to it, featuring lobster rolls, seafood, and poke bowls. Toss in teppanyaki fave Tanaka of Tokyo on the 3rd floor, an artisanal burger experience at Big Island Burger on the first floor using 100% fresh ground beef sourced from the Big Island, and Kai Coffee Hawaii near the entrance of the first floor, and Waikiki Shopping Plaza has rapidly become a top food destination in Waikiki.
