I-lawai'i State Art Museum

While cities like Berkeley, Santa Fe and New York City may come to mind when thinking about the arts, Honolulu ranks high on lists of most artistic mediumsized cities in the United States, and as high as third on Art Bistro's ranking of funding for the arts.

Hawaii became the first state to adopt a 'Percent for Art" law in 1967, mandating that 1 percent of construction appropriations for state buildings must be set aside for art, setting a national standard for support of the arts in public places.

In the following decades, the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts amassed more than 5,000

pieces that became nomads, given temporary housing within state buildings and public spaces, with no permanent home of their own.

That changed in 2002, when the art pieces finally found a home in the heart of Honolulu's business district. Many of the works can now be viewed on a rotating basis at the Hawaii State Art Museum (HiSAM), across the street from the State Capitol Building.

The site has a story of its own, as the location of one of Hawaii's first hotels, opened in 1872 after American politicians in King Kamehameha V's cabinet convinced the legislature to fund the lodging space. The hotel was converted to a YMCA in 1917 and used by the military in World War I. The original building was torn down In 1926, replaced by the Spanish mission style building that now houses two main second-floor galleries, one dedicated to contemporary artists and one capturing a visual history of Hawaii.

Here, visitors are witness to a timeline that shows how Hawaii's isolation led artists to express the feeling of distance through works that are original and self-reverential. Continuous waves of immigrants added elements of their own rich cultures to the unique palette.


Included in the state's collection are strona graphic, fresco-style oils by Juliette May Fraser and Jean completed Charlot, in Hawaii of the 1950s, when mainland artists were discovering Hawaii for the first time with the growth of air travel. There are also striking black-and-white portraits of Hawaiians by Franco Salmoiraghi and Francis Haar, as well as works

by the Metcalf Chateau, a small cadre of postwar Japanese-American artists who traveled to New York City in the 1950s, contributing to the American abstract expressionist movement. They include Isami Doi, Tadashi Sato, Satoru Abe and Tetsuo Ochikubo, among others.

The artists' powerful language will resonate with anyone curious about Hawaii's history, visually captured through a timeline that starts with vibrant red lava flows, depictions of the arrival of the isles' first Polynesian inhabitants and subsequent explorers, the cultural influences of immigration, a reawakening of the Hawaiian spirit in the 1970s, and contemporary graphic expressions reflecting a unique melting pot culture.

That immigration of people from throughout Asia and the Pacific plays heavily into the artistic diversity on view as people who arrived from other places, speaking *Continued on page 7.*

Members of the Hawaii Potters Guild, which launched the project a decade ago, have spent months shaping clay bowls, glazing and firing the vessels that will be offered up for sale and filled with soup and other tasty bites during the fundraiser that helps to raise awareness of the plight of the hungry and their unfilled bowls.

The event will benefit Aloha Harvest, a nonprofit organization that rescues excess, quality, donated food from restaurants and other food purveyors and delivers it free of

Activities

Ka Lei Hula is a traditional Hawaiian dance program that focuses on the philosophical approach of human interactions. The Hula is utilized to engage with the participant in a sequence of carefully orchestrated practices. The program begins with an oli (a Hawaiian chant of prayer and welcoming). This is followed by stretching and breathing exercises, learning five basic hula steps along with its history, and a Hawaiian song while implementing it with dance.

HAWAIIAN STAMPING

Ohe Ka Pula is the traditional Hawaiian art of stamping. These printing techniques were used on tapa (mulberry paper) by ancient Hawaiians. Bamboo carved motif designs and symbols are lined with paint and imprinted on luggage tags and/or book markers. Participants will be able to craft their own keepsakes. 

"This Land is Your Land" and is considered one of the most significant figures in American folk must. Arlo is best known for writing ballads that tell a story and those stories, like in his debut work, "Alice's Restaurant Massacree" deal with political protest and social in justice. The 18-minute song is a protest of the Vietnam War draft and based on Arlo's own experiences. In this comical tune, the songwriter is arrested for dumping trash, which ultimately aids in him being rejected from the draft because he has a criminal record. The song was also adapted as film in 1969 with Guthrie playing himself. Subsequently the hit song has become Arlo's signature work and was recently selected by the National Recording Registry of the Library of Congress to be preserved for it historical significance. Clearly the marguee of the Hawaii Theatre has distracted me a lot this month from other arts organizations, so I feel at this time I should show some love to THE ACTORS' GROUP, or TAG as we all know it, at Dole Cannery. On April 27th TAG presents Pulitzer Prize winner playwright Lynn Nottage's play entitled Sweat which not only won the Pulitzer, but also the Obie Award, and a Tony and Drama Desk nomination for best play. The story follows a group of friends and their children who work for a steel plant in a bluecollar Pennsylvania town where friendship is tested when one friend, Cynthia, is promoted to management and the other, Tracy, is not and accuses the plant for hiring Cynthia only on the basis that she is black. The play is set in 2000 and 2008, the former was a time when the stock market dropped and Reading, Pennsylvania was 10 billion dollars in debt. As a direct result the steel plant is forced to ask workers to take a 60% pay cut or lose their jobs. Cynthia is blamed by her friends for the cuts at the plant and ask her to join the fight against management, which she refuses to do. As you can guess tensions rise and something tragic happens. If you want to know, you'll need to send some of your quests to the show. The production runs April 12 to May 5th Thursday through Saturday at 7:30 p.m. Tickets are \$30 for adults, \$25 for seniors and \$20 for students and military. charge to social service agencies helping to feed the hungry in Hawaii. Since 1999, the organization has rescued more than 21 million pounds of edible food that would have become waste.

The public is invited to help by purchasing one of the handcrafted ceramic bowls made for the event, inspired by a Michigan fundraiser that started in 1990, itself modeled after a Michigan high school project during which art students made ceramic bowls, served a meal of soup and bread, and invited guests to keep the bowl as a reminder of hunger in the world.

Locally, there will be more than 3,000 bowls to choose from during the event taking place at Dole Cannery's Pomaika'i Ballroom, which is expected to draw more than 2000 people. More than 35 HPG potters were tasked with the challenge of making 50 or more bowls, each, for the event. Other participating organizations are the Friends of Ala Was Art Center, Honolulu Museum of Art, and University of Hawaii at Manoa.

Bowls made by Hawaii high school students will be showcased in a special area for those who wish to support the next generation of potters. Public and private schools participating in the event are lolani, Kamehameha, La Pietra-Hawaii School for Girls, Mid-Pacific Institute, Moanalua High, Punahou, Roosevelt, and Sacred Hearts Academy.

Along with the artisan bowls that go home with attendees as a memento of the event, purchasers will receive tickets to redeem for a diverse selection of soup made by some of Honolulu's top chefs, plus bread and other small bites from food stations.

Rick Bayless is Hawaii Food & Wine Festival's Culinary Hero

The Hawaii Food and Wine Festival has announced that seven-time James Beard Awardee and the winner of season one of Bravo's *Top Chef Masters*, chef Rick Bayless, as its second Culinary Hero. Bayless was a pioneer in introducing traditional Mexican cuisine to a Tex-Mex-eating America in the 1980s, and has achieved national and international acclaim in the culinary world ever since with numerous restaurant concepts including Frontera Grill, a hit television series, *Mexico: One Plate at a Time*, and has been bestowed with the Mexican Order of the Aztec Eagle, the highest decoration given to foreigners whose work has benefitted Mexico and its people.

Bayless will be in town later this month for two special events. The five-course wine paired Culinary Hero dinner will be held on April 25th at Ka 'Ikena Laua'e at KCC for \$350 per person. Bayless will also be a part of the grand tasting launch party event, No Borders, on April 26th, where guests can experience his Mexican flavors, as well as dishes by nine of Hawaii's best chefs who will craft dishes inspired by the traditional cuisines of their own heritage and a fireworks finale. \$150. different languages, had to learn other ways to communicate their emotions, thus inventing a visual language understood by those growing up here.

This need for expression might also explain the prevalence of working artists in the state. Hawaii ranked No. 6 among states on the National Endowment for the Arts 2005 report—the only time the study was made of artists per percentage of the population, at 84.1 artists per 10,000 people. Topped ranked New York had 101.1 artists per 10,000 people.

Recently, the Friends of HiSAM, a nonprofit group focused on promoting the museum and the arts in Hawaii, launched the HiSAM Top Picks Project which involved asking 10 local art connoisseurs to select their personal top 25 picks from the 6,000-plus works from the SFCA Collection of Relocatable works (vs. commissioned permanent installations) to bring greater attention to the museum and raise awareness of the importance of visual artists in Hawaii's history.

The Friends are now inviting the public to weigh in on which of their picks are favorites. Visit friendsofhisam.org to cast a vote for your favorite piece. Voting is open through June 30, 2019.

Itere's what's currently on display at the museum:

"Emphasized: Eye on Scale": Exploration of the ways artists play with scale, and how this affects the viewer's responses and understanding. Second floor Diamond Head gallery.

"Hawai'i": Change & Continuity: Examination of the overlapping influences of nature and human impact on a fragile environment. Second floor 'Ewa gallery. Through June 8, 2019.

"State of Art: New Work": Engage with a selection of recent additions to the collection from across the Hawaiian Islands. The 31 works acquired from 18 exhibitions offer an insight into current trends and themes in the local arts scene and provides an opportunity to see the diversity of works being created in Hawaii today. Second floor Diamond Head gallery. Through "Young Artists of Hawai'i": An annual student art exhibition recognizing creative excellence among Hawaii's public private school students and from Kindergarten through sixth grade. A panel of distinguished judges select 96 works for exhibition from school submissions. Opens May 3, continuing through June 28, 2019.



Travel around the world and eat tasty food!









Q. How long have you been with the Kahala? A. I have been here for just about 3 years

Q. What brought you there?

A. It's all about timing. Fond childhood memories with my family at The Kahala have always been very dear to me. I remember wishing that someday maybe my dream job would be to work here. Fast forward... a friend told me there was an opening and my dream came true!

Q. How did you get your start in the industry?

A. I started as a PBX linguist for a large hotel right out of college and I left the industry to pursue a career in high end retail.

Q. What is your biggest challenge at the desk?

A. Sometimes I overthink things, making it more complicated than it should be. Being my own worst critic is tough to break.

Q. People talk about your professionalism and positivity, how do you maintain that outlook?

A. I think my family and faith have a lot to do with my daily attitude. I came from a strict upbringing, but it was full of love and caring. My colleagues at work also have those similar qualities that bring a calm and ease when I am at work.

Q. What do you like most about this industry?

A. Each day is never the same. I meet people from all over the world and I truly enjoy each interaction. It is very special when a guest comes back super excited to tell me about their day and they allow me to share their excitement and happiness.

Q. What makes your hotel/team so special?

A. They are my family away from my home. We all get along and since I don't have siblings, this is how I imagine it would be if I did. We have this unconditional love for each other and get together as much as we can outside of work and like karaoke.

Q. Is there a guest that sticks out more than others?

A. One guest, responsible for a family gatehring, was unable to get reservations at another hotel's restaurant. They reached out to us and through our concierge network, we got them in. We later found out that someone in the family was battling cancer and this was a very special breakfast.

Q. What's the most unusual request you've had?

A. A guest need to replace a particular water toy in a specific color. We called around to look for the particular brand and color to no avail. I finally recalled seeing it at an ABC Store and found it!

Q. Your guest has one day, what should they do?

A. A customized tour around the island with a visit the Kahala Legacy Forest at Gunstock Ranch where they can plant their own endemic Hawaiian Milo tree, dedicate it to someone special and leave their own legacy, forever being connected to Hawaii.

Q. Where are you from?
