## A Shoppers Dream Come True



Without a doubt, there is no shopping event geared to both visitors and even locals that comes close to the wealth of high quality, reasonably priced, island products to be found at the shopper's

paradise called Made In Hawaii. This 3-day shoppers extravaganza happens every August. Mark the calendar for the 23rd Annual First Hawaiian Bank Made in Hawaii Festival, as it fills the Neal S. Blaisdell Center's Exhibition Hall and Arena on August 18th - 20th.

What began as a group of around sixty local

vendors selling their products in 1995, has since grown to an event that is breaking all previous records for shopping choices, with more than 400 booths filled with guaranteed Made In Hawaii products – row upon row of handmade, irresistible treasures.

If you think you have seen it all. Think again. Every year the roster of vendors grows. This year festival director Amy Hammond says the booth space was sold out by May. She says many old favorites are there, with new Hawaii-made delights sandwiched between. "There is a great anticipation for the new neighbor island vendors, presenting

products not widely available in Honolulu." The products include food, fashion, and treasures from Maui, Kauai, Oahu, Molokai and Hawaii.

Music fills the Pikake Room, where sitting is a treat when award-winning entertainers, including Hawaii's finest Na Hoku Hanohano winners, present concert performances. Tired feet are guaranteed to revive and tap to the music of Keauhou, Jay Larin, Melveen Leed, Weldon Kekauoha, Maunalua, Frank DeLima, Danny Couch, Glenn Medeiros, Jerry Santos, Hoku Zuttermeister and Josh Tatofi. The maestro of the event, Alan Yamamoto, says, "One table in the room holds treasures for sale. New CD's of course, but there is also a rich assortment of vintage CD's by many of the artists, recordings that are no longer available. The added perk - the artists will autograph their work."

The annual Kani Ka Pila Grille Talent Search, sponsored by Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort, invites emerging musicians to submit recordings of their music. The five finalists selected are announced in advance and invited to perform on the Pikake Room stage in front of Na Hoku Hanohano and Grammy award-winning judges, joined by Luana Maitland, music director for Kani Ka Pila Grille. The winning group or artist receives a one-month paid contract to perform Thursdays in September at the Grille at Outrigger Reef, plus Continues on page 6.

Duke Paoa Kahinu Mokoe Hukikohola Kahanamoku, known as "Paoa" by his closest friends and "Duke" by the rest of the world, was born on Oahu in 1890. He learned to swim in the clear waters of Kalia, at the far end of Waikiki where the Hilton Hawaiian Village now stands, and grew up to become an Olympic gold-medalist and the world's greatest waterman. In these roles, Duke traveled the globe, bringing with him his extraordinary athletic skills and an overall presence that both inspired and amazed, while inviting others to experience the aloha Hawaii has to offer.

Duke's OceanFest is held every summer the week of his birthday (August 24th), and celebrates the occasion through the varying sports he loved surfing, diving, paddling, running, water polo, and beach volleyball. Participants can compete in over 20 events at a variety of venues in Waikiki. The event, which coincides with what would have been Duke's 127th birthday, kicks off on Saturday, August 19th at the site of his statue alongside Kalakaua Avenue. One of the first events of this year's OceanFest is the Menehune Surf Fest on August 19th and 20th. This is an ideal contest for young surfers and is especially fitting to kick off the festivities since Duke is known worldwide as the father of international modern surfing. There will also be a special Wounded Warriors canoe regatta at Fort DeRussy Beach.

Most events take place on Kuhio Beach. The Amateur Longboard & SUP Surf Classic will be held from August 21st- 23rd. Offering eight different amateur divisions and several Pro divisions, there is \$5,000 up for grabs in prizes.

It's been a while since this column wondered through the halls of our local museums, so let's see what's hanging on the walls or suspended from the ceilings of some of Honolulu's most respected museums.

The first place your guests will probably want to "hang out" is the **HONOLULU MUSUEM OF ART**. If they are here the last Friday of the month please have them join the *Art After Dark* event. The party runs from 6 to 9 p.m. on the grounds of the museum and admission is \$25 but tell your guests to get there early and stand in the line to the right of the entrance to get in. The line to the left is for museum members only. This event is perfect for those guests who are looking for some fun nightlife in addition to some culture.

If they can't make it that night, during the week the museum is open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Sundays from 1 to 5 p.m. Admission is only \$20 and includes entry to the HONOLULU MUSEUM OF ART SPALDING HOUSE. And don't forget that kids 17 and under are free, so visiting the museum won't break the bank of large families.

The current exhibit "Norrjehan Bilgrami" Under the Molsri Tree is coming to a close on September 3rd, so this is your last chance to see the Pakistani artists large-format sepia tone photomontages from the early 20th century that play homage to her childhood spent beneath the above mentioned tree. The photomontages are accented with gold and are put together as if stitched like panels in a quilt. Ms. Bilgrami was the artist in residence at Shangri La in May.

Another exhibit entitled "Body of Work" celebrates the human form in art. For most of us celebrating the human form in art results in a stick figure drawn with a pen on a napkin. This collection includes American and European paintings, sculptures, photographs and works on paper from the museum's modern and contemporary collections. You guests will see works by such artists as Robert Arneson, Elmer Bischoff, Robert Colescott, Robert Mapplethorpe, Vik Muniz, Mickalene Thomas, Kara Walker, and Tom Wesselmann that deal with themes such as religion and spirituality, identity, gender, and politics. The exhibit runs through April, 2018.

For more information on exhibits and special events, as well as tour information for Spalding House and Doris Duke's Shangri La, visit HonoluluMuseum.org.

BISHOP MUSEUM recently opened its doors to seven days a week, so there is no excuse for your guests to miss out on all the cultural and interactive exhibits at Hawai'i oldest museum. Of course there are three must dos when visiting the museum: (1) experience all three floors of

Hawaiian Hall to journey through the different realms of Hawai'i; (2) explore Pacific Hall and the wide expanse of Oceania; and (3) check out the Mamiya Science Adventure Center and make volcanos roar.

Once they have accomplished that I recommend they visit "Homefront Hawai'i: Pearl Harbor 75th Commemoration" The exhibit honors the memory of the attack on Pearl Harbor and bring the stories of those who experienced it first hand to life. The exhibit is located in the Portico Hall in the Hawaiian Hall Complex. There are some stunning images of Waikiki Beach surrounded in barbed wire fencing, and other fascinating pictures from the era including rarely-seen photos of explosion-damaged Honolulu streets, and a bomb shelter at Tolani Palace. Period artifacts will also be displayed, such as remnants of a shot-down Japanese plane.

If your guests truly want to understand the artistic expression of Hawaiian culture, the "Hulia 'Ano: Inspired Pattern" of Hawaiian culture is the exhibit to explore. The patterns featured in this exhibit are intricate, vibrant and a trademark of Hawaiian artistic expression, whether stamped onto bark cloth, drawn onto gourds, woven into mats or pricked into skin. Drawing from the treasures in Bishop Museum's ethnology collection and supplemented by its vast natural science collections, Hulia 'Ano explores Hawaiian aesthetic traditions, spotlighting design motifs and visual similarities in the natural world.

Admission is \$22.95 for adults. Seniors 65 and older are \$19.95. Children age 16 and younger must be accompanied by an adult. Bishop Museum is open daily from 9 a.m.- 5 p.m. For more information, visit BishopMuseum.org or call 847-3511. There is lots to do at the Bishop Museum so tell your guests to allow for at least three hours in order to fit everything in.

Hammond also says everyone has "upped their game." The Chef's Challenge in the back of the Arena is a perfect example. The area now seats 200. The air in the Arena is filled with the fragrance of coffee, grown locally from Kau to Kauai and the creations the Hale Aina Award-Winning chefs as they present cooking demonstrations.

This year Chef James Aptakin, who is now Executive Chef at the Turtle Bay Resort, is "over the top" excited to introduce the Made in Hawaii Chili Challenge to the event. Cooking is Chef James' passion, possibly driven by the fact that he had twelve foster homes by the age four. From Miami, he started cooking at age eight and plating full dinners by the time he was in the 5th grade. His own chef's challenge was cooking for 6,000 men on the U.S.S. Abraham Lincoln.

"I am thrilled to be the chef for this challenge." He says it is a dream come true and he really thought it out and picked a food everyone loves and a food that has many (chef says infinite) possibilities.

For the cook-off, until the pot runs out, fans get a taste of the most exotic chili since the old days of the Diamond Head Theatre Chili Cook-off. The extra perk is this gives shoppers another chance to get off those feet. This years' roster of chefs include Chef JJ Reinhart from Bali Steak & Seafood, Chef Colin Hazama, Azure at Royal Hawaiian, Executive Chef Ronnie Nasuti from Tiki's Grill & Bar and Executive Sous Chef Nolan West, Moana Surfrider to name a few.



In addition to retro-chili, there seems to always be a ginger theme running through food items. Many shoppers make a beeline for Anahola Ginger Granola before they start their shopping trek. This year, shopper scan find their ginger flavors are running through Mauna Kea Tea, Maui Preserved, Pacifikool, Maui Sweet Cakes, and Ishiharaya products.

One useful idea is taking a highlighter pen with you. The amount of booths can be overwhelming. Step through the turnstile and step aside. Do a quick read-through and hit the highlights with your pen. Then, plan the route that will deliver the most efficient shopping. Remember to take a tote bag, wear good walking shoes and arrive hungry.

Each year new vendors sell at the Festival. This years new vendors include Momo Terrascapes LLC, Jeff Morgan Designs, Kawa Kookies, Kisiwa, Lei Humu Papa Designs, KAVA Roots LLC, Donnie Ann Creations, Simply Sisters by Lola Miller Designs, Werk Arts - Bamboo Bikes Hawaii and Wrappily to name a few.

All of the artisans work hard to comply with the rules of the show. Living up to the Made in Hawaii promise isn't easy. The laws regulating products require 51% of the wholesale value of each product be manufactured, assembled, produced or fabricated of materials made in Hawaii. Meeting the criteria is tough for screen print artists who must buy t-shirts made in China or, if they are lucky, from a mainland U.S. factory. For designers, fabric is also a challenge since fiber plants, like cotton, are not native to Hawaii. The best they can do is order yardage, pay shipping and print fabric in the islands. It is great to know that there is always something new at the festival, but also fun to see the "old timers" who have participated in the festival since its inception.



A bit of history on this mega-shopping event: In 1995, State Representative David Morihara envisioned an event that would provide a venue to showcase all the products of Hawaii, and provide an opportunity for companies to market themselves to retail buyers and consumers and test-market new products. Over the years the event has become a business incubator helping businesses test-market products to thousands of patrons at a very low cost.

Parking is plentiful for the event but the best way to get there is to car pool with friends, or catch The Bus. From Waikiki take The Bus, route #2 or #13 to the Blaisdell.

What originated as a modest 61-booth exhibition to help Hawaii's local businesses now attracts 40,0000 attendees. Mainland and neighbor island visitors plan trips to coincide with the three-day extravaganza – a marathon of food, music, and non-stop shopping.

All this is available for the bargain ticket price of \$6. Children 6 and under are free. First Hawaiian Bank's Oahu branches will offer \$1.00-off coupons starting in mid-August while supplies



## Chef's Corner

Herringbone's Celebrity Chef Brian Malarkey

Brian Malarkey rose to fame on the Bravo TV show Top Chef. Since then, he has launched multiple restaurants, been on copious amounts of TV shows, and still has fun in a kitchen like the old days. This is the 5th rendition of his "Fish Meats Field" culinary concept but he insists, "We're not coming as a chain, we are coming as a restaurant that is part of the community that is being involved getting the fish, meats and produce from local purveyors. See for yourself at his new restaurant that opens on August 2nd.

#### What is your first childhood food memory?

I was a young kid eating bad food — I was a product of the early 80's so we had lots of canned food and TV dinners. But a better memory was when I was on a little on a ranch in Portland and we had this beautiful plum tree and they were so juicy and bright, my brother would hoist me up and get the plum and eat that sweet candy of nature.

#### When did you decide you wanted to be a chef?

I still haven't sold myself on the idea yet, I went to college, drank too much, ate too much, spent more time doing that than going to school in Portland and then Santa Barbara. My dad said why don't you go to culinary school? All you do is eat food and drink booze, you'll love it – first restaurant Michel Ricard was chef, when I saw his commitment and passion non 9-5, and the teamwork, I was sold forever and since then I have never thought of anything but being a chef.

#### What was your first job in the industry?

Busser at Old Spaghetti Factory in Portland, Oregon, not quite the cooking I wanted to do!

#### Who would you consider your mentor and why?

I consider the people I work with every day to be my mentor, the great chefs I spend time with and other chefs I learn from, all the Hawaii Food and Wine Festival chefs. Wherever I go, if you can't find a mentor in your day-to-day then you're not opening your eyes wide enough.

#### Let's talk about Top Chef? How did that come around?

Ha! Funny story. So, I applied to be on the Next Food Network Star and they flew me to New York. I crashed and burned in front of Bobby Flay and failed – fast forward, I was cooking at Oceanaire Seafood - there were all these 10 tops we had to cook for - one of the other chefs came over to me and told me what he was going to make and said he was gonna kick my ass. I didn't realize this was going to be a competition so I said let's do this and we went over the top, we had scroll menus, I wore a lion mask, announcing court jesters, it was great, everybody in the place said why can't I be sitting at the table! Then the management came up and asked, "I understand you have fire breathers?" I said no of course not, why would have fire breathers?! Next course, I said screw it and I had fire breathers come out. Fire was everywhere, everybody was losing it, next thing you know I was escorted out of the event 86'd forever. The next day Top Chef called and asked if I was the guy in the lion mask and brought fire breathers and if I would like to be on the show.

Are you still in touch with any of the other contestants? Yes! I just heard from Casey, Brooke, and Cat, all from the most recent season. Fabio is killing it, CJ is a dear friend, Stephanie is a new Iron Chef. We are like a fraternity when you do the food festivals you run into the who's who of the TV world and industry you get close to each other.

## Being on a highly rated television show is obviously a huge launching pad. How did you maximize it?

The early days of Top Chef were huge - everybody's watching and I took advice from Tom Coliccio. He said you guys are going to get famous after this show. So many chefs, they try to start their own gig... if you don't know how to run a restaurant don't do it until you're ready. I spent another year or two at the restaurant I was at — and then when I opened Searsucker I went in all heart and passion. They will come for your venue and food but they will return for your service, it's not just the food but the entire experience. Great team with a common direction.

## Do you have any other TV shows in the works now? Still judging Guys Grocery Games? What's next?

Lots of Grocery Games, but with the amount of restaurants we have going I am solely focusing on those. Until we get the right opportunity, we are focusing on the restaurant for now. We need to have the dream show to even consider stepping away what I am doing now.

What's your favorite ingredient to work with and why? Olive oil and lemon and bright herbs, they make you feel amazing.

#### What would we always find in your kitchen at home?

Simple cooking, I have kids, I can't do too much — avocado, citrus, good salt, I turned this grill into a smoker in overdrive a lot of the time. Tools: microplane, spoon and sharp knife.

#### What's the strangest dish you've ever eaten?

Rocky Mountain oysters! And I tried jellyfish the other day, it wasn't that bad.

#### What made you decide to open one in Hawaii?

Along with Hakkasan Group and the expansion of the brand we thought it was perfect to join Roy and Mina in Waikiki. It's a gathering place ----keeping the ingredients fresh.

What's most exciting about opening up a restaurant here? Being able to come visit! I love the ocean and the people here. I've made so many friends here over the years.

#### Will you be here often?

We have a direct flight from Hawaii from San Diego, I didn't think anywhere was better than Hawaii so you'll see me here often

#### What's on your must-do list while here in the Islands?

Go to Koko Head Café. Lee Anne Wong always gives me a list of secret spots, meet North Shore friends and visit, spend time in water, spearfishing and surfing — I have family on Maui and visit friends on Kauai.

What do you like to do most on your days off? Surfing, swimming, boating, tubing, basically just be in

water at all times.

#### Whole Fish Ceviche

Ingredients

1 whole 1 lb fish

Preferably onaga 2 oz. cilantro verde sauce

3 oz. chunky salsa 5 lime Supremes sliced fresno chili whole lime, just juice


Mari's micro greens Hawaii Kai sea salt half lemon wedge

**Clean the fish.** Remove the filets from the fish. De-bone. Slice the filet into bite size pieces. Set aside. Cut head and tail in halves down the middle vertically. On the plate, place the filet in a half moon fashion with the half head and fish tail

on each end. Start with the following: Lime juice, chunky salsa, sea salt, Then garnish with the following: Sliced fresno chili, Mari's micro greens, whole lime, just the juice, cilantro verde sauce, half lemon wedge, lime supremes





## DON HO

#### ELVIS MAY HAVE LEFT THE BUILDING BUT DON HO WILL BE WITH US FOREVER

Back in the day, every girl was in love with Don and everv boy wanted to be him. But Don Ho was simply an island boy who just wanted to sing, to entertain, to give the world some of his love for Hawaii. And he did. He held court at his mom's place, Honey's,

in Kaneohe until Kimo McVay enticed him to give the club called Duke Kahanamoku's in the International Marketplace a chance. Locals say he changed the face of music in Hawaii. The hotels and visitor industry folks credit him with making magic in Waikiki. Some called him a "destination", in every venue. He moved from Duke's to the Hilton Hawaiian Village Dome, to the Polynesian Palace, then to the Beachcomber for the last twelve years of his career. No matter when fans fell in love with Don, the legends of Duke's at the Marketplace are woven into the story.

Fast forward to the International Market Place of today. No more treehouse with a radio station wedged in the branches, no more pond with bad concrete and rusted pipes surrounded by carts where you could buy an oyster and find a pearl. The stores are glitz and glam - trendy for today's shopper. But if you look close you will see the essence. A bit like Avatar, the banyan tree is still there and it is healthy and sprouting new growth, thanks to the recent TLC it has received.

On August 13, which happens to be Uncle Don's birthday, a 110% life-size bronze sculpture of Don Ho will be unveiled at the base of that famous tree at the International Market Place. The unveiling will be at 1:30 p.m. and is open to the

public. Kahu Kordell Kekoa will present the blessing and a tribute performance will follow the inveiling from 4 to 6 p.m. performances from Melveen Leed, Marlene Sai, Nina Keali'iwaihamana and Kimo Kahoano. More entertainment will follow from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m., including Henry Kapono and Friends. Don's birthday anniversary will be topped off by sunset stories and a hula show.

Created by Kim Duffett, Hawaii's master of sculpting, this sculpture has been several years in the making. Funded and commissioned by the Properties, Taubman the \$100,000 statue was created after two years of research, courtesy of Don Ho Trust.

Duffett is also the artist/ sculptor that is behind the stunning dancers at the entrance of the Hilton Hawaiian Village, welcoming all to Waikiki. Inside the Hilton, he also created the sculptures of the famed crooner, Alfred Apaka and dancer Iolani Luawahine, and most recently, he created the Gabby Pahanui that was recently unveiled at the Waikiki Beach Walk. Don Ho will be his most recent artistic creation. The process of his work is exhausting just to hear about, but, lucky for Hawaii, this work is his passion.

Haumea Ho, Don's wife and producer of his shows for the last 21 years of his career, says she feels Don would appreciate the new International Market Place because he understood evolution and change. Don's son Dwight and daughter Dondi are joined by Ho's longtime pal, performer and producer Cha Thompson in their enthusiasm for the honor being paid to Don Ho.

Comments from Waikiki industry veterans who say they have "been around" since the old days are all positive. One Waikiki veteran (who asked to remain nameless) said "guests of a certain vintage ask about Don, tell me a story or two about one of

> their favorite moments at one of his showplaces and wish out loud that their kids and grand kids had seen 'the Don' at his finest', then often get tears in their eyes and turn away."

The sculpture depicts Don Ho with a microphone in one hand while he motions someone to come on stage with the other. The idea and conversations began in 2014. Duffett says next came hours of research, including watching Don Ho TV performances, old videos of the Hilton Hawaiian Village Dome performances and getting to know Don Ho and his career. This sculpture may become the photographed icon in all of Honolulu. Check it out. ~ Lynn
