Honolulu City Lights Celebrates 40 Years

Honolulu City Lights is one of Honolulu's most cherished holiday traditions. The City transforms Honolulu Hale into a winter wonderland with holiday decorations, Christmas lights, fun family activities, and a giant, decorated Christmas tree sits front and center.

month-long celebration. A 55-foot Cook Pine tree, donated on behalf of the Harbor Terrace Board of Directors, was installed in mid-November, and workers are feverishly decorating the tree with large, handmade, signature Honolulu City Lights ornaments. These aren't the ornaments you and I can buy to take home. These ornaments are the size of a small child! The result is breathtaking, and of course, Shaka Santa and Tutu Mele return to welcome the crowds as they arrive.

This year, the opening festivities will occur on Saturday, December 7. As in years before, the Honolulu City Lights kicks off with a block party starting at 4 p.m. on Punchbowl Street and across the Frank F. Fasi Civic Grounds. The Public Workers' Electric Light Parade begins at 6:15 p.m. from 'A'ala Park and heads down King Street, from River Street to Kawaiahao Street. As the parade passes Honolulu Hale around 6:30 p.m., Mayor Rick Blangiardi will officially light the tree and the lights and displays decorating the grounds, declaring O'ahu's iconic holiday celebration underway. keiki rides, and festive motifs lining Alapa'i and Beretania Streets. The new displays, donated by Mike Gangloff of Show Aloha Land and his sponsors, will bring a new level of "wow" to the

festivities.

While there, be sure to walk through the city employee-decorated tree exhibit, which includes a new entry this year from the Honolulu Ocean Safety Department. This year's theme for the department trees is Keiki Christmas Wonderland, as well as the 40th Anniversary Wreath Contest entries, also following a keiki theme, Christmas for the Keiki, and take a free photo with Santa in the Mission Memorial Auditorium from 7:30 - 9:30 p.m. Over a dozen food vendors will be on hand, offering a variety of goodies for sale to snack on throughout the evening.

If you're looking for a good spot to watch the parade, get there early. A large crowd gathers in front of Honolulu Hale to view the tree lighting program and the parade. Crowds also fill the sidewalks on both sides of King Street between Bishop and Punchbowl Streets. For those looking for a reserved seat, ten dollars will buy you a curbside seat to the parade from the grounds of Hawaiian Mission



ONKEE Executive Chef Jwi Ho Jang

Chef Jwi Ho Jang was born in Daegu, Korea, and moved to Japan to study before landing a dream job with a three-starred Michelin restaurant, whose chef is committed to precision and tradition, and dedicates himself to nurturing younger chefs. Calling the chef his mentor, Chef Jang took those lessons to heart and has risen quickly in the restaurant world. Moving to Hawaii to open ONKEE, the restaurant strives to provide impeccable service, down to the servers handling the grill, and offer authentic, home-style cuisine, crafted with passion.

Tell us a bit about yourself?

I am originally from South Korea and became interested in becoming a chef after watching a cooking cartoon as a child.

What was your first job in the industry? I started my career at a Kaiseki restaurant.

Where did you study culinary arts?

I studied at the Tsuji Culinary Institute in Osaka, Japan, focusing on Japanese cuisine.

Who would you consider your mentor?

My mentor is Chef Matsuo Hideaki from the first restaurant I worked at, as he not only taught me cooking techniques but also guided me on how to live as a chef.

Where did you work before coming here?

Pork Belly with Green Onion Salad

Ingredients

80gGreen Onion5gVinegar5gSugar5gSesame Oil5gChili Pepper Powder130gPork Belly

Directions: Slice green onions vertically as thin as you can. Soak sliced green onions in cold water for 5 minutes. Drain water and shake green onions dry. Mix sugar, chili, vinegar and sesame oil in a separate bowl to make salad dressing. Pour dressing onto green onions and mix well. Set aside. Heat your wok or pan with 1 tablespoon vegetable oil until just smoking, and add the pork belly. Stir fry the pork belly, turning down the heat to medium and cooking the pork until just crispy and browned (about 6 minutes). Remove the crispy pork belly from the wok and set aside. Season with salt as needed. Enjoy!




