Cascade Cliffs and Barbera go hand and hand. We have built our brand and reputation in the wine industry around this Italian varietal, introducing scores of wine lovers around the country to it. This relationship began back in the early 90s when our first Barbera vines were planted on our property. Eventually, we figured out ways to improve this wine, both in the vineyard and winery, creating darker, richer, and more intense examples of Barbera. Our Barbera was the first Italian varietal in the Pacific NW to win the vaunted Best of the Best award, and has continued to win multiple awards throughout the years. More importantly, our Barbera has brought great joy and satisfaction to our customers for nearly three decades now. This cult following was the catalyst to creating The Barbera Club.



The **2026 Spring Barbera Club** allotment contains three distinct styles of our Barbera. The Estate Barbera is a more traditional version, intensely bright and more similar to Italian Barbera wines. The Blood Red is our “fruit bomb”, shamelessly rich and powerful. And the Winemaker’s Select falls somewhere in between the other two. Despite these differences, all three of these wines are mouth-watering and absolutely delicious!

Here is the club allotment:

- 3 bottles of the 2024 Blood Red Barbera. Retail = \$90/bottle.
- 3 bottles of the 2024 Estate Barbera. Retail = \$85/bottle.
- 6 bottles of the 2024 Winemaker's Select Barbera. Retail = \$85/bottle.

2024 Blood Red Barbera

Varietals: 100% Barbera

Vineyard: 100% McKinley Springs

Appellation: Horse Heaven Hills

Aging: 12 months in American Oak

Cases produced: 320

Profile: Made from the legendary Block 11 section of McKinley Springs Vineyard in the Horse Heaven Hills AVA, this is Barbera at its richest and ripest. The fruit is powerful and jammy on the attack, encompassing and focused on the mid-palate, and long-lasting on the finish. Creamy and luscious flavors of black cherry preserves, sun-drenched berries, and warm maple are followed by a finish that goes on and on. At 17.7 % ABV, our 2024 Blood Red Barbera is not for the weak of heart or the timid.

Profile: Here's a curveball for all you lovers of Cascade Cliffs Barbera. This is a Barbera made from two specific McKinley Springs vineyard blocks, resulting in a rich, fruit-forward style. Yet, it still shows hints of a traditional Barbera, and is not quite as "jammy" as our Blood Red Barbera. Warm flavors of cherry preserves are followed by a vibrant, mouth-watering finish. The 12 months in barrel give this wine added structure and subtle nuances of toasty aroma and flavor. Here is another classic version of our signature grape and wine, delicious now, but well-suited to age in the bottle.

Aging: 12 months in American Oak

Profile: Our latest Estate Barbera hearkens back to a more traditional style of Barbera, freshly bright and zippy, yet still fruity and intense. Mouth-watering flavors of cran-cherry and fresh raspberry are accentuated by a lingering, toasty finish. This might be our most balanced and varietally-correct version of Barbera to date.
