Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord



Today we find magi from the east following a strangely bright star in the desert. Perhaps you have a *star* in your life right now that is God's way of prompting you to take an unexpected journey to an unknown destination. Your star may be something wonderful or maybe something hurtful. Whatever it is, let God guide you, as the star guided the magi on a God-ordained journey. It may be an inner adventure of your soul trying to find God. The gifts you bear may be humility, suffering, praise or joy, all equally acceptable to God. Like the Magi, you will find yourself in the presence of our loving God, the perfect Light!

What gifts do you bring to Jesus?

Next Sunday's Readings - January 10, 2021 Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 Acts 10:34-38 Mark 1:7-11

Our Christmas season concludes with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus was not baptized because he needed to repent — rather; He was revealing who He is and what He came to do.

It is from His mission that we can receive the sacrament of baptism — when we become adopted sons and daughters of God. From that moment, we belong to Christ — we become His stewards. Our lives should be a reflection of this relationship. The way we live should reveal who we are.

In our First Reading, the prophet Isaiah shares a message of hope, "Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy?" We should ask ourselves, "Who is the king of our hearts?" As Christian stewards, it should be God. We often fill our lives with things that satisfy us only for a moment. If we truly do belong to Christ, then we will make Him our top priority. What we fill our lives with should reveal that He is King.

In our Gospel, Mark reveals the intimate relationship between God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus and God the Father proclaimed, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." We, too, have access to an intimate relationship with God. But like all good relationships, it flourishes with effort. How we spend our time and share our gifts says a great deal about who we are.



Income Tax Reporting for 2020 -2021 Contributions

Rule #1: The General Rule

The income tax regulations specify, "ordinarily, a contribution is made at the time delivery is effected. The unconditional delivery or mailing of a check, which subsequently clears in due course, will constitute an effective contribution on the date of delivery or mailing." According to this language, a check dated December 31, 2020, but physically delivered in January 2021 is deductible only on the donor's 2020 federal tax return. This is so even though a donor backdates a check to read "December 31, 2020" during church services conducted in January 2021, or in fact completed and dated the check on December 31, 2020, but deposited it on or after January 1, 2021.

Rule #2: The Exception

Envelopes

The only exception to the general rule is a check that is dated and mailed (and postmarked) in December 2020. The fact that the church does not receive or cash the check until January 2021 does not prevent the donor from deducting it on his or her 2020 federal tax return. These rules are summarized in the following table.






Mass for Life

Reconciliation: Saturdays at 4PM or call the rectory to schedule an appointment. (Effective 10/10/2020)

Marriage: Preparation should ordinarily begin at least one year in advance. However, a minimum of six months is needed for adequate preparation. To begin the process, please call Barbara, ext. 115.

Homebound Ministry: To schedule a Eucharist minister to bring communion to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory at ext. 111.

Anointing of the Sick: For those who suffer from serious illness, or before surgery. Please call the Rectory for an appointment, ext. 111.

Funerals: Final arrangements are made with the cooperation of the mortuary and St. Ann. It is customary to call the Rectory <u>before completing</u> <u>arrangements</u>. Diocesan policy requires that the Mass of Christian Burial be celebrated in the parish church.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Are you or someone you know interested in becoming a Catholic? If so, please call the Rectory, ext. 111.

Religious Resource Center: Open after Sunday morning Masses or call the dectory at 247-3092, ext. 111 for an appointment.
