Course Overview

This course is designed to meet the DOT Hazardous Materials Transportation training requirements. The Department of Transportation (49 CFR 172.704) makes training mandatory for almost anyone who handles hazardous materials, regardless of the amount. This affects employees who select or fill hazardous materials packages, label containers, complete shipping papers, load or unload vehicles, transportation / load hazardous materials, or operate vehicles used in the transport of hazardous materials.

You will learn about:

Prerequisite: While there are no prerequisites for this DOT HazMat Transportation Course, this course has been modified to include the newest information and changes from GHS 2013 (Globally Harmonized System) so that all materials are GHS Compliant. If you have NOT completed a course on transitioning to GHS (as required by OSHA) on or before the compliance deadline of December 1, 2013, Compliance Solutions offers a comprehensive online course to meet this requirement.

Intended Audience

This IASHEP Certified DOT Hazardous Materials Transportation Technician Course is intended for the following:.

Course Topics:

- Identify the basic hazmat hazard classes and divisions and understand their associated hazards;
- Use the hazmat table to locate proper shipping names, identification numbers, hazard classes, packaging and labeling requirements, and more;
- Complete shipping papers for hazardous materials;
- Demonstrate the proper use of markings, labels, and placards; and
- Describe the differences in packagings and which types of packagings are appropriate for specific hazardous materials.

Testing:

Students completing the course must take a proctored final exam. A score of 80% on the final exam is necessary to receive your personalized certificate of completion. The student gets three (3) attempts to pass the course.
