#### Eligible Properties

- 1) Owner Occupied, Primary Residences, no Second Homes
- 2) Single Family Residences, One to Four Unit Dwellings, Condos and Townhomes.

#### ADOH Assistance Loan Terms

- 1) \$100,000 Max Loan/ Assistance Amount
- 2) All loans are zero percent interest with no monthly payment
- 3) 5 and /or 30 year loan term depending on assistance type
- 4) Loan is satisfied (forgiven) at the end of the term and upon successful completion of the program

#### Principle Reduction Assistance: Permanent Mortgage Modification or Recast/Refinance Contribution

- 1) Assistance of up to \$100,000 (including all other program assistance).
- 2) Principle Reduction Contribution is provided on approved Recast and other similar eligible refinances
- 3) Principle Reduction Assistance requires servicer / lender participation.

#### Second Mortgage Settlements

- 1) Extinguishment assistance available up to \$60,000.

#### Unemployment / Underemployment (Reinstatement) Mortgage Assistance (UMA)

- 1) Assistance up to \$100,000. (including all other program assistance)
- 2) Max amount of monthly UMA assistance of \$2000, to a max term of 12 months.  
Homeowners are required to contribute 31% of their income toward the first mortgage payment.
- 3) Reinstatement assistance may bring the first mortgage current by curing all past due payments.  
Including accrued interest, late fees, NSF fees and any legal fees. The maximum number of payments rescued is 12 when upfront reinstatement is combined with UMA. If reinstated is a stand alone program component the twelve month cap does not apply.
- 4) Reinstatement assistance is available up to \$60,000.

#### Eligibility

- Properties that have been used for cash-out are eligible if current mortgage(s) do not exceed 150% of the original purchase price.
- The homeowner must document a 10% or greater reduction of income
- Assistance provided on First Mortgages that are less than \$500,000
- The homeowners current mortgage payment(s) is equal or greater than 31% of the borrower's gross, pre tax monthly income.
- Homeowner must be current on their mortgage provided they are at risk for default. Otherwise, homeowner must be 2 payments past due.
- Homeowner must be no less than 30 days from Trustee Sale Date.
- The household must have gross income of no more than 150% of the area median income for Maricopa county. The figures below reflect 150% of the area median income by household size.

Current lease (Clients name on lease. Landlord may not be a relative) and late notice.

Identification for everyone in household.

All bills, especially utility bills and delinquent or shutoff notices, even if just helping with rent.

Proof of all income (child support, employment, social security, food stamps, cash assistance, unemployment, etc).

At least one adult in the home must have at least a part-time job with pay stubs.

Proof of recent crisis/setback (within past 2 mos). Hospital bills, car repair bills, loss of job / new job, etc.
