

THE ORIGIN OF THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

Most people are familiar with the Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christ-mas". To many, it's a delightful nonsense rhyme set to music. But it had quite a serious purpose when it was written.

It is a good deal more than just a repetitious melody with pretty phrases and a list of strange gifts.

Catholics in England during the period from 1558 to 1829, when Parliament finally emancipated Catholics in England, were prohibited from any practice of their faith by law-private OR public. It was a crime to even BE a Catholic. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England as one of the "Catechism songs" to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith—a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in writing indicating adherence to the Catho—

lic faith could not only get you imprisoned, it could get you tortured and killed.

The Song's gifts are hidden meanings to the teachings of the faith. The "true love" mentioned in the song doesn't refer to an earthly suitor, it refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The "partridge in a pear tree" is partridge which feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings, much in memory of the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered thee under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but though wouldst not have it so..."

The other symbols mean the following:

Two Turtle Doves: The Old and New Testament

Three French Hens: Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological virtues

Four Calling Birds: the four Gospels and/or the four Evangelists

Five Golden Rings: The first five books of the Old Testament, the

"Pentateuch", which give the history of man's fall

from grace

Six Geese A-Laying: the six days of creation

Seven Swans A-Swimming: the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven

Sacraments

Eight Maids A-Milking: the eight Beatitudes

Nine Ladies Dancing: the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit

Ten Lords A-Leaping the Ten Commandments

Eleven Pipers Piping the eleven faithful Apostles

Twelve Drummers Drumming: the twelve point of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed
