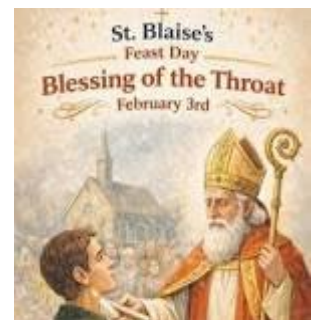

Feast of St. Blaise

Tuesday, 2/3

6:00PM Mass

Father will offer the Blessing of St. Blaise to everyone after the Mass.

The Feast Day of Saint Blaise, the patron saint of throat ailments and wool combers, is celebrated on **February 3rd** in the Latin Church, with a special [Throat Blessing](#) tradition using crossed candles to commemorate his healing miracles, especially saving a boy from choking on a fish bone.

Key Traditions:

Throat Blessing: Priests use two crossed candles (**often blessed on Candlemas**) to touch the throats of the faithful while reciting a prayer for deliverance from illness.

Candles: The blessing involves candles, symbolizing Saint Blaise's promise that those who light a candle in his memory would be free from infection.

Miracles: The day recalls his legendary healing powers, particularly the story of the choking boy and a wolf returning a stolen pig.

Why February 3rd?

It marks the traditional date for commemorating the life and martyrdom of St. Blaise, a 4th-century bishop from Armenia/Turkey.

Celebration:

Many Catholic parishes offer the blessing after Mass on or around February 3rd. It's a popular day for seeking intercession for throat and respiratory health.

Use Caution

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's reading is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which is found in Matthew's Gospel. The form of the Beatitudes found here is not unique to Jesus. Beatitudes are found in the Old Testament, in the psalms, and in wisdom literature, for example. They are a way to teach about who will find favor with God.

We quickly note in this reading that the people whom Jesus calls "blessed" and "happy" are not people we think of as blessed or happy . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. This Gospel is one of reversals. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness. "Blessed" is sometimes translated as *happy, fortunate, or favored*. In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favor is upon those who are poor, those who mourn, those who are persecuted. This news might have been welcome—and surprising—to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. By referring to the good things that the faithful will experience, Matthew reminds us that those who act in the manner described in the Beatitudes will find their reward with God.
