



The Cross: A Sign of God's Love

The Cross is a symbol of Christ's sacrifice and our redemption. Jesus willingly died on the Cross to save us from our sins. He took on the suffering we deserved and offered His life for us. Through His death, He opened the way to eternal life. The Cross reminds us of this great act of love and mercy. The Cross also represents forgiveness. Jesus forgave those who crucified Him, saying, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). His death was an act of forgiveness for the whole world. When we look at the Cross, we see how much God is willing to forgive us, no matter what we have done.

The Cross gives us hope. Even though it was a tool of suffering and death, Jesus turned it into a sign of victory. His resurrection shows that death is not the end. By carrying our own crosses, we are united with Jesus and can share in His victory. The Cross tells us that no matter how hard our struggles are, there is always hope in Christ. Catholics venerate the Cross in daily life and in liturgy. We make the Sign of the Cross when we pray. We display crosses in our homes and churches. During Mass, the priest raises the Cross, reminding us of Christ's sacrifice. The Cross is a central part of our faith, and through it, we remember God's love and the promise of eternal life.
