We sign this doorway with four crosses and the numerals of the new year. [20 + C + M + B + 23]Let us pray: May Christ bless this house! ALL: Amen! Each room of the house is sprinkled with holy water. Living room: Where two or three are gathered in *your name*, Lord, you are present. Bless this room. O Lord. ALL: Amen! Kitchen: Give us this day our daily bread. Bless this room. O Lord. ALL: Amen! Dining room: Prepare us for the heavenly banquet. Bless this room, O Lord. ALL: Amen! Bedrooms: Stay with us Lord, when night has come. Bless this room. O Lord. ALL: Amen! Bathroom: Cleanse us from all sin. Bless this room, O Lord. ALL: Amen! All return to the front door to pray together. Leader: Let us pray as Jesus taught 115. Our Father . . . The leader sprinkles all present with holy water. Bless this household through all days to come,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, forever and ever. ALL: Amen!


