

FAMILIAR INSIGHTS

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than

words." A fresh new insight? Hardly. Paul tells the Philippians that he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A

novel idea? I don't think so. In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?



The Holy Eucharist

You may have seen it once in your lifetime. The Host, the Body of Our Lord Jesus Christ, dropped to the floor. Some might consider the Host as merely a symbol of Christ when in actuality it is truly the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread and wine. At the point in the Mass that is called the Consecration, the priest acting in the person of Christ will say "This is my Body, This is my Blood". These were the words of our Savior when He turned the bread and the wine into His Body and Blood

during the Last Supper. Look closely at the picture above. Picture this during the Mass when the Consecration is taking place. And you will come to realize just how reverent and protective we should be towards that small piece of bread offered to us during Holy Communion. And then the Host may get dropped. It happens. Especially now with the process of everyone having to wear a mask to church! It's awkward, let's face it. That is why Father Damian wants to give us some instruction when this happens.

If a Host should fall to the floor, the communicant or minister should pick it up and consume it immediately. Unfortunately with our current pandemic such is not the case. The minister or communicant should pick it up reverently and place it in a cloth and wipe away any particles that may have been left on the floor. If the floor where the Host fell is not wiped clean then those particles of our Lord

Jesus Christ are walked upon and distributed throughout the church, the parking lot etc. To dispose of a Host, the Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic Minister must dissolve it in water to the point where the host no longer has the appearance of bread. This may require that the host be broken up in small pieces prior to placing it in water. It is necessary to wait for the host to be fully soaked in water, out of respect for what once contained the presence of Christ and in order to avoid any danger or appearance of a host being discarded or profaned. The liquid should be poured down the Sacrarium (a special sink located in our Sacristy with a drain going directly into the ground, not the sewer). It should not be poured down a common sink. So with all that in mind let's try to remember just how important and how blessed we are to be able to receive the Sacrament of Communion each and every time we celebrate Mass. And show our upmost respect and reverence for what it truly is. The Body of our Lord and Savior!



SAINT THÉRÈSE OF THE CHILD JESUS (1873-1897) October 1

"The cornerstone's dated 1872, but the stained glass is much later," explained the pastor, astonished when his visitor accurately

dated it to just before the Great Depression, explaining, "The window for the Little Flower"—Thérèse's nickname—"gives it away." From her canonization in 1925, her statues and windows adorn most churches where European immigrants worshiped. Entering Carmel at fifteen, victim of tuberculosis at twenty-four, Thérèse proposed her "Little Way" to sanctity: doing ordinary tasks with extraordinary love. Thus ordinary Catholics, many of whom had lost loved ones to tuberculosis, embraced her. Though she never left her cloister, this Carmelite's spiritual

communion and devoted correspondence with missionaries earned her the title

Patroness of Missions. Her autobiography, Story of a Soul, continuously in print since her death, chronicles her prayerful perseverance through doubt and caused her to be the youngest person ever named a Doctor of the Church. Countless physical healings and spiritual conversions testify to her fulfillment of her deathbed promise: "After my death, I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good upon earth!"

Written by Pope St. John Paul II, this prophetic document passionately reaffirmed the Church's constant teaching on the value and sacredness of every human life. May we always strive to "see in every hman face the face of Christ" and treat each person as we would treat Christ Himself.
