#	Topic	Components and Statements
1	Prayer	<i>Father, in the Name of Jesus, By You, Holy Spirit, please Protect, Anoint, Inspire and Direct (PAID) us in this meeting and in the overall work of the Hub.</i>
2	Divide	We recognize that there is a Spiritual Divide between Love and evil, and between truth and lies.
3	Success	Because of the Divide, we recognize that we need Jesus and Our Father to lead us in order to succeed.
4	Beliefs	All beliefs are welcome, but please know we do meet under the Protection and Direction of Jesus Christ.
5	Block Cooperation	There are political groups that function as a block, in which most, if not all, are cooperating with central controls.
6	Individuals	There are political perspectives that support individual freedoms and independence; coordinating these individuals can be like herding cats.
7	Fragmented	Because of the importance of individuality and independence, the work of freedom can be fragmented.
8	Hub	The Hub offers a way to organize and coordinate individuals and the work of freedom.
9	Community	The Hub facilitates building a community of individuals who want truth and freedom in all aspects of life and government.
10	Easy Actions	Our community uses “easy actions,” simple activities that will develop a network for sharing truth that is based on primary sources.
11	Collect Info	We invite individuals, as they follow their interests, to watch for and collect information on a topic.
12	Primary Sources	We invite these individuals to make note of primary sources regarding the information.
13	Reports	These individuals are invited to report at our monthly community meeting.
14	Website	This information is added to our website for easy access.
15	Distribution	This information is also put into a monthly “Pocket Page,” which is a convenient handout; the information may also be distributed by emails and through social media.

16	Network	Each individual of the Hub is invited to distribute the information to 10 people.
17	10 Tell 10	If these 10 also tell 10, and they tell 10, we will exponentially build our community.
18	Disruption	If the meeting is disrupted, we will sing and pray.
19	Speaking	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. At this time, we review the Pocket Page information from the previous meeting. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. The Pocket Page is reviewed. 2. At this time, we invite those who are reporting on a topic to speak. 3. We use Protected Speaking, meaning we do not interrupt the speaker. 4. We also use Timed speaking, giving each speaker equal time. 5. Each individual will have up to _____ minutes to speak <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. We consider the number of people, divided by the time available. b. Please honor the time frame so that all have an equal opportunity to speak. 6. We will begin with a volunteer and go in a circle. 7. After all reports are in, we invite open share. We continue to use Protected Speaking and Timed Speaking. We also ask each person, if they would like to speak, to raise a hand and wait to be called on by the Facilitator.
