1.00	Foundations	Foundational Perspectives	
1.01	Spirituality	We are in a spiritual war between good and evil, truth and lies.	
1.02	Spirituality	Because we are in a spiritual war, we know that the only way to succeed is to place ourselves under the Protection and Direction of Jesus Christ; we include Him in all of our efforts and strive to submit to His Lordship and Leadership in all that we do.	
1.03	Spirituality	The spiritual war can be understood within the spiritual battles that are taking place in each topic that we will cover in the Hub; in each topic we are seeking and sharing truth and dismantling lies.	
1.04	Truth and Lies	We seek to expose the lies and distribute truth for all topics and all situations so all people can effectively understand the topic, the intricacies of government, and so that they will be fully informed when they, if they are citizens, vote.	
1.05	Coordination	There are political coalitions that function as a block, all members willing to obey those who tell them what to do in order to aggregate and keep power.	
1.06	Coordination	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Those of us who love, want and support Truth, cherish and would encourage individuality and independence in everyone, and so, we are creating an organization that supports the individuality of each person while facilitating unity and well-coordinated actions. Coordinating individuals can be like managing cats. Using this metaphor, observing cat lovers, we: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> love each other unconditionally accept each other trusting God is transforming each of us to His Best provide good nutrients (information) make gentle accommodation (i.e. providing a scratching post so the cats don't damage the furniture...providing communication tools so that we don't scratch each other!). 	
1.07	Funds	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> If money's involved, so is the government. If money's involved, so are the greed mongers. We don't take donations but we do welcome the sharing of costs. 	

1.08	Paradigms	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The paradigms in political circles is to use, ads, emails, mailers, and meetings, much of which needs money, to get the word out to the public about an issue or candidate 2. The Hub introduces a different paradigm, creating a network that includes impassioned researchers, who find truth based on primary sources, and by facilitating the distribution of this information to everyone in our circles—and so, getting the word out. 	
1.09	Information	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. It has been reported (we need a primary source for this) that, of those who voted in Massachusetts in 2024, 43% voted for Trump. 2. Generally, citizens get their information from mainstream media and social media. 3. These sources can be biased, often giving only headlines with a few points, and it is often unclear if the information is based on primary sources. 4. In the Hub, we invite those with a passion for a topic to do thorough research on that topic, in order to get to facts that are based on primary sources. 5. This information is then aggregated on the topic page of the Freedom Hub website (in development) so that anyone, especially citizens, may access the information at any time. 6. This information is also headlined with links and brought to the Hub to be compiled for distribution. 7. The information, as part of the Hub, is then put into a monthly Pocket Page for distribution. 8. This compiled information can travel out to others using the Pocket Pages, or in any form, but we do encourage that the information is given within a relationship, whether face to face or with a phone call. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Because information often flows to us in a flood, to have a friend or associate highlight a fact and its primary source can strengthen the information. b. Relating while informing can prepare the Receiver to better accept the information. c. The relationship will better prepare the person to receive further updates, and, perhaps, encourage them to become willing to share with others as it has been modelled to them. 	
1.10	Beliefs	All beliefs are welcome, but know we meet under the Protection and Direction of Jesus Christ.	
1.10	Meetings	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Please know, those of all beliefs are welcome, as we would willingly expose all of our information to anyone and everyone, but also know that we meet under the Protection and Direction of Jesus Who is The Christ. 2. We meet once a month, and may meet more often as we near an election. 3. We are open to the public. 4. We use a format to make best use of the time. 	

		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. We begin with prayer to place all that we do under the Lordship and Leadership of Jesus. 6. We distribute the Pocket Page that has been compiled from information shared at the previous meeting, and we review these headlines, offering enough Pocket Pages so Carriers may take them to distribute them. 7. Using Timed Speaking, we then invite the Topic Team members to report on any new information for their topic, as we invite participants to meet with team facilitators if they are interested in becoming part of that team. 8. After all the reports are in, if there is enough time, we then use Timed Speaking as we go around the room, inviting all participants to headline additional topics or concerns not yet covered. 9. We close with prayer. 10. We remain available after the meeting for continued conversations, networking and planning.

2.00	Beliefs	Spirituality, religion, discipleship and politics are based on beliefs, which can, but need not, lead to volatile discussions.	
2.00	Churches	Many churches have been compromised away from truth by nefarious forces that have worked to co-opt believers for political purposes.	
2.00	Churches	Churches often avoid controversies out of fear of losing patrons, and so may lose clarity and truth.	
2.00	Coordination	The Hub approach can build a /Citizens First Coalition\ community of truth.	
2.00	Divide	There are nefarious forces that seek to keep us divided.	
2.00	Divide	The real divide is not between parties and political affiliations; the real divide is between truth and lies.	
2.00	Easy Actions	Because citizens are busy with work and family, we are creating easy actions that get the truth out to our loved ones, and to our circles, and that can build a community based on truth.

2.00	Evil	Those who do evil hate truth because it exposes their evil deeds.	
2.00	Evil	One strategy of evil is to accuse those who are believers and those who are carriers of Truth.	
2.00	Evil	A strategy of evil is to divide people.	
2.00	Evil	We assess people by their actions—do they align with the God of Truth or the father of lies.	
2.00	Focus	Our f\Focus is on truth about topics and people—what are the facts on topics, and what do people not only (they) say, but what do they (and) do.

2.00	Government	We are a Republic, the foundation of which is to governed by the equal and fair application of the law; if the law is flouted or misused, we lose our freedom and equality.	
2.00	Labels	Labels can mislead, can be prejudicial and misleading; we set labels aside and focus on the truth in all situations.
