## P—Freedom Teams—Elections—Steps and Vulnerabilities (7)

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Strategy: educate the populace to contact legislators to simplify, or vote in new legislators

The number of details that are part of managing an election is massive.

The more complicated the process is, the more likely mistakes will be made and the integrity will be lessened.

Bolded entries indicate when others are touching the process.

In the hands of others...

There are over 100 steps in voting; (\_\_\_\_) times your vote\ballot is in the hands of other people

Vote By Mail adds at least 40 steps, many of which are vulnerable.
