1. Title 1—Committee on Agriculture, page 1, 2

- a. Subtitle A—Nutrition
 - i. SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
 - ii. Applies requirements to 55 and under; previously 65 and under
 - iii. Changes for Abled-Bodies Adults with dependents from under 18 years to under 7
 - iv. Changes to waivers to be determined by national unemployment rate, not area unemployment rate
 - v. Removes provision to allow state exemption if that area does not have sufficient jobs
 - vi. Changes state exemption of 8% from work requirements to 1%
 - vii. Prohibit household internet costs from being used to compute shelter expense
 - viii. Changes state matching amounts: 6% to 15%; 8% to 20%; 10% to 25%
 - ix. Increases states share of administrative costs from 50% to 75%
 - x. Changes to work requirements from age of 15 years to 60 years to 17 to 65
 - xi. (10009) Prevents multiple issuances of other federal and state program benefits
 - xii. (10010) Change in calculations of error from \$56 or less to \$0
 - xiii. Eliminates the Obesity Prevention Grant program
 - xiv. Limits benefits to citizens or those with some legal status, not illegal aliens
 - xv. Extends funding for food banks through 2031
- b. Subtitle B—Investment in Rural America
 - i. Amends and extends commodity support programs—many details
 - ii. (10103) Directs USDA to encourage expansion into foreign markets.
 - iii. Mandatory funding through 2027 and each year thereafter
 - iv. (10104) authorizes and provides funding for research initiatives—examples, including black colleges and universities
 - v. (10105) Extends and modifies Secure Rural Schools program—many details

2. Title 1—Committee on Armed Services

- a. Additional funding for the Department of Defense
 - i. Temporary lodging expense for servicemembers undergoing permanent change of station
 - ii. Additional funding for shipbuilding
 - iii. Additional funding for the development of space-based missile intercept capabilities, space-based sensors, ground based defense systems
 - iv. Additional funding for various weapons systems
 - v. Multiple sections of additional funding
 - vi. Authorizing activities such as construction, military family housing, and land acquisition
 - vii. Requires a spending plan and expenditure reports

- a. Various changes to higher education, particularly to federal student loan system
- b. Subtitle A—Student Eligibility
 - i. Revises citizenship categories

- ii. Changes calculation to looking at all institutions, rather than cost of a specific program
 - iii. Restores exemption for certain family farms and small businesses
 - c. Subtitle B—Loan Limits
 - i. Terminates ability of undergraduate and graduate students to receive loans with exemption of students already enrolled
 - ii. Adjustments to Parent Plus loans—must have taken out maximum annual unsubsidized load amount
 - iii. Limits overall amount of borrowing to \$200,000
