# What does LCM mean to our first-year students?



My name is **Hannah Roberts**, and I am from First Lutheran Church in Ellicott City, Maryland. I am a freshman in the honors program at the University of Delaware, and I am majoring in electrical engineering. My involvement in LCM was inevitable; church has always been an important part of my life. When I joined during my first month of college, I was greeted with open arms and instantly felt at home. As I finish up my first semester, I can easily say that Tuesdays are my favorite day of the week, and I cherish every second of dinner and worship. Everyone that is a part of LCM has been nothing but loving and caring,

and I am very grateful for their support and friendship.

I began my involvement in the church when I was five years old and joined the children's choir, where I began to learn about Lutheranism and hymns. By the time I was confirmed, I was soloing for church every week as a part of the Seraphim choir, playing my clarinet, or cantoring. Music was a large part of my church, and I earned my Girl Scout Silver Award by teaching young Sunday school students about offering your gifts up to God.
