

2021 E-Liquid Regulation Changes

A person may only sell a manufacturer sealed electronic cigarette substance that is compliant with the established standards and requirements set forth in Utah Administrative Rule R384-415.

Manufacturer Sealed Substance

- Also known as cartridges or pods (e.g. Juul, Myblu, NJoy, Leap, Vuse, glas, etc.)
- These current 2021 changes to R384-415, as outlined below, **ONLY** apply to these sealed substances



Non-Manufacturer Sealed Substance

- These are bottles of e-liquids
- These substances **still follow the existing R384-415 and still CANNOT exceed 3% nicotine by weight per container, or 24 mg/mL concentration of nicotine**



BEGINNING JULY 1, 2021 MANUFACTURER SEALED SUBSTANCES MUST FOLLOW:



Nicotine Content

- **CANNOT** exceed 5% nicotine by weight per container
- or **EXCEED** a 59 mg/mL concentration of nicotine

Labeling:

- If product contains nicotine, label must include: "WARNING: This product contains nicotine. Nicotine is an addictive chemical."



Packaging:

- Must be in original packaging
- **CANNOT** be repacked
- **CANNOT** be refilled if it is not intended to be opened by a retailer or consumer

Prohibited Sales:

CANNOT sell if labeled as containing:

- Additives that create impression of a health benefit
- Additives associated with energy and vitality
- Illegal or controlled substances
- Additives having coloring properties for emissions
