Executive Director's Message

The mission of Captain Avery Museum is to celebrate the diversity of our community and engage it in activities that explore connections to the Chesapeake Bay through the prism of our historic home and waterfront property.

Our vision is to be a community center celebrating the culture of the Bay – past, present and future – around three themes: **Water as Livelihood in the 19th Century**; as **Recreation in the 20th Century**; and as a focus for **Environmental Stewardship in the 21st Century**.

Events are how the Captain Avery Museum provides an important service to the community. 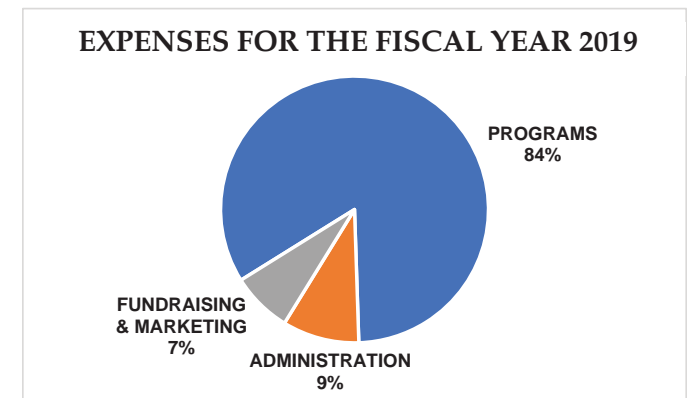
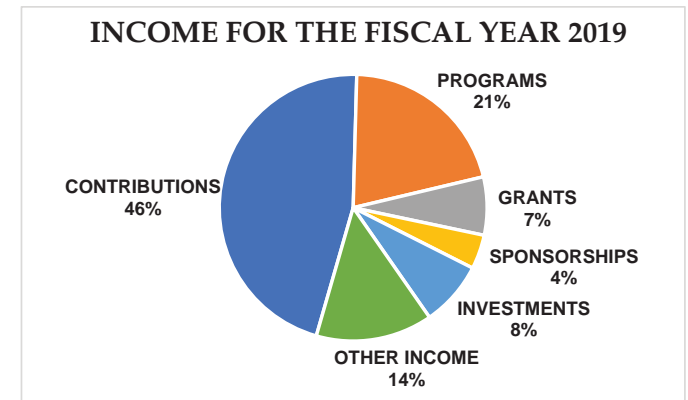
