National Spotlight – H.R. 38: Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act

Status: Introduced in Congress (119th Session)

Summary: H.R. 38 proposes nationwide recognition of concealed carry permits, allowing a permit

issued in one state to be valid in all others.

Impact: If enacted, it would allow California CCW holders to carry in other states, and potentially allow

out-of-state permit holders to carry in California.

Current Reality: The bill has not passed; there is no national reciprocity law in effect. **Instructor Note:** Out-of-state permits are not currently recognized in California.

California Update – AB 1127: Semi-Automatic Pistol / "Glock-Type" Ban

Status: Signed into Law (Effective July 1, 2026)

Summary: AB 1127 prohibits licensed firearm dealers from selling or transferring certain striker-fired semi-automatic pistols that can be easily converted to automatic weapons.

Impact: Current owners and CCW holders are unaffected. Lawful possession and carry of existing Glock-type pistols remain legal. Private-party transfers remain lawful through licensed dealers under DROS and background-check requirements.

Instructor Note: Carrying a lawfully owned Glock remains valid under current California law.
