Last year, this included events such as fundraisers with local vendors and Humorology, the flagship philanthropy effort for Greek life at Madison. Every year, fraternities and sororities pair up to put on an original musical, practicing throughout the year while also raising money for the cause. Last year Humo raised 210,000 dollars, a new record for the philanthropic show. Last year, Acacia paired up with Delta Gamma and Alpha Gamma Rho to put on a fantastic show that ended up placing in the top five. This year, we are working with Kappa Kappa Gamma, Alpha Chi Omega, and Beta Theta Pi with our sights setonfirst place, in terms of both our show and fundraising!

Other than Humorology, our chapter has big plans for keeping human service as one of the main

cornerstones for our fraternity. We are working with Kappa Alpha Theta to have a joint philanthropy bake sale, showing that the men of Acacia can not onlybe scholars but also culinary extraordinaries. The Foundation has also implemented an award plan based on the amount of gifts an individual has made, or will make to the Acacia Fraternity Foundation (remember this is a charitable donation):

1. The Hypotenuse Club: \$5,000 contributed to AFF over lifetime.

The name comes from the prominent role of the hypotenuse in the Pythagorean Theorem (the square of the hypotenuse is equal to the sum of the squares of the other two sides).

2. The Sons of the 47th: \$10,000 contributed to AFF over lifetime.

The name refers to Euclid's 47th Proposition, which of course is also commonly presented as the Pythagorean Theorem.

3. The Semicircle of Pythagoras: This is an unpublished contribution level reserved for major contributors, i.e., \$50,000 contributed over lifetime, with the amount to be adjusted at discretion of the Foundation based on circumstances.

In 520 B.C., Pythagoras formed a school in Samos known as the "semicircle" of Pythagoras.

4. Evergreen Society: AFF is named in estate plans.

The Evergreen Society is an existing recognition level that recognizes those who include AFF in their estate plans.
