## **Great Day of Service**

On Sunday, October 5, we will have our annual Great Day of Service. On this Sunday, we will have a brief service in the sanctuary. This day is World Communion Sunday, and our brief service will include communion. We will then spend the morning doing service projects – we will worship through our service.

Our projects will take place both in the building and in the community:

- "Make Campustown Shine" we will be picking up litter in the neighborhood.
- Infant blanket project we will be making fleece blankets that will be given to newborns at Primary Health Care, a clinic in Ames for those with little or no health insurance.
- Making Hygiene Kits for Church World Service we will put together kits that will be distributed around the country and around the world to refugees and victims of natural disasters. These kits are used near and far and are always needed.

We will end the day with a simple meal together at noon. For those on Zoom, we will have a few suggestions of things you can do at home.











Through the month of October, our church will receive the **World Mission Offering**. The WMO supports ministry and mission around the world through our ABC Global Servants and partners in 70 countries.

The Lord says in Isaiah 43:19, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?"

In this rhetorical question, the Lord is not questioning whether or not God is doing a new thing. God is questioning whether we perceive or notice it.

In Ukraine, where there is immense need, IM Global Consultant Kristy Engel has seen new sustainable medical systems created so that care for others continues far into the future. She is seeing hope and rebuilding spring up around her

IM Global Consultant Mike Mann's ministry uses coffee, a common commodity, to help hill tribe communities build a

sustainable life. Although he has been serving in northern Thailand for over 30 years, he is still seeing new ways to improve production. This means a better quality of life for those he works alongside. It also allows him to develop new ministry projects based on needs.


It is easy to perceive that IM Global Servants <u>Eric and Yuree Lembke</u> are involved in a new thing God is doing – they have been serving in western Thailand for less than a year! (Some of our FBC members met Eric and Yuree at the Bacone College Church several years ago while on a mission trip.) Eric and Yuree meet new people every day in their ministry with Karen refugees in camps in Thailand. They are developing new ministry opportunities and classes at the Thoo Mweh Khee Learning Center. The center is helping Karen people create new lives.

God is doing a new thing in the lives of these IM global servants and in the lives of those they serve. Throughout the world, God's work through American Baptist International Ministries is springing up in each unique cross-cultural context.
