Leadership Corner: Stewardship

As you know, Pastor D has emphasized the importance of generosity in our giving. I want to delve deeper into Camphor and our stewardship theme, which centers around the verse "We walk by faith and not by sight" from 2 Corinthians 5:7.

With the love of God and the spirit of our members, I'm confident we can achieve our three main goals:

- Cultivate a spirit of generosity within Camphor, a topic Pastor D has passionately discussed over the past month.
- Enhance our facilities. We have critical improvements to make, including replacing our HVAC system, upgrading the stove and oven in the kitchen, and addressing various minor church repairs.
- Strengthen our community partnerships.

I want to highlight the community partnerships within Camphor:

- The Hallie-Q-Brown Food Ministry, led by Jim Mitchell, has been vital to our outreach efforts. Since 2019, Camphor has donated \$300 and delivered 2,227 pounds of canned goods to the Hallie-Q-Brown food pantry. Despite these efforts, there's still a significant need for food support, so we continue to seek your donations, whether in cash or canned goods.
- The Health Ministry, under May Anderson's leadership, in collaboration with Ramsey County and the Cultural Wellness Center, has been instrumental in providing COVID-19 and flu shots to our community. Since 2022, Camphor has served 998 individuals within our community.
- The Blessing Bag Ministry, led by Mary Louise Archer and her team, has been dedicated to serving the homeless. Since 2023, they have distributed 165 bags to those in need.

The United Women of Faith also supported the Angel Tree and back-to-school supply initiatives. At the same time, the United Methodist Men organized a coat drive and supported Coach McAfee's High School football team. They arranged fishing trips for adults and kids.

As utility costs have risen recently, we rely on your generosity to sustain our service ministries and expand our community engagement. Currently, we're operating within a maintenance budget. Still, we aim to increase our budget over the next three years, with a target of \$100,000. Even a tiny increase in your weekly contribution, such as \$1.25 on a \$25.00 weekly donation, can make a significant difference.

Two significant events are planned this year, two more each in 2025 and 2026. We encourage your participation in these events to help foster a spirit of generosity within Camphor. Some of you may receive a phone call from our stewardship team in the coming weeks regarding our first event, with additional calls planned for late spring or early summer for the second event. We hope everyone will consider participating in one or both events over the next three years.

If you ever have any questions, do not hesitate to reach out to me. Thank you for all that you do to help Camphor!


