



Diamond Humanitarian Award Dr. Daniel Asrat Balcha P. Eng. - Mechanical

Dr. Daniel has lived in Winnipeg, MB since 2002. He is married to his lovely wife Ribka Melesse. His academic and professional career includes obtaining his BSc. In Mechanical Engineering from Addis Ababa University, MSc. and PhD in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Manitoba, Physics and Mathematics from the University of Winnipeg and Thermofluid Engineering from the University of Minnesota. He spent some time working as a faculty member at the Cape Breton Nova Scotia Nautical Institute. In addition, he worked at the Department of Marine Engineering as a research assistant and research associate at the University of Manitoba. Currently, he works

in the Ministry of Growth Entrepreneurship and Trade for the Government of Manitoba.

Dr. Daniel has not only ventured in academic and professional venues, but he has also spent a generous amount of time establishing the necessary steps of bringing Ethiopia to Canada. He firmly believes in his cultural background and proudly reflects this through his work within the community he helped to conceive. He danced for the African Pavilion for Folklarama representing Ethiopian culture. In 2010 the Ethiopian Pavilion was established, where he served as a Coordinator for six consecutive years. He managed to raise enough funds to purchase the Ethiopian Community cultural centre, which eventually helped succeed the community to be mortgage free. It was because of his true leadership that this was made possible. He served as president for the Ethiopian Society of Winnipeg for four terms. He led the Sponsorship Program as chairperson for The Ethiopian Orthodox Church, and with the Ethiopian Society of Winnipeg, they represented 2



organizations at the Welcome Place. From 2007-2013 he also taught computer skills, English language skills, Math and Life skills for war-affected youths from Ethiopia, Eritrea, Sudan, Congo, Somalia, Afghanistan and Burma. His mentorship skills have provided aid to more than 150 youths, who have succeeded their potential as professionals, now working in the Health care, Engineering, Auto body mechanics, carpentry and Social Work field.





His many acts of kindness, humility, generosity and commitment commands the highest regard and respect for Dr. Daniel. He is a true reflection of Ethiopia in Canada. The ECCPA Board of Directors is honored to present the highest award of the year, 2019 Diamond Humanitarian Award to Dr. Daniel Asrat for his endless support, generosity, dedication and commitment, leadership and passion for our community.
