Math Activities

- 1. DIY Grocery Store: Let the kids price items from the pantry, create a shopping list, and "shop." Use play money to teach addition, subtraction, and budgeting.
- 2. Measuring Marathon: Give kids a ruler, measuring tape, or string and have them measure objects around the house. They can compare lengths or estimate before measuring.

- 8. DIY Volcano: Create a volcano with baking soda, vinegar, and a touch of dish soap for an exciting reaction.
- 9. Cloud Watch Journal: Have kids lay on a blanket, identify cloud types, and draw what they see.
- 10. Make a Mini Greenhouse: Use a zip-lock bag, damp paper towel, and seeds to create a greenhouse. Watch the seeds sprout!

Art Activities

- 11. Nature Art: Collect leaves, twigs, or flowers to create art collages.
- 12. Recycled Creations: Turn cardboard boxes, bottle caps, and paper rolls into robots, buildings, or sculptures.
- 13. Sidewalk Chalk Mural: Create a family art piece on the sidewalk or driveway.
- 14. Salt Dough Crafts: Mix flour, salt, and water to make dough. Shape it, bake it, and paint it!

- 23. Virtual Museum Tour: Use free online resources to explore museums like the Smithsonian or British Museum.
- 24. Create a Time Capsule: Fill a box with drawings, letters, and objects from today. "Bury" it to open later.
- 25. Historical Roleplay: Reenact a historical event like the signing of the Declaration of Independence or a medieval feast.

Physical Activities

- 26. Obstacle Course: Create a course in the living room or backyard with pillows, chairs, and hula hoops.
- 27. Dance Party: Pick a playlist and have a family dance-off.
- 28. Balloon Volleyball: Blow up a balloon and use a string as the net for indoor volleyball.
- 29. Yoga Adventure: Guide kids through yoga poses while telling a story.
- 30. Follow the Leader: Add jumps, spins, or silly moves to this classic game.

Cooking Activities
