Steubenville was founded in 1976 at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. As the conference grew, the need for off-campus conferences became apparent. Bishop Sam Jacobs of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux spoke at the confer-

1995 in Alexandria, La., where Jacobs was located. Soon, this new location had also reached its maximum attendance. After Jacobs was named bishop of Houma-

Thibodaux, he suggested bringing the conference to Houma.

According to the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, there are 18 off-campus sites that host a Steubenville youth conference. These conferences annually draw around 40,000 high-school youths.

This year's theme is the Eighth Day, a time that begins the new creation.
