From the Pastor's study

Once more I'm thinking a lot about the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus as Easter approaches. Out of all my meditations during the year this is the most uplifting and I'm particularly happy to have the opportunity to preach about it. It is absolutely central to the Christian faith; while it is true that the sacrifice of God's Son Jesus is the means of salvation, a "Good" Friday without an Easter Day would just leave us without hope. Thank God that Jesus being alive means that we can know that His offering of Himself has been accepted by His Father and so we can be forgiven through faith. It also means that Jesus' claims to be God appearing in flesh have been vindicated. The unique claim of Christianity is that its Founder is alive. In the great Chapter 15 of the first letter to the Corinthians the Apostle Paul, a former sceptic, shows that faith is meaningless if the Resurrection is *false*. Millions believe it is *true*.
