175th Anniversary year fact

Social distancing would have been very difficult if it had been required before the Chapel was built. Around 1838 a few Christians started meeting in a house in Langford and when that became too small they used a shed in Blackmoor, we think it was on the opposite side of the lane and a little further down, where the garage for "Hopedale" now stands. Someone donated a piece of land and in April 1846 the foundation stone was laid. All the work to complete the building was done in time for opening on the 16th September.
