(While keeping "Social Distancing" rules of course.) Our Pastor is in a special position as a minister, being a 'key worker'. We have helped a few people who were unable to get assistance elsewhere and have provided encouragement and been a "Listening ear" to those troubled by the present emergency. Although visiting has to be done at more than "arm's length" we have found some have been pleased to see a visitor and to be able to share their feelings. The relaxation in the rules on 1st June mean that you can now invite us for an outdoor visit (as long as there are no more than six present and the 2-metre rule is kept). The Pastor and several other members have **DBA certificates** so you can feel safe approaching us; please be warned that this is sadly not the case with everyone offering help on an *ad hoc* basis.
