From the Pastor's study

D efore He was put to death the Lord Jesus told His disciples that **D**they would be persecuted in the same way that He had been. That happened and many of them paid with their lives for their faith in Christ. Even though John lived to be an old man he was exiled to Patmos. This month as we recall the Lord's death and resurrection not much has changed - it is still dangerous to be a Christian in many parts of the world. Even in countries where the opposition is not usually so violent some have had their jobs or businesses threatened by those who oppose Christian values. It is quite astonishing that it is often people who talk the most about tolerance who are the first to be very intolerant of anyone who believes the Bible to be true. Our own land seems to have forgotten that many of the respected champions of the poor and disadvantaged were also Christians and under the cry of "Equality" some want to sweep away the faith that motivated those same people. Some churches have replaced the preaching of the gospel with a weak and pasty alternative that seeks to suit the prevailing mood. Such betraval can add to the pain of those who are suffering for Christ's sake. As we pray for them, let us remember that the Bible says those who suffer will also reign with Him (2 Timothy 2:12).

Prayer requests

Praise God for those whose **health** has improved. Pray for **K**., a daughter of one of our worshippers. Remember **R.W.**, an *Aroma* friend, who has been unwell.

Pray that the Easter season will move people to realise the **love of Jesus** in giving Himself to save us from our sins and that many will **put their trust** in Him as risen Lord and Saviour.

Thank God for those who have been **joining us** for worship in the past year and pray that He will raise up those who will serve Him in the continuing work of the Church.
