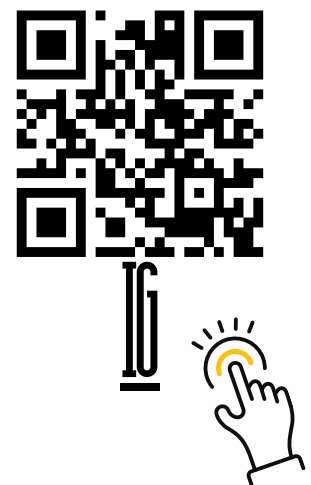
UPROOTED CHESAPEAKE

INTRO

Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) is a Maryland school district serving approximately 38,100 students across 55 schools. With a student-teacher ratio of about 14:1 and more than 5,600 total staff members, HCPS is the eighth-largest district in the state. The district has a strong academic track record, including a 91.6% graduation rate for the Class of 2024—its highest since 2011—and seven Maryland Blue Ribbon Schools. Over 70% of HCPS teachers hold advanced degrees, and the district is also home to 19 certified Green Schools. HCPS is committed to preparing students for college, careers, and lifelong success under the leadership of Superintendent Dr. Sean Bulson.

JUDY CENTER

Provide services to young children and their families to promote school readiness, from birth to age five. Judy Centers are not childcare centers but comprehensive hubs where families can participate in learning experiences and receive services and support in collaboration with community partners. Judy Centers empower a child's first teachers - their families - by supporting child development and early learning skills for our youngest learners.



PARTNERS FOR SUCCESS

Partners for Success (P4S) Centers, established as part of each local school system in Maryland, are available to parents as a resource and information center. Specifically, Partners for Success Centers seek to provide information about community services, assist families in resolving concerns, and increase parental involvement in the special education decision making process.

MAGNET PROGRAMS

Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) Magnet Programs offer specialized high school pathways focused on areas like STEM, agriculture, information technology, education, and more. Open to eligible students across the county, these programs provide hands-on learning, college credit, and career preparation to help students explore their interests and plan for the future.



JROTC - JOPPATOWNE HIGH SCHOOL

The Army JROTC Program emphasizes character education, student achievement, wellness, leadership and diversity. It is a cooperative effort on the part of the military services and host institutions to produce successful students and citizens, while fostering in each school a more constructive and disciplined learning environment. JROTC makes substantial contributions to students, schools and communities which benefit greatly from its presence.



BOUNDARY EXCEPTIONS

The Board of Education policy stipulates that students will attend the schools that serve the area in which they reside with their parent(s) or legal guardian. A boundary exception is special approval for a student to enroll at a school outside of the student's designated attendance area.

CSA (Community Supported Agriculture)

is a model where consumers partner directly with local farmers by purchasing a seasonal share of the farm's harvest. Members pay upfront—usually at the start of the season, and in return, receive regular boxes of fresh, locally grown produce and sometimes other goods like eggs or flowers.

CSA supports small farms financially, promotes sustainable agriculture, and connects communities with the food they eat.

LADEW TOPIARY GARDENS

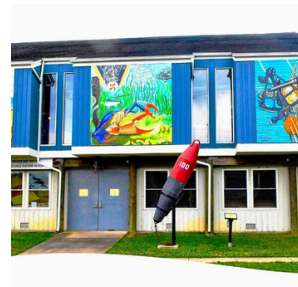
SUSQUEHANNA STATE PARK

Susquehanna State Park is a scenic riverside retreat in Harford County, offering miles of hiking and biking trails, fishing spots, and picnic areas surrounded by woods and water. Known for its natural beauty and historic sites—including the Rock Run Grist Mill and Carter-Archer Mansion—it's a peaceful getaway for outdoor lovers along the banks of the Susquehanna River.



HAVRE DE GRACE MARITIME MUSEUM

The Havre de Grace Maritime Museum explores the maritime history and ecology of the Lower Susquehanna River and Upper Chesapeake Bay. With interactive exhibits, a working boat shop, and environmental education spaces, it offers hands-on learning for all ages. Located along the waterfront, it's a key part of the city's historic Concord Point Heritage Corridor.



HAVRE DE GRACE DECOY MUSEUM

The Havre de Grace Decoy Museum celebrates the region's rich tradition of waterfowl decoy carving, featuring one of the finest collections of working and decorative decoys. Located along the Susquehanna Flats, it highlights local craftsmanship, hunting history, and Havre de Grace's legacy as the "Decoy Capital of the World."

DISCOVERY CENTER AT WATER'S EDGE

The Discovery Center at Water's Edge is an interactive STEM and heritage center in Belcamp, Maryland. It offers hands-on exhibits and programs focused on science, technology, and the environment, inspiring learners of all ages while highlighting Harford County's ties to innovation and nearby Aberdeen Proving Ground.



SUSQUEHANNA LOCK HOUSE MUSEUM

The Susquehanna Museum at the Lock House is a restored 1840s lock keeper's home in Havre de Grace that tells the story of the Susquehanna & Tidewater Canal. Through historic artifacts, exhibits, and a working lock model, it offers a glimpse into 19th-century canal life and commerce along the Chesapeake Bay.



HOSANNA SCHOOL MUSEUM

The Hosanna School Museum, built in 1867 in Harford County, Maryland, was the county's first public school for African Americans and is now a restored cultural center and museum. Originally established with the help of the Freedmen's Bureau, it preserves and shares local African American history through exhibits, events, and educational programs. Today, it serves as a vibrant hub for heritage and community engagement.



STEPPINGSTONE MUSEUM

Steppingstone Farm Museum is a living-history museum in Susquehanna State Park that showcases rural life in Harford County from 1880 to 1920. Set on 23 acres, it features historic buildings, traditional craft demonstrations, and a large collection of antique farm tools and household items. The museum offers seasonal events, self-guided tours, and educational programs.



HARFORD COUNTY'S DOORWAY TO THE CHESAPEAKE BAY

Otter Point Creek Alliance is a nonprofit organization, established in 1996, dedicated to supporting the research, education, and conservation goals of the Otter Point Creek component of the Chesapeake Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve in Maryland. The organization strives to use its resources to promote environmental awareness, sustainability, and a deeper understanding and appreciation of the local estuarine environment at Otter Point Creek.

EDEN MILL NATURE CENTER

Eden Mill in Harford County is a nature center and historic grist mill located on 118 acres along Deer Creek in Pylesville, Maryland. It features hiking trails, a restored 1800s mill museum, wildlife habitats, and educational programs. The site offers nature exploration, kayaking, and hands-on learning for visitors of all ages.



HARFORD GLEN FOUNDATION

Harford Glen Foundation supports environmental education at the 320-acre Harford Glen Center in Bel Air, Maryland. The center provides hands-on outdoor learning experiences for students and the public, including nature trails, wildlife programs, and sustainability activities. Its mission is to promote environmental stewardship and a deeper connection to nature.



SUSQUEHANNOCK WILDLIFE SOCIETY

The Susquehannock Wildlife Society is a nonprofit based in Harford County that focuses on conserving native wildlife and habitats in the lower Susquehanna River region. It offers education programs, research initiatives, and a developing wildlife center with trails, exhibits, and animal care facilities. The organization promotes community engagement and environmental stewardship through hands-on conservation work.



UNIVERSITY OF MD EXTENSION

University of Maryland Extension is a statewide, non-formal education system that provides resources and problem-solving assistance to citizens. The Harford County Extension office is located in the Harford County Agricultural Center, 3525 Conowingo Rd., Street, Maryland.

At Mosaic, our mission is clear across all our divisions: fostering diversity, inclusion, and belonging in everything we do. Whether you're enjoying a cup of coffee, engaging in sports, or connecting at our community center, Mosaic has something for everyone.



The MyArmyPost app recently went live for the Aberdeen Proving Ground community, allowing users to check gate information, organize appointments on base, and stay updated with operating hours at APG establishments. MAPA is a new lifestyle application built by the Army Software Factory, a subordinate command of Army Futures Command, with support from U.S. Army Installation Management Command.

MAPA is available on the Google and Apple app stores and offers real-time installation information to soldiers, families, civilians, contractors, and retirees. In addition to including post-wide information like events and air quality, users can log appointment times and personal items, creating a tailored experience for users. The launch of MAPA at APG is significant for a few reasons. Aside from a helpful tool for the community, the app has significant support from the Communications-Electronics Command Software Engineering Center. CECOM SEC took technical lead in transitioning the app onto mobile app stores and will continue to provide technical support. MAPA was CECOM SEC's debut into mobile app support, and as an Army-wide app, CECOM SEC will have a far-reaching impact as the app grows and is launched on other installations.

For UProoted Chesapeake, when we say military-connected children, we're talking about all the kids whose lives are shaped by military service, whether their parent or caregiver is active duty, in the Reserves or National Guard, a veteran or retiree, or has made the ultimate sacrifice as a Gold Star family. Harford County Public Schools Debuts New Military Family Welcome Center On Its Website

Webpage goes live in time for Veterans Day 2022

Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) is home to approximately 3,000 military-connected children and their families, with most parents/guardians serving at U.S. Army Aberdeen Proving Ground (APG). HCPS understands the challenges military-connected families may experience with frequent transitioning from one installation to the next and often relocating during the middle of an academic year.

Members of the HCPS Customer Service Task Force identified an opportunity to better serve our military families by developing a Military Family Welcome Center on the school system's website for families to access information they need to get started with HCPS and other community resources to help them acclimate to the area. The HCPS Parent Academy made it a priority to see this project come to fruition in time for Veterans Day 2022, working closely with representatives from APG. The new page went live on the school system's website this week.

The Military Family Welcome Center is easily accessible from the homepage of www.hcps.org, linked under the 'Parents' tab. In addition to featuring links to HCPS registration, school, academic, and athletic information, the page includes military and veteran resources. Military families are also encouraged to email AskHCPS@hcps.org if they need additional information and support.

In honor of Veterans Day, HCPS is celebrating the launch of the page on its social media platforms and asking our community to help us spread the word to families who may benefit from checking out the new page.

WHAT IS THE COMPACT?

Developed in 2006, the Military Interstate Children's Compact was adopted by all 50 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity. The Compact eases the educational challenges that military children encounter, and supports uniform treatment as they transfer between school districts in member states. Note: The Compact only applies to public schools.

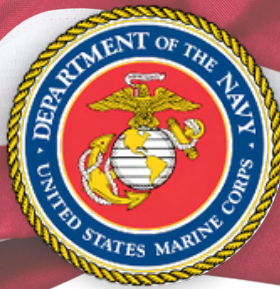

Resources for Military Families

MILITARY & FAMILY LIFE COUNSELOR

Military & Family Life Counselors (MFLCs) provide confidential, short-term counseling to help military families navigate common challenges like deployment, relocation, stress, parenting, and family dynamics. They support both adults and children, often working in schools or on base to offer accessible, stigma-free help. No medical records are kept, ensuring privacy while promoting emotional well-being and resilience across the military community.



FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM



The Family Advocacy Program (FAP) supports military families by promoting healthy relationships and preventing abuse. It provides education, counseling, and intervention services related to domestic violence, child abuse, and neglect. FAP offers parenting classes, support groups, safety planning, and crisis intervention to help families build strong, safe, and resilient homes. When necessary, they coordinate with command and civilian agencies to ensure protection and support for those affected.



SURVIVOR OUTREACH SERVICES

Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) provides long-term support to surviving Families of fallen Soldiers. Our goal is to reassure survivors that they remain valued members of the Army Family.





Resources for Military Families

The **"You Made the Grade"** program is designed to reward traditional, non-traditional, and homeschooled students, 1st-12th grade, for above-average academic achievement and to inspire them to work that much harder.

Qualifying students can receive a **You Made the Grade** Rewards gift card by presenting a valid military ID card and proof of an overall "B" average or higher equivalent average to their local Exchange. Straight "A" students will get a \$20 Rewards gift card and overall "B" average students will get a \$10 Rewards gift card, along with a coupon sheet to take advantage of their Exchange's amazing retail, services, and food offers.

For children who receive non-traditional A, B, C grades, the parent/guardian should provide, from the school, the equivalent of what a "B or higher" is for the grading system of their child's school or written affirmation of their scholastic accomplishments from their child's teacher or school administrator.

If a child is homeschooled, the student should provide written affirmation of their scholastic achievements from a parent or other community-authorized education provider.

Nael Shakur is 13 years old and lives in Harford County. He enjoys playing video games, shooting hoops, helping others, and especially hanging out with his friends. For the first eight years of his life, Nael and his family lived on Aberdeen Proving Ground. His dad is an Air Force Veteran and now works on APG.



When Nael was 11, he became a board member for an all-youth organization called *We Cancerve*. The group runs lots of initiatives to help kids in tough situations that aren't their fault, like children experiencing homelessness, kids in safe houses, or those who are hospitalized. Nael is the project lead for *Snack Attack*, a program that started when founder Grace Calwood learned that some children only eat when they have access to free breakfast and lunch at school, and that kids in some homeless shelters rarely get snacks in the summer or after school. Now, *Snack Attack* serves hundreds of kids each year with healthy and tasty snacks that help bridge the gap between meals so kids can stay focused and be at their best. Recently, Nael and the team even packed special snack bags for a children's home in Kenya.

Nael believes that young people can make a massive impact in their community, sometimes just by noticing a problem and working to fix it, or by pitching in when someone else has already started a solution. He hopes to encourage other kids to get involved, because no one knows better what kids want and need than other kids.

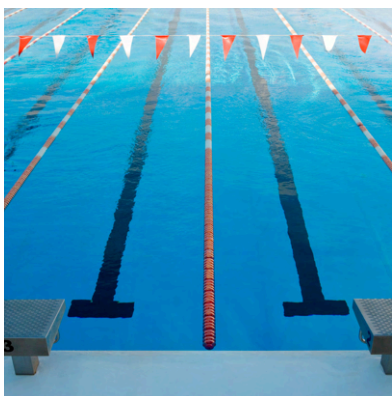

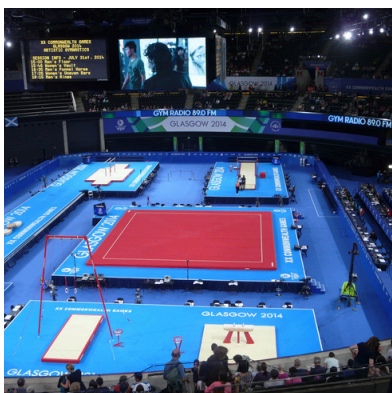

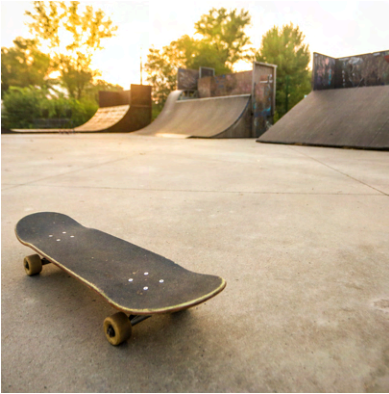
